Preface 2024

This book is the story about names that have echoed around my extended family for as long as I can remember. The Pringles, I knew a few of them, met them at funerals usually. My mum's Uncle Tom died in an accident in Brisbane in 1960 and we were at Tullymorgan. He was a Pringle. I remember that.

Annie Pringle, the photo on the cover, was my grandmother and in 2022/23 I completed The Bradfield Book. Annie's husband was Pat Bradfield. It got me thinking about her and who and what were those names that echoed around.

There were Pringle, Ensby, Sutherland, Clark, Cavanough and the coolest of them all was Moses Essex. (I was sure I remembered Moses with a long white beard, but both he and his son of the same name had died before I was born)!

The Ensby name was always a bit of a mystery sometimes spelt Ensbey and even stranger some of the Ensbys spelt their name Clark or Clarke.

So this book is an attempt by me to sort out who is who. The photo opposite is my great grandmother Harriet Ensby. Harriet married Robert Arthur Pringle and that is the link between these families, it's one of them, in fact it's these links that make the book confusing and the families interesting. Harriet and Robert will be a reference point that I use to explain who is who and where they fit into the family.

Harriet was born in 1871 in Grafton NSW she married Robert Pringle in 1892. She had 13 siblings and 8 children. She seems to have died in 1943 in Kyogle and although I would swear to having seen her grave in the 1970's. I can find no trace of a record or grave site since.



The Ensby line has been done in detail in a book THE ENSBEY STORY by Garry Ensbey and Carole Hall. They produced the book for an Ensbey Reunion in Lawrence in 2014.

Here comes the twist my line of the family and all of Harriet's 13 siblings are **NOT** Ensbys. Their father, Charles, was bought up by William Ensbey but he was NOT his son. Charles mother was Ruth Clarke and his father unknown – now the Clarke/Ensby thing is already starting to make sense.

The descendants of Charles used a variety of surnames one of them being Ensby/Ensbey so we are involved in the Ensby name. It is a part of who we are but we are not Ensbys in a DNA sense. Well unless we married into the real Ensbey line, that is Charles half brothers, who also lived around Lawrence and Maclean in NSW.

I lean heavily on and downright copy directly from Garry Ensbey's book THE ENSBEY STORY-Moving on to Greener Pastures and acknowledge his work when I use it.

Thanks to those who helped with research and provided names, dates, photos and clues. The main ones include, Deslea Grice, Warren & Elaine Sutherland, (both are my mum's cousins), Sue Howkins and my cousin Dianne Sullivan whose local knowledge around Tullymorgan directed me to other family members further down the line and that included a family historian Ian Dobbin. Ian and his mother Edith in her 92nd year in 2024 provided: photos, confirmation of facts and corrections and lunch and cups of tea and homemade biscuits and cakes.

Others in the family keep me going with their questions, interest and enthusiasm. They include my brother Bruce Maloney, cousins Bruce Lyons, Stephen, Neville and Beverley Want and a dozen others that I threw questions at so that some of this work makes a more sense that it would have otherwise.

Family history becomes a blurred mess of names in both directions. The direct ancestors double every generation, 32 grand mothers and fathers in just 5 generations. If you add uncles and aunts you have hundreds. Just a few generations of descendants can lead to lists and lists of names. To make sense of it you have to be selective and follow just a few of the many family lines that grow with each generation. So this is a selective history. There are lists because they provide future family researchers with keys to unlock and figure out who is who. The where do I fit into this? And the how am I related to?

For the most part I have tried to figure out who Annie Pringle, my grandmother who died 3 years before I was born, was and why was she living in Tullymorgan.

Locate the **Family Chart** in the Table of Contents, this chart attempts to make some sense of the links between the families in this book.

One question for European Australians is who first came to Australia? Why and when? Where did they come from?

If you go back 4 or 5 generations then 16 to 32 grandparents came to Australia from somewhere else and therein lies a story.......

Who's Who

Charles Clarke-Ensbey – born 1893 in Croydon England He died in 1906 in Lawrence NSW. He married Harriett Garrett the parents of *Harriet Ensby* and her 13 siblings.

Ruth Clarke – 1822-1902 mother of Charles (above). She married *William Ensbey* and moved to Australia in 1855 with her husband and 3 children; Charles and 2 other boys who were the sons of William Ensbey. (Charles was born to an unknown father before Ruth married William).

Harriet Ensby & Robert Arthur Pringle

This couple is a reference point I base the family history on, so locate your relationship to them to better understand the family structure (They are my great grandparents. Neville Maloney)

- Harriett Ensby 1871-1943 the daughter of Charles (above) and one of 14 children. Harriet married Robert Arthur Pringle (In baptism of her children records Harriet uses the surname Clarke) (And her first name I have usually spelt Harriet her birth records spell it Harriet but she seems to have used Harriet)
- Robert Arthur Pringle 1867-1948 the husband of Harriet (above) the one who introduces the Pringle line into the family tree. Robert has 8 brothers and sisters and their descendants form part of the family story.

Annie Ernestine Pringle – 1893-1950 the daughter of Harriet Ensby and Robert Pringle (above). Annie has 7 brothers and sisters they and their children are the Pringle family that looms large in this book. (My Mum's aunties and uncles).

The Cavanough Family, the Sutherland Family, the Essex Family and the Dobbin Family are related more than once to the Ensby/Pringle clan.

Clarke & Ensbey & Clark & Ensby. What's in a Name?

Bob Pringle son of Robert Arthur Pringle married...... well the confusion sets in. This is an example of the chaos of the Ensbey, Ensby, Clarke, Clark surname merry-go-round. In the Ensbey family records: Harriet Elizabeth (Liz) Hannah is the daughter of John Hannah and Sarah Ensby (I have changed Sarah's surname to Clarke Ensbey to make it clearer who she is). Sarah is the sister of Harriet Ensby who is Bob Pringle's mother. That is Bob and Harriet are first cousins. However all the Pringle records and photos list Bob's wife as Eily Clark. So who is Eily Clark? Well she is Harriet Elizabeth (Liz) Hannah. It seems that at some point the Elisabeth became Eileen and the (liz) became (Eily) and she started using the Clarke surname. Why would she do that? Well some of her siblings were christened with the surname Ensbey-Clarke and her father used the surnames Clarke and Ensbey and that family interchanges them throughout their lives. The proof of who Eily is comes from the obituary of her brother Tichbourne Thomas Hannah, who uses the name Thomas, where his sister is listed as Mrs R Pringle.

I have changed some names of people to make them consistent so Bob's wife is Harriet Eileen (Eily) Hannah even though still in some photos she is named Eily Clarke.

More details about the Clarke/Ensbey name confusion in the story of Charles Clarke-Ensbey later in this book.


The Location

Most of this story takes place in Northern NSW. Tullymorgan and Lawrence is the home region of the main families. Some move to Qld, some Pringles even move to Far North Qld but the families in the late 1800 and early 1900's live near the Clarence River

The names regularly mentioned are: Tullymorgan, Lawrence, Murrayville, Southgate, Maclean and Grafton

Most of the story of my direct Pringle and Ensby/Clark ancestors takes place, on the map below, in the area above Lawrence and Maclean. Just above Banyabba at 29°22'19.0"S 152°59'37.9"E is where James Pringle owned The Travellers Rest Hotel. Murrayville no longer exists as a village.

I have marked the location of the farm owned by Patrick Bradfield and Annie Pringle (the farmhouse has gone and little remains to indicate what was the centre of my grandparents world. Just to the north of their farm at the top of the map is where Robert Arthur Pringle and Harriet Ensby had their farm. Most of that farm is still in the "family" known to many as "Snowy's" place



Robert Arthur Pringle 1867-1948 and Harriet (Mini) Ensby 1871-1943

In this history two characters are **Robert Arthur Pringle 1867-1948** and his wife **Harriet** (**Mini**) **Ensby 1871-1943** are the divide between separate families and the Pringles and Ensby/Clarks who forged a new life in Australia and the aunts, uncles, first and second cousins who make up names I recognise from my childhood. Robert and Harriet are my great grandparents. (*Neville Maloney*)

For those in the family, like me, born in the late 1940's to the 1960's they will probably be your great grandparents or great aunt or uncle.

We trace the Pringles back from Robert and the Ensby/Clarke line back from Harriet.

The descendants I concentrate on Robert's 9 and Harriet's 14 siblings and in particular their 8 children.

Robert and Harriet's daughter, Annie Ernestine



Pringle, is my grandmother. Her photo is on the cover of this book because she is the inspiration for me to know something of who she was and who the Pringles and Ensbys were. (NM 2024)

Robert and Harriet were both born in Lawrence and then lived at Murrayville – a village that no longer exists – near Ashby on the opposite side of the river from Maclean. Robert worked at Murrays Sawmill.

Around 1905, just before the Murray sawmill closed, Robert bought land at Tullymorgan and became a successful and innovative farmer.

They sold the farm in 1934, when Robert was 67 and Harriet 63 they moved to Bald Hills in Brisbane (some of their children had already moved to Qld and others came later) Robert bought a dairy farm, that was not so successful, and their son Tom had a milk run business.

Harriet died on a visit to her daughter in Kyogle in 1943 and Robert returned to Tullymorgan and lived with his daughter, Annie and her husband Pat Bradfield for sometime before he died in 1948.

A Summary

My ancestors on the Pringle and Ensby (Clark) branches of the family tree.

The relationships I mention will apply to my 1st cousins for grandparents and older ancestors.

James Pringle my Great Great Great Grandfather, that's 6 generations of the family, was born in 1810 in Newcastle England. He was the first of the Pringle/Ensby line to migrate to Australia in 1843.

James older brother, **Nicholas**, also came to Australia, via New Zealand, in **1857** and that is an interesting story because his children all moved to Qld mostly to Mossman and later generations to Africa.

James Pringle has 3 children: Thomas, Jane Isabella who marries *Moses Essex* and Susannah Goulden, who marries *James Bathgate*. (The Essex family marry into the Ensby in the next generation).

Thomas Pringle, my <u>Great Great Grandfather</u>, marries **Elizabeth Lister**, the daughter of his uncles Nicholas's wife from her first marriage. *Nicholas is Thomas's uncle and his wife's step father. Elizabeth came to Australia with her mother Mary Tyson and her step father in 1857.*

Thomas and Elizabeth have 9 children; the 5th child is Robert Arthur Pringle 1867-1948. Robert marries Harriet (Minnie) Ensby. This couple are my Great Grandparents. This is not the only Pringle and Ensby families link and in this generation Harriet Ensby's siblings marry into the Essex family (the Pringles have already done that) the Cavanough family and siblings of both Harriet and Robert marry into the Dobbin family. The Dobbin family is already related to the Pringle and Sutherland families.

Harriet (Minnie) Ensby is one of 14 children and her parents are;

Charles Clarke-Ensbey and Harriett Garrett my Great Great Grandparents. Harriett immigrated to Australia in 1855 and we know a little about her, she worked as a glover, making gloves, and she came from Chillington, Somerset, England. (*That line of the family is ripe for research*). Charles who I have called Clarke-Ensbey is an enigmatic fellow, we have no photo of him but we have of his parents, we know where his parents are buried but not him. And his name we have 5 or 6 variations. The Clark/Clarke/Ensbey/Ensby name shifting is a story told later in the books details.

Charles Clarke-Ensbey is the son of Ruth Clark but not William Ensbey. Ruth married William some years after Charles was born and we know all about them because of an amazing document the **Speculum Gregis 1843.**

Ruth Clark is my <u>Great Great Grandmother</u> and via her ancestors we can trace the Clarks to Henry Clark in 1596. Ruth was born in 1822 and came to Australia in 1855 and died in 1902. Ruth's granddaughter is **Harriet (Minnie) Ensby**

Robert Arthur Pringle and Harriet (Minnie) Ensby have 8 children the 1st Annie Ernestine Pringle 1893-1950 is my <u>Grandmother</u> she marries Patrick Bradfield 1970-1960.

They live at *Tullymorgan*. *Tullymorgan*, *Maclean* and *Lawrence* are the setting for much of this story. Annie already has a daughter, Gladys, who is 10 years old when she marries Pat Bradfield in 1919. Annie and Pat have 9 children, my aunties and uncles; their story is told in another book, The Bradfield Book, I wrote in 2023.

Annie Pringle and Patrick Bradfield's eldest child is Ivy Morrelle Bradfield 1920-2004, my mother. Ivy married John (Jack) Martin Maloney in 1942 Ivy and Jack had 3 boys: Bruce, John and me (Neville).

The Ensby Family

The Ensby/Ensbey/Endersby Name

Let's sort the name. Charles's step-father's name was William **Endersby** 1819-1897 and he changed it to **Ensbey** when he arrived in Australia. The descendants of William that is the families of his and Ruth's 2 sons seem to have been consistent in the spelling of Ensbey.

Now the problem is that Charles father is **NOT** his father. That is William Ensbey (as he spelt Ensbey when arrived in Australia) was his step father. Charles was born in 1839 and his mother, Ruth, did not marry William until Nov 1840. Ruth's mother looked after Charles.

Charles was 15 when they immigrated to Australia in 1855 and his name is listed as Charles Clerk. That seems just poor entry spelling. (His father whoever he was is unknown to us).

A story says in 1858/59 Charles requested to use the Ensbey surname but the family said no.

This was around the time when he was getting married. Confusingly on his marriage certificate his surname is spelt **Ainsly**. But that seems to be an admin issue, his father's name on the same certificate is spelt the same and his wife's surname Garrett is spelt Garot. It seems the official who filled in the certificate had issues interpreting the spoken name to the written name.

The spelling remains inconsistent is first child was named Elizabeth Ann Ruth **Ensby.** The next 3 of the children the surname was **Ensbey** but the 5th was **Ensbey-Clarke** and after that is tended to be **Ensby.** (There are rumours in the family about arguments Charles had with his step father, William, about the use of the Ensbey name and that may have lead a number of his Charles's children taking up the surname Clarke. What we do know is that the spelling of Ensbey & Ensby seems fairly random for family members and they seem to easily use Clarke as an option as well. NM 2024).

I have given their 14 children the surnames that seem to be their registered birth names that range from Ensby to Ensbey-Clarke & Clark. BUT many used variations throughout their lives.

William Ensbey and Ruth Clarke had 4 boys in England before they immigrated to Australia in 1855. John 1842, Alfred 1845 and twins George & William 1847 the twins seem to have died at birth.

Benjamin Ensby (son of Charles & Harriett) had his surname and the surname of ALL his children changed legally to **CLARKE** after the death of his first wife, Agnes in **1892**.

The descendants of Charles's half brothers John and Alfred spelt their surname ENSBEY.

The Ensby story is really the Clarke story. Ruth Clarke married William Ensbey but Charles was NOT his son.

The more you look the more confusing it gets. It seems to me that for whatever reason after Charles died in 1906 some of his children started using the Clark/Clarke surname maybe because of conflict with his half brother's families over use if the Ensby/Ensbey name? And again around 1914/16 coincidently when his half brothers, John & Alfred, died there is the use of Clark/Clarke again. A grandson, Albert, changes his name officially by deed from Ensbey to Clark in 1931. Some members of the family using Clark as their surname are surprised to find their name is officially Ensby/Ensbey. Quite a few are born Ensby/Ensbey and are married or their death is registered as Clark/Clarke.

Harriet Ensby (my great grandmother) is named Ensby on her birth record and marries as Ensby but on the christening record of 4 of her children in 1905 she puts her surname as Clark.

The wife of Bob Pringle, Harriet Eileen Hannah reverts back 3 generations to her great grandmother Ruth Clarke and uses the name Eileen Clark! She is an excellent example of this name changing confusion.

Details about the families and descendants of the extensive extended Ensby family are in **Research Note 1-The Descendants of Charles CLARKE-ENSBEY & Harriett GARRETT**. In those appendix notes I have highlighted text in **red** that shows this name shifting. NM 2024

Ruth Clarke 1822-1902

The following information is edited from *The Ensbey Story by Garry Ensbey*.

I have edited the original to reflect that this history has **Ruth Clarke** as the central character. Our line of the family traces the Clarke family ancestors, remember William Ensbey/Endersby was **not** Charles's father and it Ruth's son Charles who is the ancestor of the Ensby, Ensbey and Clark families in this history. (NM 2024)

Ruth Clarke was married to William Endersby on 15 November 1840 by Rev. Mr Dealby, incumbent of the parish of Croydon in the county of Cambridgeshire at Croydon Church, Cambridgeshire. The entry of marriage in the register reflects two things. The first is that it was neither uncommon or a matter of shame that one could not write (and presumably could not read either). Both the parties to the marriage, William and Ruth, made their marks, as did the witnesses.

Ruth's parents, Richard Clarke and Mary Dash, had ten children with Ruth being the third eldest.

John was the eldest child born on 24 January 1819 in Ickleton, Cambridgeshire and her sister, Amelia who was born on 16 October 1821.

Ruth in 1822, is followed by twins:

Hannah and **Joseph**. Hannah was christened on 26 September and Joseph 27 November 1825.

Ann born on 6 December 1829.

David was born on 7 November 1830 in Croydon.

George Beckett was born on 1 October 1832 and christened on 17 February 1833.

Charles born on 23 November 1834. **Sarah** born in 1838 also at Ickleton, Cambridgeshire, England.

William and Ruth's fathers are listed as labourers on their wedding record,

By tradition in these rural areas of Britain, sons, though married, would remain on the family property while the father remained

alive, he was the farmer, and the sons were labourers.

The other important thing to note is the way the family pronounced their name, the cleric Mr Dealby, spelt it Ensbury. This may have influenced William to change the name to ENSBEY during the early years in NSW. (Gary Ensbey says William changed the name but I suspect it just changed by change as clerics wrote the name in documents when they arrived in Australia NM)

Ruth was born on 2 February 1822 at Croydon cum Clapton, Cambridgeshire, England.

It is noted that Ruth had a base-born child (Charles Clarke) by some other man before her marriage, who lived with her mother, Mary Clarke, but it caused disquietude at times between Ruth and her husband William. Ruth appears to have been a very clean person. William was often out of work and was of a surly dogged temper.

Croydon is a village and civil parish in South Cambridgeshire, England. It is 10 miles (16 km) south-west of Cambridge and immediately west of the A1198 road (the Roman Ermine Street). The population in 2001 was 221 people. The site of the deserted medieval village of Clopton is Croydon Parish, which was formerly known as Croydon-cum-Clopton.

Records written in the 1851 Cambridgeshire Census show that in William and Ruth's place of residence, there were William (aged 29 and listed as an agricultural labourer) and Ruth (aged 30), their eldest son, John Thomas (aged 9) and youngest son Alfred (aged 7). At their home at that time was John (William's father) aged 68 years and a pauper receiving parish relief, Richard (31), an unmarried brother and an agricultural labourer, David (26) also an unmarried brother and an agricultural labourer and John Clarke (12 years) a visitor and agricultural labourer. This visitor is believed to be John Charles Clarke, Ruth's illegitimate child before marriage to William.

It should be noted that William and Ruth had twins, **George** and **William** in 1847, who died in infancy.

The 1851 Census also showed the number of people living in Richard and Mary Clarke's residence at that time. Richard (aged 54) and Mary (aged 56) were Ruth's parents. In the household was also Hannah Clark (aged 26 and listed as a servant), David Clark (20 years), Sarah Clark (12), John Clark (12 – this possibly could be John Charles Clarke visiting), and Mary (a granddaughter aged 2).

Rev. Francis Fulford (1806 – 1868) Rector at Croydon-cum-Clopton 1841 – 1845) wrote in the *Speculum Gregis*:


An account of all inhabitants of the Parish of Croydon in the County of Cambridgeshire commencing from 1 January, 1843 – Clarke, wife and large family: - A rough lot, never come to church or send their children to school. (Richard (Born c. 1797 or 1806) and Mary Clarke (Born c. 1795 or 1801). First estimated year of birth as 1841 census, second as 1851. Known children (list possibly incomplete): Hannah (c. 1826), John (c. 1828), David (c. 1831), Charles (c. 1835), Sarah (c. 1838), John (c. 1840) is possibly a grandchild. Spelling of family surname appears to shorten to CLARK during this generation.

After the death of his father, John, in 1851, **William and Ruth Endersby** became restless and disenchanted with their lifestyle in Croydon so with the support of public funds they decided to venture to Australia. With them came **Charles Clerk** aged 15 years, a farm labourer who like his mother, Ruth, could not write; **John Endersby** aged 12 years and **Alfred Endersby** aged 10 years both of whom could read.


Records from British Parliamentary Papers 1856 XXIV [2080], 393 Appendix 9, NSW sheets show that an emigrant ship *Blenheim* was despatched by public funds to NSW on 31 March 1855 and arrived on 5 July 1855. Records show **that William paid two pound sterling** into the Assisted Emigrant Account for the passage.

Blenheim was an 808 tonne sailing vessel which took 96 days for the journey. The number of emigrants on board was 124 male and 95 female adults, with 52 male and 34 female children under the age of 14 for a total number of 305. Unfortunately 2 male children died on the journey. The name of the master of *Blenheim* was Captain Molison and the surgeon superintendent was Fred E West. The rigging for *Blenheim* was sheathed in felt and yellow metal. The tonnage was 689 under the old measurement and 808 tons under the new scale. The sailing ship was

constructed in 1848 in South Shields and the owner was D Dunbar and the ship was registered in the Port of London.

Ruth Clarke and most of her ancestors came from Cambridgeshire, UK. Ruth came from *Croydon*. Others came from; Sandy, Biggleswade, Guilden Morden, Steeple Morden, Potton and a number of other places in the region.

Speculum Gregis 1843 - An amazing document

The Speculum Gregis 1843 - The Diary of Rev Fulford

'An Account of all the Inhabitants of the Parish of Croydon in the County of Cambridgeshire commencing from 1 January 1843' by Reverend Francis Fulford 1803-1868 (Rector at Croydon 1841-1845). Additional notes by Reverend R S B Sandilands (Rector 1845-1864).

What is it? The parish Rector, the Church of England minister in charge of the parish of "Croydon-cum-Clopton" in Cambridgeshire kept a notebook his Speculum Gregis. This in Latin is "Mirror to the Flock. The Reverend Francis Fulford wrote a sort of informal census with a brief description of the residents of Croydon in 1843.

It is a wonderful document reflecting the time and gives us, the descendants of those lived in Croydon, a glimpse of what our ancestors were like. Ruth Clarke's mother, Mary Dash is my (and my Bradfield cousins) 4th great grandmother she was born in 1795 and lives in a manor cottage, here is what is written about her and her family: (Page 81)

A rough lot, never come to Church or send their children to School.

They lived in a cottage on the manor farm. The reverend does not seem to know their first names.

About the manor farm residents he writes:

Mr Gape's Farm on the Hill

John and Anne Pearman. He farms the estate for his father, who lives at Abington. His brother Abraham lives there generally and is a wild youth

And of the neighbours in another manor cottage William and Mary Blowes:

They can read a little. He works for Mr George and attends Church vary rarely; she never, I believe, goes anywhere.

What does the reverend have to say about **Ruth Clarke**?

William and Ruth Endersby

He can read and is the son of John and Mary Endersby.

She can't read, and is daughter of Mary Clarke

She had a base-born child by some other man before her marriage, which lives with her mother, but it is cause of disquietude now at times between her and her husband. She appears a very clean person. He is often out of work, and is of a surly dogged temper.

1. John, aged 6 months.

They were married and their child Christened in Croydon Church.

From this document we know there next door neighbours Chris & Ruth Lyon and John & Edith Hopkins.

Ruth Clarke - Oldest Family Ancestors

It is via **Ruth** Clarke that those in the Ensby/Pringle family in this book can trace back their oldest ancestors. Via the Clarke family we get back with reliable names and dates to **Henry** Clark born in 1596 he married to Elizabeth Allen in 1615 and his parents William and Agnes Clark are my 11th great grandparents.

That is *13 generations* taking us back to the mid 1500's to the reign of Queen Elizabeth 1, William Shakespeare and the English victory over the Spanish Armada!

Other family names in the 1500s include: Izzard, Fairchild, Holton, Reynolds, Woodward, Saby, Covington and Edlim.

The list on the following pages details that linage of the family using **Ruth Clarke** as the starting point. Ruth, remember, is the grandmother of **Harriet (Minnie) Ensby** who married **Robert Arthur Pringle**.

Ruth Clarke and William Ensbey

Early Pioneers in Lower Southgate and Lawrence

In July 1855 WILLIAM & RUTH with their 2 sons John, and Alfred as well as Ruth's son **Charles Clarke** arrive in NSW as free settlers they proceeded north in bullock drays to the Hunter Valley where they spent a few years and then in 1859 hearing good reports of the Clarence district so they continued further north.

In 1859 William acquired some property near Lawrence.


Lawrence is at the junction of Sportsmans Creek and the Clarence River, the product of the Timbarra gold rush with impatient diggers for the Rocky River refusing to travel the extra distance to Grafton. The village was established by WSB Greaves in 1856. The little township grew with elementary facilities of hostelry, stores, blacksmith's shop and the wharf. At this time Lawrence rivalled Grafton (34 kilometres away) as the largest town and port on the Clarence River. Wool was the major object of trade during this time as well as local timbers with many Richmond River settlers loading their bullock drays here and despatching their wool and other produce to Sydney. Land was being quickly taken up on the reaches of Lower Lawrence and along the edge of the Broadwater.

The Ensbey family commenced life on the Clarence by selecting first, one, and then a second 40 acre block. The Baptist Historical Society records of 1855, which are supported Rev. Frank Croan's book *Big River – Big Hearts* (p.23) shows that William had purchased land on the Lower Clarence – 5 lots in Southgate – Lots 107/8 – 87 acres, Lot 138 – 40 acres, Lot 111 – 25 acres and Lot 147 – 73 acres 3 roods and two blocks fronting Sportsmans Creek comprising 11 acres. Furthermore, he is shown as the owner of Lot 19, Parish of Maclean, a holding of 43 acres.

In 1859 **Charles Clarke** wanted his name changed to Ensbey but the family wasn't happy about this idea and William was not prepared to adopt Charles so he took it upon himself to call himself **Charles Clarke-Ensbey** and his 14 children ultimately used a range of variations from Clarke to Ensby.

Ruth and William had two sons, **John Thomas**, who married *Hannah Cox* on 4 October 1865 and **Alfred**, was married on 28 December 1864 in Ulmarra to *Margaret Drummond Henderson* who was born on 24 September 1845 at Silverdale Flat, Casino.

In 1876 William commenced large scale drainage on his farm and his efforts involved 15 chains of drainage. In this year there was a bad flood in July – "the wind blew from east-south-east." Spray from the river broke over the houses on the riverbank and the verandah of Nightingale's store was blown

away. The water roared into the swamp and there was not a spot of dry land at the lower end of the town. Floodwaters entered Davidson's top store and losses there exceeded 600 pounds. Records of stock losses show that William lost 35 cattle.

William continued to purchase land to ensure that his family prospered and to maintain his ever increasing prosperity and reputation in the local community:


William was an original member of the District Improvement Board which inspected and reported on local infrastructure which required maintenance and repair. His eldest grandson **William Ernest Ensbey** (Jnr) followed in his grandfather's footsteps, being the secretary of the group in the late 1880's and early 1890's.

William and Ruth had a trip back to England in 1877 for Queen Victoria's Jubilee. The hat box and hat he wore to the ceremony is now kept in Schaeffer House Museum in Grafton. (Additional note: the hat and box were destroyed by silverfish at the Museum c2020)

William was a strict Independent Baptist he offered the use of his large barn for services if a minister could be obtained to lead them. He later donated land on his farm about a mile from Sportsmans Creek for a small church that cost £114.

The Clarence and Richmond Examiner on Tuesday 24 March 1891 (p.2) reported a narrow escape for William and Ruth Ensbey:

e / Clarence and Richmond Examiner (Grafton, NSW: 1889 - 1915) / Ti William Ensbey died on 16 September

Lawrence.

Narrow Escape.-Last week while Mr. and Mrs. W. Ensbey, sen., were quietly driving through the town, the mail coach came dashing towards them at its usual rapid rate, which scared their horse, a very quiet animal, which shiel off the metal, and crossed the drain at the side of the raised portion of the road. The wheel coming in contact with the bank or side of the drain, was too much for the harness, which gave way, and freed the horse. The buggy was only slightly damaged, and as it was not overturned the occupants escaped with a considerable freight. But the question arises, is it necessary for the mail to be driven through the town as though afraid of being over-taken by "Cutty Sark's" pursuers? or cannot something be done in the way of widening the macadamised portion of this road, which is barely wide enough for two vehicles to cross each other without one or both almost tilting into a drain? The danger would be lessened at least if the sides of the drain were sloped from the road. If something of this kind is not done, a more serious accident still is sure, sooner or later, to take place. The last accident took place in the daylight; the danger is increased at night. The D. I.B. would increase its popularity if it succeeds in an effort to get this portion of the road made safe. I do not think any steps have yet been taken in this direction.

William Ensbey died on 16 September 1897 at the age of 75 years and was buried at the Wesleyan Cemetery by Mr A Cooper, the Methodist minister because he refused to have Henry Jaggers the Baptist minister bury him.

William was more likely to have been 78 years old when he died because he was born in 1819.



From the photos of Ruth and William the farms & shop they owned and their trip back to London it is obvious that Ruth from a "A rough lot, never come to Church..." did well in Australia.

Descendants of Ruth and William's sons, Alfred & John continue, in 2024, to farm some of their properties in the Lawrence region

When **Ruth Clarke died in 1902** her husband William Ensbey had died 5 years earlier in 1897. The following newspaper cuttings give us some interesting information about Ruth.

Richmond Examiner (Grafton, NSW: 1889 - 1915) / Sat 6 Sep 1902

DEATH OF MRS. ENSKEY.-We have to record the death of Mrs. Rath Ensbey which took place at her late residence Queen-street, Grafton, on 21st August, after a long illness. She came to the colonies about 50 years ago with her husband and three sons, Charles, John and Alfred; the three survive her. Charles resides at Broadwater, near Lawrence, John at Lower Southgate, and Alfred at Melbourne. When she and her husband came to the Clarence, over 40 years ago, they resided at Swan Creek for a few years, and came to Lower Southgate, where her husband died about 5 years ago, and then she went to reside at Grafton. She and her husband had a trip to the old country in 1887. She leaves a large circle of relations, about 22 grandchildren, about 100 greatgrandchildren, and 4 great great grandchildren. The funeral was largely attended. She was highly esteemed by all who knew her.



Ruth's son Charles is the ancestor of the Ensby/Ensbey/Clark families in this history.

Charles came to Australia with the family in 1855 on the ship *Blenheim*. I have included below a copy of the passenger list from that ship that lists the Ensbey family. Note that Charles surname is in brackets to indicate that it is different from the others in the Ensbey family. His name appears to read "Clerk" it should obviously be "Clark" his mother's maiden name.

I have emphasised the spelling here because I have seen in a number of other family history notes and books that Charles name on the ship record is "Ainsley" and also "Clarke".

Charles Clarke-Ensbey 1839-1906

CHARLES was born in 1839 at Croydon, Cambridgeshire, England. He was baptised in Ickleton, England in the same year. Charles was born out of wedlock to some other man before Ruth's marriage to William Endersby in 1840. Charles was cared for by Ruth's mother, Mary Clarke, before her marriage.

Charles accompanied the Endersby family on their voyage to Australia aboard the *Blenheim* in 1855 under the name of Charles Clerk, aged 15 and his occupation was given as a farm labourer. Frequently Charles was the cause of disquietude between Ruth and William.

Charles was never adopted by **William** and when he wanted to take the name Ensbey, the family defiantly rejected his request so Charles decided to go by the name of Charles CLARKE-ENSBEY.

Charles met **Harriett Garrett** when the Ensbey family was living at Maitland on the Hunter River from 1855 to 1859 before moving to the Clarence district. Harriett was born on 18 August 1833 in Chillington, Somersetshire, England, the daughter of Benjamin Garrett and Elizabeth Bridge (or Budge). Harriett had arrived in Australia on 27 May, 1855 on board the vessel *Constitution* with her sister, Anne and her husband Anthony Stower and infant daughter. Anthony died on the voyage.

Charles and Harriett were married on 25 July 1858 at West Maitland. Charles Clarke, for some reason married as Charles Ainsly and Harriett Garrett used the names of Hariet Garot. One can only assume the reason for the incorrect spelling for Garrett was perhaps the pronunciation of the word and nobody bothered to check the scribe's spelling deficiencies.

Charles and Harriett moved with the Ensbey family to Lawrence and settled as freehold farmers at Southgate and Broadwater on the Clarence River near Maclean. They had 14 children who also took a mixture of names, Ensbey/Ensby/Clarke/Clark and used them inconsistently.

In 1867, Charles obtained Deeds of Grant for landholdings on the Broadwater. Several of his children were born and married at his farm house.


Charles died as an Ensbey on 21 April 1906 in Maclean at the Lower Clarence Hospital and was buried at the Lawrence Cemetery, NSW on 22 April. Cause of death was chronic nephritis and uraemia.

The book provides a trove of interesting information especially about Charles's name.

Charles Ensbey however is the name used within his family when he died (see the memoriam and below and the newspapers "Thanks" notice and Death Certificate on the next page).

Charles Clarke-Ensbey 1839-1906 is something of an enigma, we know more about his mother and her family than we do of him. There are no photos and his name is still a mystery*. His 14 children give us plenty of family relationships to look at but for all of the descendants the trail

back to England is via him. His children marry into the Pringle family, the Dobbin family, the Essex family and the Cavanough family and his grandchildren keep this tradition going.

*Apart from the misspellings and variations in records of his surname I have seen him embellished with middle names of Mervyn and Michael, none with any validity that I can discover. (NM 2024)

Charles Clarke-Ensby 1839-1906 & Harriett Garrett 1833-1918

Charles is a central character in this part of the family history; he has two half brothers, John & Alfred Ensbey. With Harriet they have 14 children, they fill the pages ahead. One of those children is **Harriet Ensby** who marries **Robert Arthur Pringle**.

Charles is the son of Ruth Clarke he was born in Croydon, near Cambridge in England in 1839. He died in Maclean NSW 21 April 1906 and buried in the Lawrence cemetery.

BUT there is no photo of him. His name is something of a mystery. In the Speculum Gregis (*The notebook informal census the local rector created in 1843. See the story a few pages back*) he is seemingly listed as John Clarke. His step father, William Ensbey, never adopted Charles and was opposed to Charles using the Ensbey surname.

He seems to be listed in a number of genealogy sites as Charles *Michael* Clarke Ensbey. The name was used on his death documents and the newspaper notices in 1906 was Charles Ensbey.


We go from John Clarke (1843) to Charles Clarke when he immigrated in 1855 to Charles Ainsly when he married in 1858. He gave a variety of surnames to his children and died as Charles Ensbey. Given all of those names I have no idea where his middle name of Michael came from. Garry Ensbey in "The Ensbey Story" 2014 has him named as Charles Mervyn Clarke. I have no idea where the Mervyn came from either. I have used the name, Charles

Clarke Ensbey in this book to make research and identification easier.

His gravesite in Lawrence cemetery is not marked.

Charles birth date? In the "Ensbey Story" by Garry Ensbey 2014, he has Charles born in 1835 he also has his middle name as Mervyn. I can find no support for either. Some genealogy sites have Charles birth evidence as a baptism in Ickleton (Croydon) UK in 1840 but that entry is **NOT** him, neither is the one in 1835. I have settled on **1839** because he was 15 when arrived in Australia in 1855 & he was 34 in the 1875 Electoral Roll.

Charles was born out of wedlock to some other man before Ruth's marriage to William Endersby in 1839/40. Charles was cared for by Ruth's mother, Mary Clarke, before Ruth's marriage.

Charles accompanied the Endersby family on their voyage to Australia aboard the *Blenheim* in 1855 under the name of Charles Clerk, aged 15 and his occupation was given as a farm labourer. Frequently Charles was the cause of disquietude between Ruth and William.

Charles was never adopted by William and when he wanted to take the name Ensbey, the family defiantly rejected his request so Charles decided to go by the name of Charles CLARKE-ENSBY.

Charles met Harriett Garrett when the Ensbey family moved north to the Hunter River Valley where they lived 1rom 1855 to 1859 before moving to the Clarence district. Harriett was born on 18 August 1833 in Chillington, Somersetshire, England, the daughter of Benjamin Garrett and Elizabeth Bridge (or Budge). Harriett had arrived in Australia on 27 May, 1855 on board the vessel Constitution with her sister, Anne and her husband Anthony Stower and infant daughter. Anthony died on the voyage.

Charles and Harriett moved to Lawrence and settled as freehold farmers at Southgate and Broadwater on the Clarence River near Maclean in 1859. Their first child, **Elizabeth Ann Ruth Ensbey**, however was born 20th Feb 1859 at Sugar Loaf, Lochinvar, Hunter River near Maitland. They arrived with a young child.

In 1867, Charles obtained Deeds of Grant for landholdings **on the Broadwater**. Several of his children were born and married at his farm house.

The Electoral Roll of Lawrence in **1875** showed Charles as Ensbey aged 34 years, William Ensbey (his step father) aged 53, and John Thomas Ensbey (his half brother) 30.

The Electoral Roll of Lawrence in **1889** has, Charles Clarke-Ensby aged 47 farming at Broadwater near Lawrence on the Clarence River.

The Electoral Roll of Lawrence of **1899** was specific in the location of the Ensbey family with Charles Clarke-Ensby, aged 57 and his sons David aged 31 and John William aged 33, still at Broadwater while his other son Benjamin aged 34 was still at Lawrence.

The **1903** Electoral Roll showed a change with only Charles and Harriett Ensby at Broadwater, Clarence River,

The above is an edit from "The Ensbey Story" by Garry Ensbey 2014, it repeats some points I have already made and adds a statement about Harriett that I have not verified about her arrival in Australia. (NM 2024)

Charles died in 1906 in Maclean and is buried in Lawrence Cemetery but his gravesite seemed to be unmarked. His parents have large headstones in the Lawrence Cemetery.

Charles, although he has various spellings of his surname is quite consistent with his first name and again I have seen various additional middle names given to him (Mervyn and Michael) there is no evidence for any of them. The certificates above and the property sale document below all indicate a single given name of Charles.

The document below relates to the purchase of a block of land by Charles in Lawrence in 1889.



The Ensby/Clarke Family

Harriett Garrett 1833-1918

This is the family of **Harriet Ensby**. Her mother was **Harriett Garrett** and her father **Charles Clarke-Ensbey**

Harriett Garrett's presence has been felt by visitors to Snowy Cavanough's (nee Bradfield) house at Tullymorgan. A portrait photograph of Harriet in a dark timber frame stares out at you. Her elaborate hat makes her look small and a bit comical. The Garrett family are work for another history; here I will include a few details about her ancestry.



Harriett Garrett


Harriett was born in Clay Lane Chillington Somerset, England in 1833

In the English Census in 1851 she was listed as a Glover (she made gloves). *See below*

Harriett immigrated arriving in Australia in 27th May 1855 on the ship "Constitution" (Her parents stayed in England and both died in the 1860's so why she came to Australia remains a mystery. Her younger sister Rachel seems to have come to Australia as well and was living with Harriet near Maitland where she married as did Harriett. Their brother, William seems to have married and lived in Victoria.)

Harriett married **Charles Clarke-Ensbey** at West Maitland in 1858. She died in Maclean in 1918.

We pick up Harriett's story and her family of 14 children when we come to her husband, Charles, in later pages.



Harriett Garrett is 17 in the 1851 census.

You can see both Harriett and her sister, Rachel, who was just 14 are both listed as glovers. They are both listed as "daughter" of Benjamin Garrett who is 62 and am "Ag Lab: an Agricultural Labourer. Harriett's mother is Elizabeth aged 61.

Right: Harriett Garrett arrived in Australia in 1855 on the ship Constitution. There was Smallpox and Typhoid cases so the passengers were held in quarantine for several weeks.

Below: Harriett is listed as the only Garrett on the passenger list. (See earlier notes about her immigration)

SYDNEY, NEW SOUTH WALES NEWSPAPER 28th May 1855

The Ship CONSTITUTION arrived from South Hampton yesterday, sailing from London, England, on Saturday 17th February 1855 having made fair passage of 98 days arriving in Port Jackson yesterday 27th May 1855. She had on board 375 Government Immigrants principally Agriculture Workers and Mechanics The Ship had seen 14 deaths and 7 births on board.

During the passage , Smallpox and Typhoid broke out and carried off 14 persons . The Ship has been placed in Quarentine in consequence of having 12 cases of Smallpox still onboard .




Right: Harriett Ensby (Garrett) Death Certificate.

She had Acute Bronchitis and a Cerebral Haemorrhage.

Curiously her daughter Isabella is listed as 58 years old. I have her having died in 1903!

Her son David is missing from the list of living children.

There is some confusion between the information listed here and the children listed in her husband Charles death certificate in 1906 (see copy a few pages back).

The registration below of Charles's death in 1906 has his name as ENSBEY but it is one of the very few if not the only time that spelling is officially used as his name.

m. 2 Margaret Ann Mills in 1904 at Burringbar, NSW

Ben & Agnes have 5 children (Charles, Arthur, Florence, Herbert & Clarence)

Ben & Margaret have <u>7 children</u>. (Stanley, Edwin, Elisa, Clarence, Edna, Hilda & Charles)

Ben's 5 children from his first marriage have the surname **Ensby** BUT he married in 1904 a second time as **Benjamin Edward Clarke**. His 7 children from this marriage have the surname **Clarke**. However NOTE that the children from his first marriage Charles, Arthur, & Herbert all give their children (Ben's grandchildren) the surname **Clarke**. Florence marries Archie Morris and the surname is Morris. BUT the youngest of Ben's sons, Clarence, uses the surname **Clark** for his children and when he dies in 1947 in Urbenville it is recorded as Clarence **Clark**.

6 John William Ensbey (Ensbey)

b. 1866 d. 1930 as Ensby in Maclean

A bachelor he did not marry and had no children. His surname on his death certificate is ENSBY

7 David Ensbey (Ensbey) Ensby

b. 1868 Lower Southgate d. 1944 as Ensby in Maclean

m. Catherine (Kate) McClymont on 23 Feb 1892 at Broadwater, Clarence River NSW

David & Kate have <u>10 children</u>. (Daniel, John, Ernest (Eric), Albert (Jack), Alice, Margaret (Biddy), Ivy, Robert (bob), Phillis, & Ivan (Sandy).

David married Kate in a double wedding with his sister Harriet to *Robert Pringle* at their parent's home at Broadwater. Although David was named Ensbey he used the Ensby spelling. He was inconsistent with

the spelling of his children 8 are **Ensby** and 1 (Robert) 1906 is **Ensbey** on their birth records. Daniel born 1892 there is no record. The registered names don't reflect the surnames they used. The extended family seems to have referred to this line of the family as Clark.

His marriage record in 1892 has the spelling of his surname as Ensby.

In 1931 David's son **Albert changes his surname officially by Deed Ensbey to Clark** and confusingly his children are named Earl Lloyd Ensbey 1919 (who names his children Clarke-Ensbey), Kevin Ensby 1926 (who names his child **Clarke**), Neville Clark 1931 & Rex Clark 1934 (both maintain the surname **Clark**). These Clark & Clarke surnames are referring to David's grandchildren.

8 Mary Jane Ensbey (Ensbey)

b. 1870 d. 28 Jan 1931 bur. Lawrence C of E, Cemetery

m. Moses Charles Essex on 21 May 1890 at Lawrence, NSW

Mary & Moses have 4 children. Florence, Moses Jnr, William & Charles

They live near Ulmarra.

9 Harriet Ensby (Ensby)

b. 1871 Grafton d. 1943

m. **Robert Arthur Pringle** on 23 February 1892 at Lawrence

Harriet & Robert have <u>8 children</u>. (Annie, Harriet (Lena), Elizabeth, Robert (Bob), Alice (Biddy), Thomas, Edna, George)

Details about their families follow in the next sections of this book

10 Hannah Ensbey

b. 25.4.1872 d. 11 Jan 1953

m. Charles Albert Cavanough in 1903 at Grafton

Hannah & Charles have 5 *children*. (Alice, Kate, George, John & Doris)

Charles had previously married Hannah's older sister, Alice, in 1898.

Two of Hannah & Charles children are followed in this book. Their eldest *Alice May Cavanough* born in 1904 and no doubt named after Hannah's sister (who was Charles first wife who died in 1901). Alice's youngest child, *Collette Dobbin* (1937-2023) was well known to the Tullymorgan family and she often stayed with Hannah's sister Harriet's granddaughter, Snowy, & her husband Dick the 3rd child of Hannah & Charles (more about them later). The 3rd of Alice May Cavanough's children *Albert CHARLES* **Dobbin** marries Edith Wilben and their son **Ian Dobbin** researches the family history and provides many of the source documents in this book.

And Hannah's 3rd child *George Richard (Dick) Cavanough* married Dorothy (Snowy) May Bradfield, as mentioned above the granddaughter of Harriet Ensby and *Robert Arthur Pringle*.

11 Charles Thomas (Tom) Ensby (Ensby)

Anna does not marry and has no children

13 Alice Ensby (Ensby)

b. 1880 d. 30 Oct 1901 bur. Lawrence Cemetery

m. Charles Albert *Cavanough* in 1898

Alice & Charles have 1 *child*. (Charles Stanley Cavanough)

Alice died just 21 years old from bronchitis. Charles married Alice's sister, Hannah, in 1901

14 Richard (Dick) Ensby (Ensby) (Clarke Ensby)

b. 1881 in Ulmarra d. 18 Mar 1921 in Maclean (Buried in Lawrence Cemetry)

m. Sarah Theresa *Dobbin* on 23 May, 1906 Sarah's mother was **Mary Annie Elizabeth PRINGLE** the sister of **Robert Arthur Pringle**

Richard & Sarah have 6 children. (Richard, John, Claude, Carl, Tomas & Iris)

Richard's children all seem to have the surname Clarke-Ensby and descendants seem to have dropped the Ensby and just use the surname Clarke.

A NSW Supreme Court probate document from June 1921 after his death reads "In the Estate of RICHARD ENSBEY, late of Lawrence...."

The youngest of Richard and Sarah's children, Iris, marries Cecil Robert Sutherland and their son Robbie Sutherland still lives in Tullymorgan in 2024.

The 9th child of Charles Clarke-Ensbey and Harriett Garrett

The lives, families and descendants of Harriet's 13 siblings is in the appendix - Research Note 1

Harriet is with her husband, **Robert Arthur Pringle**, are a reference point for other relatives within this book. Her 8 children and their families are the main study of this family history.

It is with Harriet that we trace the family line via the names Ensby/Ensbey and Clark/Clarke back to 1520. We ignore the Ensbey/Endersby ancestors because we don't know who the father of Harriet's father was. So we follow the line of her grandmother Ruth Clarke. Harriet was born in Grafton in 1871. The 5th daughter and she was named after her mother "Harriett" The record indicates no other name. Her name is registered Harriett with "2 tts" but she only uses a single "t" in her name – Harriet.

Harriet is known as "Minnie". I don't know why? In photos she does not appear very small; it could have been an ironic appellation because she was taller than most females!

It seems like Harriet and her brothers and sisters all 14 of them had a fairly good home life. Only one Charles William died (and he drowned) so childhood illness and disease took no toll on the family. Charles William Ensbey drowned in 1866 he was only 3 years old. At the time of the incident the report said "that his parents reside on a farm at Woodford Island, fronting the Clarence River,"

The family are listed as living in Lawrence and/or Broadwater in Electoral Rolls. Broadwater is a region (not a village) between Lawrence and Tullymorgan. It seems the farm on Woodford Island is a different farm to one listed in the Deeds of Grant in 1867 which is located on the Broadwater where Harriet is born in 1871.

Harriet married **Robert Arthur Pringle** she was 20 and he was 24. They married on 23 Feb 1892, it was a *double wedding* her brother David married Kate McClymont on the same day. They were married at the Anglican Church (I assume in Lawrence) and the reception was at the "home of Charles Ensbey at Broadwater". (I assume the property was somewhere along Kings Creek Rd or Back Kings Creek Rd.) *NM 2024*

Note above that Harriett has dropped a "t" from her name and the spelling is "Harriet". (Source is NSW BDM and is the online index record. Enough for us to know we have the right people and date of the marriage event). NM 2024

Harriet's father, Charles, died in 1906 in Maclean Hospital and her mother Harriett died in Grafton in 1918.

Although the records are limited and family history does not have much to say about their early married life, it does seem that Harriet and Robert work as a team both married and business partners. They travel and socialise together and visit their children and make family relations a priority in their lives.



The document above is a land purchase by "Harriet Pringle wife of Robert Pringle a Murrayville farmer" She bought 11 acres, 3 rods & 2 perches of land (4.76 hectares) for £14 16shillings & 11pence. And 3 years to pay for it. (Average wages were about £1. 5s per week)

In the 23 years from 1893 to 1915 Harriet and Robert have 8 children they all survive childhood and live into middle and old age. The family does well financially; buying and selling farms/land, farming a variety of crops and later a business in Brisbane. (More about all of that when we get to Robert Pringle).

Harriet seems to have had an accident at some time because in 1933 she goes to Sydney for medical attention. Robert went with Harriet to Sydney.


The Pringle Family

There are good records confirming that the our ancestors of the Pringle family lived around Newcastle and Leeds in Northumberland in England however there is not a lot of specifics on the ancestors of the two brothers **James** and **Nicholas** who came to Australia in 1843 and 1857.

This history is about the two brothers and their descendants.

James Pringle is my Great-Great-Grandfather and his is the line that is followed directly but it is not quite that simple see the relationship links a few pages ahead.

The Pringles in England

The Pringle brothers, James & Nicholas came from the region of England marked on the map opposite. They were mainly centred in the town of Durham

The Pringle Name

The Pringle name has an interesting derivation and the more ancient roots of the family are in **Research Note 2**



The Pringle Family in Australia

Robert Arthur Pringle marries **Harriet Ensby** in 1892 and the Pringle family enters the family tree.

Robert Arthur Pringle was born in 1867, the middle child the 5th of nine children. He was just 12 when his mother Elizabeth Lister died in 1879 and only 14 when his father, Thomas, dies in 1882.

Robert is my great grandfather, his daughter Annie is my grandmother. (Neville Maloney 2024)

The story begins

In 1843 Robert Pringle's grandfather, **James**, arrived in Australia. He arrives on a ship the "GUIDE" but that ship comes from New Zealand. And so the mysteries begin at the very start of the story.

The family tradition (which is wrong) is that three brothers left England, so far north in England they may have been Scottish! One of them, **John**, continued on to New Zealand or maybe they all went to New Zealand and John stayed there. Anyway that's how the Pringles came to be in Australia. – A partly true and mostly wrong family tradition. -

By the time **Robert Pringle's** daughter, **Annie**, marries **Patrick Bradfield** in 1919 the Pringle family has become something of landed gentry in Tullymorgan. The Pringle's dress well, they own one of the first cars in Tullymorgan and travel back and forwards to Queensland where some of the family live. The Pringle Headstones in Maclean Cemetery testify the truth of the family of substance.

The lists of who's who and the family ancestors on the online genealogy sites almost make sense. The little gaps and the generations of John, Thomas, James & Nicholas make it just confusing enough to think someone else must know how it all fits together.

Well it doesn't.

So here I go.

There is no **John Pringle**, the brother who goes to New Zealand he does not exist In fact **James** came to Australia via NZ he bought his family from Nelson NZ to Sydney in 1843 but the record is clear he went to NZ with just his wife and two children. They came on a freighter vessel and they came "**Steerage Class**" the cheapest way to travel by the poorest passengers. He came with a wife and two small children; **Jane** was 7 and **Thomas** was 11 both were born in England. Another child is born in 1844 with the wonderful name of **Susannah Goulden Pringle**.

Thomas has one of the large headstones in Maclean Cemetery.

And the other brother, Nicholas, well he is still in England. We find him and his family in 1841 and again in the 1851 Census and then in 1857 he packs up and heads to Lawrence in NSW.

Nicholas arrives on the ship <u>"GLEN ISLA"</u> with his wife and 5 kids. Nicholas and his wife are both 50 years old. They must have had letters back home from James telling them how good life was on the Clarence River. But just 2 years later in 1859 James dies.

This story about the Pringle family is the story about the families of James and Nicholas Pringle, brothers who arrived in Australia 14 years apart.

It is the **James Pringle** line of the family that this book is primarily about and we follow his son **Thomas** and It is Thomas's son **Robert** who marries **Harriett Ensby**.

James is associated with the Traveller's Rest Hotel and farm and the Property Blake's Creek.

Nicholas & James Pringle (Brothers)

The evidence is good but there is no absolute historical family document..

For James we have records for his birth and his parent's names.

They are both born in Northumberland and Nicholas is indentified in the 1841 & 1851 Census documents in England. (James had left England seemingly before 1841).

Nicholas's death certificate lists the same parent names that we have for James.

The fact that when Nicholas arrives in Australia in 1857 he goes very quickly to the place where James is living is fairly telling.

Headstones in the Maclean Cemetery of Nicholas and James son Thomas are very similar. (James is buried somewhere at Blake's Creek.)

Then there is Elizabeth and Thomas.

And where their descendants travel to and lives also indicate a continued link between the families.

Elizabeth Lister & Thomas Pringle

Elizabeth is the daughter of John Lister and Mary Tyson. Her father, Thomas dies in 1833 and her mother marries Nicholas Pringle. Elizabeth was born in 1832 and comes with Nicholas and his family to Australia in March 1857 she is listed as Elizabeth Pringle.

In November 1858 she marries Thomas Pringle. (She is NOT related to Thomas. Yes her mother is Thomas's aunty but Nicholas is NOT her father.)

Nicholas Pringle (The Mossman Pringles)

Most of Nicholas's family move to Bundaberg & far north Qld around Mossman, Innisfail & Port Douglas)

James & Thomas Pringle (The Clarence & Southern Qld Pringles)

Thomas is James only son and he and his two sisters and most of their descendants stay around Northern NSW a SE Queensland. With one exception George Tyson Pringle also goes to Mossman!

The Lister Family

Before we start on the Pringles let's get the Lister family understood.

On the previous page **Elizabeth Lister** *marries* **Thomas Pringle** and the little tangle of who she is explained.

Elizabeth and her mother, Mary, make the Lister line ancestors of nearly all of the Pringle family as well.

(Elizabeth Lister is my great great grandmother and her mother, Mary Lister (Tyson) is my GGG grandmother but her husband Nicholas Pringle is my GGGG uncle. (NM 2024)

The greatness of Aunties and Uncles causes this little anomaly there is no "grand" Aunties and Uncles, they go straight to great and so a great uncle is the brother of your grandmother of grandfather and therefore an uncle of a great grandmother of great grandfather is a GG uncle.

That was however not the point when it came to **Nicholas Pringle** rather I was trying to point out that his wife, **Mary Lister**, was in a direct ancestor line but he was not because **Elizabeth is his step daughter**. (See previous page.)

Nicholas Pringle marries Mary Lister in 1835 and although we have trouble tracing the Pringles back for more than a couple of generation before that, however the Lister family is there in church records for generations going back to the 1600's.

Elizabeth Lister has a brother Thomas who is also listed in the 1841 Census with the family. He is mentioned again when the family emigrates in 1857 as a relative living in Newcastle NSW. The probate record on the right however tells that he moved to the Burnett River in Qld and died at a place called Pringle's Farm. He left everything to his son also named **Thomas Lister** who lived at Lake Macquarie NSW.





Nicholas Pringle 1805-1870 - The Mossman Pringles

Although he was the older brother, born 5 years before James, he migrated to Australia in 1857 some 14 years after James arrived in 1843.

I have identified this line of the family *The Mossman Pringles* because although Nicholas did not leave the Lawrence, Clarence River region his children, the ones I have information about, moved north to either Bundaberg or Mossman, Innisfail and Port Douglas in north Queensland.

Nicholas was born in Rothbury, Northumberland in England about 60 kilometres north of Newcastle and about 20 kilometres to the Scottish border.

Some of the key facts about Nicholas are found on his death certificate (next page).

It lists his parents: Thomas Pringle & Elizabeth Mole.

The "Informant", the person who provided the information was his son, Nicholas Pringle.

His death was registered in Grafton on 10^{th} August 1870. He died on 3^{rd} Aug 1870 at Lawrence on the Clarence River. He was buried on 5^{th} Aug 1870 at Maclean.

He was 65 years old and had been a farmer. He died of "Dispepsia" (An ulcer or cancer of the upper digestive system. He had symptoms for 12 months; probably severe heartburn pain when eating).

Nicholas was a Presbyterian. (But listed at immigration as a Church of England)

He was born in England and married in Durham at the age of 29 (1839) to Mary Lister

I can't read the particulars about the "Children of the marriage"

The information from the death certificate and the documents from the 1841 and 1851 census in England, the arrival document into Australia in 1857 we can make some assumptions about the life Nicholas lived.

In the census lists Nicholas is listed as a farm labourer. The 1840s & 50s was a tough time for farm workers in England and he moved round probably chasing jobs. The potato famine famous in Ireland also had an impact but not as bad in northern England and Scotland. The England /Scotland border regions had been a clan fighting clan area for centuries and life was often difficult.

Emigration to Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Canada or the USA must have been an attractive option over moving to the industrialised manufacturing cities like Manchester where life was hellish in the newly developing factories.

Nicholas kept moving south. He was born in Rothbury, in 1805, which is north of Newcastle and then married in Pittington, in 1835, just south of Newcastle. By 1841 he has moved to Farnley in Yorkshire about 120 kilometres further south near Leeds, getting closer and closer to the developing industrial cities. In 1857 probably with letters in hand from his brother in Lawrence describing his life in NSW Nicholas decided to make the journey even further south.

After arriving in Australia in 1857 Nichols seems to have done fairly well. He contributes to the Grafton Hospital fund in 1866, £1 and he also contributes to the Wesleyan Church fund and he buys land in Lawrence.

Nicholas Pringle is the brother of **James Pringle** and it is James who is the direct ancestor of the Pringle family in this history. Nicholas and his family however influence much of the future that evolves, especially his step daughter, Elizabeth. It is obvious that Nicholas came to Australia at the behest of his brother. I have told the story of Nicholas before that of James to make James story more continuous later in the book. (NM)


The ship left Liverpool, England 26th March 1867 and arrived in Sydney 2nd July 1857.

A 99 day trip; 99 days of cold, heat, wind, sickness, really bad food, cramped shared living quarters, no washing except with sea water. 370 passengers and about 40 crew and 99 days is a slow trip they must have encountered bad weather. All going well the trip could be done in 70 days by the late 1800s.

This seems to have been a ship especially charted, like many other, to bring "assisted migrants" to Australia. The assisted migration program had many variations and funding programs but generally the migrants paid up to £2 per person. It may have been that Nicholas's brother, James made a nomination to sponsor his migration.... we just don't know the circumstances.

Nicholas born in England in 1805, migrated to Australia in 1857, died in Lawrence in 1870 and is buried in Maclean Cemetery. He had 5 children, one died young and 4 came to Australia with him. His step daughter also came with him to Australia and she married his nephew Thomas Pringle in 1878.

Thomas is my great-great Grandfather and as explained earlier that makes Nicholas's wife Mary Lister/Tyson my GGG grandmother but Nicholas a GGGG Uncle. NM 2024

This is an important document.

It lists where Nicholas Pringle is from "Rothbury" Northumberland.

It tells us that he and his family could all read and write. His occupation is an agricultural labourer. His son James is a miner, and Nicholas Jnr is a garden labourer.

Elizabeth Lister (Mary's daughter) is listed Mary Pringle age 25.

We find his step son Thomas Lister is already in Australia, in Newcastle and working as bricklayer.

But most of all it tells that Nicholas's brother, James, is living at Blacks (sic) Blakes Creek, Clarence River. It confirms their relationship and that James must have written to Nicholas informing him about his life in Australia

The records are not clear but he may have married Mary Ayton in 1866 in Grafton and she died in 1871, the year he packs up and leaves Lawrence. He later marries Bridget McGillicuddy, in Qld she was born in 1858 (daughter of John McGillicuddy and Annie Lynch), d. 2 Nov 1896 in Qld. (See records and details in a later section about John Pringle).

5. Mary Pringle b. 1847 d. 1925 in Townville Qld. She married **Angus McDonald** in Grafton in 1865. (See records and details in the next pages).

Nicholas Pringle was born 1805, he married in 1834, and immigrated to Australia in 2nd July 1857. He died 3rd Aug 1870 he is buried in Maclean Cemetery.

I m referring to this line of the family as the **Mossman Pringles** because many moved to the Mossman, Port Douglas, Townsville, Innisfail and Bundaberg regions in Northern Qld. Some of their descendants seemed to have later moved to Brisbane and SE Qld.

The **3 brothers** seemed to have moved together and their story is told in the following 2 pages which are from a book "*The History of Queensland: It's People and Industries*" it's a 3 volume set written from 1919 to 1923 and the two pages reproduced here are from Volume 3 pages 782 & 783.

James, John and **Nicholas** 21, 19 and 13 when they arrived in Australia in 1857, they then grew up in Lawrence. They farmed and took part in community activities; they played cricket and were members of the "Lawrence and Woodford Island Debating Club and Mutual

Improvement Association" and advertisements like the one opposite appeared regularly about their meeting. They debated such topics as:

Would Compulsory Education tend to Public Benefit?
Is the use of Alcoholic Beverages Beneficial or Otherwise?
Does Capital punishment tend to the Diminution of Crime?
Was the execution of Mary Queen of Scots Justifiable?
Which has the Greatest Influence on Man, Woman or Money?
And the question in the advert opposite as well.



The brothers seem industrious they took up land selection and had funds when they moved to Qld to start farming there.

During this time John married Mary Ayton in 1866 and she died in 1871 (see below) and this may have been the impetus, along with the death of their parents in 1870 & 1871 as well, for the brothers to move from Lawrence.

that part of the Far North of which Port Douglas and Mossman are centres. Mr. John Pringle was the youngest of three brothers who, accompanied by a sister, came to Australia considerably over half a century ago, and combining their resources invested in land on the Clarence River, New South Wales. These brothers engaged in mixed farming for a period, but finally, realizing that the younger Colony of Queensland must provide greater scope for any form of landed enterprise, disposed of their original interests and proceeded northwards. They became identified with the agricultural development of the district outlying the town of Bundaberg, and the two elder, Nicholas and James Pringle, eventually ranked among the southern pioneers of the sugar industry. The youngest of the trio, John Pringle, separating his interests from those of his brothers, struck out for himself

when the country comprised in the Mossman watershed came to be recognized as a promising agricultural district. He travelled from the south by boat to Port Douglas, and, journeying inland, selected the fine block now comprising the "Fairy-mount" Estate. This he submitted to a vigorous cause of development, growing principally maize and rice for the following fifteen years, when the erection of the Mossman Central Mill being inaugurated, cane was cultivated on a large scale. The opening of the mill heralded a new and prosperous era in the fortunes of the pioneer, as in the history of the district, and such fine old settlers as the late R. O. Jones, Mr. Wilson, and others also saw then a promise of fruition destined to be a fulfilment worthy of their years of strenuous toil. The late John Pringle experienced many ups and downs during his long and useful career of


citizenship in the Far North, and in the face of obstacles that must often have seemed insurmountable, made good in a manner which stands as an example for posterity. He was

years. His wife was Bridget McGillicuddy, a member of a family that for generations had been identified with agricultural life in Ireland. This lady proved herself the possessor of those fine attributes which have earned for our pioneer mothers the veneration of posterity. A good wife, mother, neighbour, and friend, her charity found ample scope in the early days of settlement. She pre-deceased her husband, who died in the year 1901, survived by a family of five sons and one daughter. The death of her first-born occurred JAMES MOSSMAN 1916. PRINGLE, the eldest surviving son of the couple, was born on May 18, 1883, and educated locally, his birthplace, as that of his three younger brothers, being "Fairymount." To brothers, being "Fairymount." him belongs the distinction of being the first white child born in the Mossman district. Following worthily in his father's footsteps, he devotes himself whole-heartedly to the administration of "Fairymount" and to different phases of primary production there represented. PRINGLE, his brother next in age, who ably assists in the working and direction of affairs on the property, was born on April 24, 1885. The two younger sons of the pioneer, HARRY TYSON PRINGLE and THOMAS LYNCH PRINGLE, who were born at the old home on November 1, 1889, and March 11, 1891, respectively, attended a school at Rockhampton. Both served their country during the Great War, having enlisted shortly after the outbreak of hostilities, the former in January, 1915, and the latter during the previous year. Mr. Harry T. Pringle, the elder of the two, served in Egypt as a member of the Light Horse, and in France with the Army Service Corps. He remained abroad with the troops for some time after the Armistice was signed, finally receiving his discharge in Australia and returning to the old farm. Mr. Thomas L. Pringle, on concluding his school days, became engaged in commerce, and was so occupied when duty demanded his presence in the firing line. He also saw the struggle right through, being mentioned in despatches and receiving the D.C.M. for gallantry in action. For the whole period of the war he served with the Anzac Mounted Division, obtaining the rank of first class warrant officer ere the Armistice was declared. Ida Mary Pringle, the only daughter of the pioneer, resides at "Fairymount" with her brother.

OBITUARY.

The funeral of the late Mr. John Pringle which took place on Saturday afternoon was largely attended. The Rev. E. Taffs conducted the service of the Church of England at the grave side. Mr. Pringle was the chird son of the late John Pringle, senior, who was one of the earliest Mossman residents and who grew maize on the farm at "Fairymeunt," South Mossmon, long years before the building of the Mossman mill. His son John was born in this district forty-four years ago, and with the exception of a period spent in the south, for health reasons, had been in the Mossman since. Of a quiet and good nature! disposition Mr. Pringle was well tiked by everyone. Harry and Thomas seem to have immigrated to Kenya in 1922, newspaper columns tell some of their story. The articles below are a visit by Harry in 1937 and on the next page by Tom in 1939.

AN INTERESTING VISITOR

On a visit to Mossman Just now is Mr. H. T. (Harry) Pringle, a member of one of the early pioneering families of Mossman, who has been a resident of Nakuru, Kenya Colony, for the last fitteen years and who is paying his first visit since leaving Australia. Mr. Pringle is engaged in the production of white maize and gives us some interesting comparisons in prices. A 200lb, bag of maize in Kenya averages about six shillings per bag; on his own plantation ne expects 9000 bags this harvest; the growing conditions and the productivity of the land compares quite favourably with the best maize land in Australia, but the pests encountered are the drawback. He has seen 100 acres of maize completely destroyed in one hour by locusts.

Kenya, continues Mr Pringle, has a delightful climate and the living conditions are very nice. All the manual work is done by native labor, even the house work is done by them, and male labor only employed. Like india, the nursemaid is called Ayah and this is the only avenue of employment open for the female native. One Utopian ideal obtaining, however, is that there is no income tax in Kenya, the only tax being a poll tax of 30/- per head and another tax of a similar amount, both being statutory and stationary. However, this year, the administration intends to bring in a form of income tax.

Mr. Pringle, who will be spending six weeks in his old home town, is the guest of his brother. Mr. J. Pringle, and has been busy visiting other relations. He was astounded at the progress of Mossman since he left, especially the motor run of half an hour, which one time was a day's journey on horseback.

Mr. Harry Pringle has left again for Kenya Colony, and prior to his departure a number of his chuma gathered is Kildea's Cafe on Sunday evening, the 12th instant, to bid him "bon voyage." It was more of a happy reunion than a farewell gathering, for amongst those present were quite a number who had been at the war with him, including five cobbers who were in his own unit. The chair was taken by Mr. R. D. Rex, chairman of the shire, and the spirit of the evening was a wonderful manifestation of good fellowship. After the Loyal toast was bonored with simple sincerity. Mr. C. J. Crees proposed the health of the guests and his companions in arms. Mossman district is very proud of this group of soldier sons which comprise members of the oldest pioneering families—a member of the Pringle family being the first white male child to be born in Mossman.

A second very happy and sincere toast, reserently pledged, was to the Fringle family. As may be expected, the responses from the soldier guests were in happy vein. Opportunity was also taken to honor Mr. Austin Donnelly, "Sucrose," of the Townsville "Bulletin," who was both a boyhood mate of Mr. Pringle as well as a cobber at the front in the same unit. Speaking to Mr. Donnelly's present professional calling, Mr. C. J. Grees said that his knowledge of the angar industry was very profound, and he had rendered great assistance to the industry. During the evening every guest contributed by recitation, song or anecdote to the general entertainment, whilst other toasts upheld were the chairman and the caterers. Mr. Pringle was asked to convey to his brother Tom, another Mossman "old boy" still in Kenya, a veritable Bible of good wishes and remembrances, whilst Harry himself was given that parting handshake and farewell word that comes from only those who understand.



Nicholas and Mary had 5 children the 3 sons covered in the previous pages, a daughter Elizabeth born in 1841 who died between 1841 and 1851 and their 5th child Mary who like all the other children was born in Yorkshire England.

Mary Pringle born 19th July 1846, immigrated with her family in 1857. She married in 1865 to Angus McDonald (the registration records his name as Angelo, I suspect a transcription error on the index record) and she died in the Townsville area (a newspaper article says "at the Burdekin River.

Examiner (Grafton, NSW: 1915-1954) / Fri 14 Apr 1939

Mary seems to have had 3 children in Lawrence (registered in Grafton) and two died at birth, they were not named. She had 3 more children when they moved to Qld, the first born there in 1880 and the last in 1886 when Mary was 40.



John McDonald's family resided on the Williams River until about the end of the year 1860. At the Crown land sale, held at Grafton on February 26i 1861, Mr. McDonald purchased three portions of land, each 50, 54 and 44 acres, of standing brush at Lower These were surveyed by Southgate. M. S. Finley, L.S., on August 21, 1860. They fronted the Clarence River and portion of them was situated opposite Heliman Island. This holding was known as "Wahgungary." John, senior, and his wife, Flora, died there. John, junior, married one of his British King playmates, Catherine Mc-Lean, to whom reference is made later, The Reverend A. M. Sherriff officiated at their wedding on May 15, 1860, at "Drimnin," Clarencetown. This couple also resided at "Wahgungary" until about the beginning of this century, when they moved to Queensland. They had four daughters. Their father died at Mount Morgan and their mother at His sisters, Margaret and Kate, Tolga. also died in Queensland. Lachlan, his brother, died at Woodford Dale, and Angus, who married Miss Pringle, died at the Burdekin River.

Later generations of James family also move to North Queensland and I suspect that is because of the cousins who live there already.

James Pringle 1810-1859 – The Lawrence Pringles

James Pringle 1810-1859 and Elizabeth Jacks 1808-1863

James was born 21st Dec 1810 in Newcastle upon Tyne, Northumberland, England, he was christened in the United Presbyterian Church at Wooler about 80kms further north just 5 days later on 26th Dec 1810. He married **Elizabeth Jacks**, (maybe **Jacques** and she appears as **Jackson** on some documents) in St John's Parish in Newcastle 20 Nov 1830.

James and Elizabeth have a son **Thomas** in 1832 and **Jane Isabella** in 1836.

On the 25th May 1842 they emigrate from Gravesend to New Zealand on the ship the "*Thomas Harrison*" and arrive at Nelson 25th October 1842.

They leave Nelson in New Zealand 10th March 1843 and arrive in Sydney 27th March 1843.

They have a daughter Susannah Goulden Pringle 23 Jun 1844 at Seal Rock? Clarence River.

James's brother Nicholas arrives from England in 1857

James dies at Blakes Creek 3 Aug 1859 and Elizabeth dies in 1863

We know very little about James's life in Newcastle other than he was an agricultural labourer and living conditions for them would have been deteriorating as industrialisation swept through the region where they lived, it must have been a factor in their decision to emigrate.

In early 1842 with their 2 children James and Elizabeth travelled to Gravesend the sailing ship port for London. How they made that journey we don't know. It may have been by ship, or by canal and train. Trains lines were just beginning to creep across the English countryside.

They have emigrated as "Assisted Migrants" their passage partly paid by their local parish, the British Government and the New Zealand Corporation, but New Zealand had only been made a separate colony in 1840.

In 1842 when they arrived in New Zealand the place was something of a mess. New Zealand was only designated a colony in 1840 and the new governor was trying to encourage migrants especially Agricultural labourers but agreement with the Maori were not working out and when the first arrived in 1841 Nelson was selected because of its port. The land however in the area was steep and not suitable for agriculture. The ship James was on carried 135 people when the European total population was probably just over 2000; they were a part of the first largish numbers to arrive. Within a few years about 25% would leave. The place was becoming more depressed and prospects were not looking good. James must have observed the situation fairly quickly because in March 1843 they left heading for Sydney. They had stayed in New Zealand just 5 months.

James Pringle and Elizabeth Jacks in New Zealand 1842/43

James and his family get from Newcastle in northern England to Gravesend in Kent (just south of London and board the "Thomas Harrison" for a new life in a land as far away from England that you can get. See *Research Note 3* - New Zealand and James Pringle.

On 25 May 1842, the *Thomas Harrison*, under Captain E.M. Smith and with Thomas Renwick as surgeon superintendent, departed Gravesend, Kent, arriving in Nelson, New Zealand on 25 October 1842 with 355 settlers, after two deaths on the voyage. [3][8] Notable arrivals on that voyage included Appo Hocton, [9] John Deans, [10] and George and Martin Lightband. [11]

During the 6 month trip James wife Elizabeth seems to have been given a job as Hospital assistant. They are the only Pringles aboard, so Elizabeth must have had some skills for the job.

In The Nelson Provincial Museum there is a Book, re-bound, blue hard cover, 70 pages. The spine has the title **'MEDICAL JOURNAL OF THE SHIP THOMAS HARRISON 1842'** embossed in gold.

I suspect it may contain information mentions Mrs Pringle as the Hospital Assistant.

James Pringle 1810-1859 – Arrives in Australia 1843

James and his family, his wife Elizabeth and two children, Thomas and Jane came to Sydney from Nelson NZ in March 1843. They left Nelson on march 10^{th} and arrived in Sydney on arch 27^{th} . The ship was the "*Guide*" a Brig of 147 tonnage. A fairly small sailing ship about 20 metres long with 18 passengers aboard, primarily a trading vessel.

James Pringle on The Clarence 1843-1859

James lived in the region for 15 years the area was just being settled in the early 1840s

James and Elizabeth had a child Susannah Goulden Pringle 23 Jun 1844 on her birth certificate it says she was born at Seal Rock, Clarence River but I suspect it was Red Rock as per the information below* about a government office having being setup there. I can't find any reference to a *Seal Rock* anywhere along the Clarence River.

*1842: Oliver Fry appointed Commissioner for Crown Lands in Clarence River District. Fry's headquarters were at Red Rock near the confluence of Clarence and Orara Rivers. Fry had the first police force permanently stationed on the Clarence.

A little bit of History

In December 1830 a convict, Richard Craig escaped from Moreton Bay and spent the year 1831 travelling through Northern NSW to Port Macquarie, he had lived with the aboriginal tribes and learnt their language and he talked about the wonders, especially cedar growing in the "Big River" region. In 1836 he returned as a free man to cut Cedar. In 1837 Craig convinced a ship builder in Sydney to send ship, the schooner "<u>Susan</u>", to the "Big River" to get more cedar. They sailed as far as Susan Island (Grafton) and left some cedar cutters.

With rumours floating around Sydney of the "Big River" JH Grose organised and expedition and invited gentlemen to join him in what he believed would "afford advantages of soil and water conveyance to the Agriculturist and Grazier, unknown in any other part of New Holland"

The result of that expedition was a herd of sheep and cattle were mustered from the Liverpool Plains, just south of Tamworth, and led along the tablelands to a point near Tenterfield then down via Tabulam into the Clarence. This amazing feat was led by Richard Craig and the trail he followed, became known as Craigs Line, was an old aboriginal track. One of the participants in this enterprise was Ogilvie of Yulgilbar Castle fame at Baryulgil.

In 1841 John Small Jnr and Henry Gillett took up licences to graze stock on Woodford Island. James Durno gained Publican's Licence for establishment called Clarence Settlers' Arms was the first licensed premises on the Clarence. Durno had taken over Price's Store.

The Grafton/Lawrence region in the early 1943 was very much a frontier place. Just a few "cedar getters", teams of men moving through the area cutting trees and floating them downstream, they used bullocks to drag the logs and as they moved further from the river they used bullock teams and wagons to move

With the view of enabling the Public to ascertain the extent and capabilities of the Big Liver and its tributary Streams, THE Undersigned proposes sending this vessel, early in the month of May, from Sydney direct, laden with fuel, provided a sufficient number of Passengers offer to defray the expenses. The light water draught and great power of this Vessel it is expected will enable her to reach the Falls, estimated at one hundred and sixty miles from the sea, also up its navigable branches. It is believed the Big River will afford advantages of soil and water con-regance to the Agriculturalist and Grazier, unknown in any other part of New Holland. the logs. These men were transient but others followed to work at the places where the logs

could be loaded onto ships, Lawrence and Grafton were such places. Others followed looking for gold or good grazing land; others setup shops (trading supplies) and hotels (accommodation and drinks). When James and Elizabeth arrived there were no towns just the ports surrounded by a few huts.

By 1847 a Court House was built at Grafton 1841 to 1850 saw a massive influx of people. The world changed around them and James must have made a few good decisions. He applied for a land grant

James Pringle arrived in what became Lawrence because of larger forces. An economic depression in the colonies from 1840 (the 1830's were a boom time), by 1841 the tide was turning and when he got to NZ in 1842 circumstances were pretty bleak. Arriving in Australia in 1843 it was also having problems and a severe drought from 1839. Given these problems The "Big River" frontier seemed like an option for the adventurous.

I think this tells us something about James Pringle a man willing to take his wife and two children initially to New Zealand where there was nothing, nothing except land and hard work. When that land looked unpromising he moved to Australia and rather than settling in the established towns and getting a job he moved to the edge of "civilization". He obviously saw possibilities. The first few years on The Clarence we know very little, there was no local newspaper or for that matter local anything.

Some Facts

1n March 1843 James (32) & Elizabeth Pringle (33) with two children, Thomas (10) and Jane (7) arrive in Sydney Australia. Thirteen months later Elizabeth gives birth to a daughter Susannah in June 1844 at Seal (Red) Rock on The Clarence River.

The family return to Sydney in 1844 after Susannah is born 23 June 1844 because she is baptised in Sydney 13 Aug 1844 at St Andrews Presbyterian Church in Sydney. They then return to The Clarence, not sure when but before James goes to Sydney again in 1851.

In 1851/52 James goes to Sydney, in December 1850, with Hewitt the previous owner of Blake's Run and he buys Blakes Creek and Travellers Rest sheep stations that include the Traveller's Rest Hotel in 1852 which at the time was on the road between Grafton & Lawrence to Casino & Tabulam.

James sells the Traveller's Rest in 1856.

Some Conclusions

Arriving somewhere on The Clarence in 1843/44 the family would have lived under a sheet of canvas until they constructed a bark hut. A land office was setup in 1842 at Red Rock near where the Orara River joins the Clarence River, present day Eatonsville and Mylneford area and that is where I am assuming Susannah was born.

The lost years 1844 to December 1851. James must have been working; labouring, trading making money because he buys the two properties in 1852. The family must have been living in reasonable conditions because all the children survive.

HOWEVER it seems like the Travellers Rest was not a good investment. It seems to have changed owners constantly, James sold it in 1856 and when he dies in 1859 there are debts lots of them.

AND there are more detailed stories to tell about the Traveller's Rest and the family.

I have added more information with lengthy newspapers stories about the region and the convict Robert Craig in <u>Research Note 5 The Clarence – Early History</u>. This is a valuable read to understand the place where James Pringle came to live and what was going on to make it into the pace where his family to live and many still live there today. I have included these Research Notes because for so long I would say to myself "It must have been difficult for them" and "I

don't know why they did that" or I made assumptions that were plainly so wrong. I assumed for example that when they came to The Clarence that Grafton and Lawrence existed and they probably rented a house and went to shops and bought stuff for their kids. Well there was absolutely none of that. Read the <u>Research Note 5</u>. (NM 2024)

Next page is a summary of life on The Clarence in the 1840's

In **1839** the steam ship the *King William* made a trip from Sydney to the Clarence River known then as the "Big River". The advertisement for the trip is a couple of pages above. The article below is a story of that trip and a description of the region. They travelled as far as present day Copmanhurst. This is the land that James and Elizabeth entered in 1843.

BOOMING LAWRENCE.

In 1859 he acquired a great part of the town of Lawrence, then becoming the main port for Tenterfield and the Tooloom diggings, and sought to make it the leading commercial centre of the Clarence. He made a road from Yulgilbar to Travellers' Rest, through Dome Mountain and Camira, which gave him a short route to Lawrence. He established a hotel, a store and a wharf there. For this he was hated by the people of Grafton, and they set up the "new line," through Coaldale, Tenterfield. Mr. Ogilvie's plans came to naught, because the Government, in about 1864, chose the road from South Grafton to Glen Innes as the main road to New England.

On his return from England the boundary dispute as to whether the Hanging Rock Valley belonged to New bold or to Yulgilbar was resumed, and

BIG RIVER EXPEDITION.

The steamer King William returned at about four o'clock yesterday morning, from the Big River. The steamer succeeded in navigating as far as ninety miles up the river, which even almost as far up as that distance from the entrance from the ocean was in places full three miles broad; near to that part of the river where she could no further navigate, the expedition fell in with an island in the middle of the river, about forty miles in circumference, which the steamer went round; on this island, which is stated by those who landed on it, to be a very beautiful plot of ground, was seen a tribe of blacks, living in huts, and without any appearance of warlike instruments, such as spears, waddies, war clubs, &c, in their possession, and they appeared to be friendly inclined. The land as far up as the steamer went in the vicinity of the river, is represented to be without exception the best ever seen in New South Wales. The Surveyor during the expedition fixed upon two sites for Townships. Further particulars in our next.

Left: The **Traveller's Rest** and the farm at **Blakes Creek** are an important chapter in **James Pringle's** life. His time coincided with the Ogilvie family and the development of Yulgilbar Castle (later on).

I have not mentioned in the notes the gold rush at Tooloom because James does not seem to have been touched with gold fever.

James's decision to buy the hotel may have had something to do with those events further north

4.2.2 Settlements of Lawrence and Palmers Island

W.A.B. Greaves, surveyor of Maclean and Lawrence townships stated in his diary that he designed the town and named it after Sir Thomas Lawrence, the hero of the Indian Mutiny. Surprisingly, he was in error as the hero of the Mutiny was Sir Henry Montgomery Lawrence.

Early spelling of the name was also Lawrencetown. Greaves did point out that the stretch of water there was known as the "Devil's Elbow" or just "The Elbow" because sailors said it was "the devil of an elbow" to get round because of the channel and bend close to the north bank.]

Lawrence has already been mentioned as an important point of trade between the Clarence and the Tablelands in connection with the wool industry in the early days. Using the "Old Line" Bullock wagons brought loads from Tabulam to Lawrence not only of wool but also the items listed in early cargoes.



This "Line" serviced the north bank of the Clarence and Lawrence developed as a port rather than a town. It provided for teamsters rather than farmers and as such, the population remained small. It is not surprising that the first two buildings of note were two hotels; the Lawrence for James Bryce and Thomas Bawden's Commercial, both built in 1860.



Two other buildings, which predated the above, were Lanark Lodge and Traveller's Rest. The former comprised a homestead and associated buildings owned by William Robertson on land taken up in 1842. While Lanark Lodge was in the present town area, Traveller's Rest was on the adjoining run on the Grafton side. The Inn built in 1843 was an important link for many years between the coast and tablelands developed by an early owner, James Pringle. It was just a day's journey to the deep-water port at Lawrence.

The amount of trade coming through Lawrence increased steadily until the business people of Grafton recognised the threat and with the support of the Parliamentary representative, Clark Irving, a New Line was made from Tabulam to Grafton, bypassing Traveller's Rest and Lawrence.

Grafton won the battle of the road and the battle of the ports but it was not an easy or annihilating victory. Grafton prevailed, but quite apart from the rivalry of the old and new lines. It won because of the traffic coming down from the Armidale and Glen Innes lines

On the map I have highlighted the town of Grafton, Lawrence, Tabulam & Tenterfield in red and the "old (Graigs)line)" track in green and the new line (not quite a road) in blue. The **Traveller's Rest** is marked by a pink dot. (NM 2024) The page above is from "A thematic history of the city of Grafton"

James Pringle and Traveller's Rest and Blake's Creek timeline Articles in descending order:

1849 - Traveller's Rest sells Joseph Launt buys it from William Hindmarsh.

1851(Dec) – James Pringle travels to Sydney. (Not sure why either to get a loan or confirm transfer of properties).

1852 – The publication is January so James may have bought Traveller's Rest & Blake's Creek in 1851. He buys both properties from Joseph Sharp.

1856 (Feb) – James sell Traveller's Rest to CS Quail who in the same timeframe of the NSW Government Gazette in sells it to Walter Hindmarsh. (In 1849 a William Hindmarsh sold the property!)

1856 (Nov) James finds a horse (he actually found it a year before that) on his **Blake's Creek** property and places an advertisement for the owner to come and claim it.

Note.—According to the Government Gazette, of June, 1848, Thomas Hewitt was then the holder of Blake's Creek. It had an ares of 16,360 acres and was assessed as capable of grazing 600 head of cattle.

James Pringle had it shortly after that. William Robertson sued him in November, 1855, for trespass on Lanark Lodge by erecting a building and stockyard thereon, which he refused to move. It was also alleged that Pringle had for some time past been in the habit of depasturing his cattle on Lanark Lodge, etc.

A BOUNDARY DISPUTE.

Princle defended on the grounds that the buildings were on his own run, and that there had been no wilful trespess of his cattle on Robertson's run. The Court of Requests found that it was a boundary dispute, and as rights in future were involved they had no jurisdiction. The boundaries were afterwards well settled, but they are hard to trace now. Roughly they included the country between Saltwater and Travellers' Rest.

JOE LAUNT.

Mr. R. L. Dawson states that Joseph Launt was afterwards employed by his father in 1870, about the building of the homestead at Bentley, near Naughton's Gap, between Casino and Lismore. When leaving the district shortly after that "old Joe" sold his more. English duck guns to the Armstrongs, of Disputed Plains, for £1. This gun had a remarkably long barrel and took a very heavy charge of powder and shot. It was a destructive weapon hen fired into a flock of wild ducks. It also carried a big bullet. The Armstrongs used it for shooting wild horses, which were called "brumbies."

By Leunt's time the homestead was a regular wayside inn. In November, 1849, Thomas Carroll sued Joseph Launt, of Travellers' Rest, publican, for the detention of two working bullocks. The case was settled out of court.

ENOCKING DOWN HIS CHEQUE.

In 1850 James Pringle had the hotel. In that year James Dunn complained that on September 23, he placed a five pound note, one sovereign and two cheques of John Hogarth, of Wyan, amounting in all to 124/8/5, in the hands of James Fringle, of Travellers' Rest public-house, on the Richmond road for safe keeping. That the plaintiff stayed a few days at the house of the same James Pringle who charged him £10 above the expenses incurred by him and he sought to recover the

Fringle denied receiving the cash, and as for the cheques, Dunn was in the house from September 21 to October 2 and ran up an account of £13/11/3 and the balance had been paid to him. The case was settled.

As Pringle was a grazier and held the adjoining run of Blake's Creek, he no doubt had the run of Travellers' Rest also.

HEWITT'S SHEEP RUN.

with his sheep at Fairfield, near Tabulam. Mr. Hewitt had sheep about this time at the place known as Hewitt's Sheep Station, about three miles on the Grafton side of the Rest Mr. Hindmarsh sold out to Joseph Launt, from whom it fell into Sharp's hands, and ultimately became Mr. Hindmarsh's again. He subsequently sold to Mr. Irving, from whose estate—subsequent to his death—it passed to Lance, and from Lance to Vickery."

Note.—Edward Irby, of Bolivia, near Tenterfield, made an entry in his diary of staying at Hindmarsh's, of Travellers' Rest, on his way down to Grafton

on December 24, 1845.

In June, 1848, the run was gazetted in the name of Walter Hindmarsh, 16,000 acres, a sheep station carrying

4000 head.

The homestead was on the righthand or eastern gide of the Lawrence-Casino road, about two miles past the junction of the road from Grafton. The road to Tenterfield at first branched Later the off at Travellers' Rest. junction was at Mrs. Feizel's, a few miles further on, and later again it was changed to the present position a short distance beyond the three bridges at Myall Creek. Many similar instances may be found in this and other districts. As money came to be spent on a road it was made to serve two purposes and the turn off pushed further yabba,

The position indicated for Mr. Hewitt's sheep station is on the Grafton side of where the Flying Horse Inn was afterwards at the junction of the Grafton-Casino road and Lawrence-Casino road, and it seems from the Gazette notice already mentioned that his sheep run was identical with Blake's Creek cattle station. A creek there is still called Beep Station Creek.

The Hon. A. Norton mentioned Travellers' Rest Inn in 1858, and in the "C. and R. Examiner," of January 24, 1860, a correspondent from Travellers' Rest reported large numbers of diggers on their way from the "Elbow" (Lawrence) to the Tooloom goldfield, and drays coming down, some of them with wool from New England,

George Olive had Travellers' Rest Hotel before he set up at the new turn off beyond the Three Bridges opposite the little family graveyard. Other licensees in later years are said to have been the late George Hayward and the late Harry Small, of Copmanhurst.

The hotel enjoyed a fair amount of custom till it was burnt down in 1898. It was not rebuilt. A fireplace and a few posts, some twisted iron bedsteads, a china pear tree and the impress of a vegetable garden are all that remain. Mr. Donald Fraser owns the property. It is portion 1 of the parish of Banyabba.

THE OLD TRAVELLERS' REST HOTEL.

THE news that the Travellers' Rest Hotel, on the Grafton-Casino road, has been consumed by fire, calls up recollections of the early days of district settlement. Time was when it was the only roadside inn from Grafton to the Tableland, and thence to Armidale. That was in the early 40's, and when Grafton was only "The Settlement," and Lawrence was only "Lanark Lodge," or to seafaring men "The Devil's Elbow." The old house, built by the late Mr. Walter Hindmarsh, passed away long ago. The one which has done duty so long was built, I think, by Mr. Samuel Davidson, who had, perhaps, the best time of all at the old Travellers' Rest. that was when the rush to Tooloom took place, and gold was being raised in good quantities and a fair number of good claims yielded a golden harvest, one lucky find being the Lady Bowen Nugget, 40oz, so named in honor of the wife of the Governor of Queensland, the finders hailing from that State. Mr. Lewis Jacobs. of Grafton, then on Tooloom, had the honor of handling it. Following Mr. Hindmarsh came James Pringle, that was about 1850. As his name indicated, another Scotchman, and suffering from deafness, he was not very well adapted for a hotel. Mr. Davidson then came to be the landlord, the property being owned by Mr. Clark

Irving. When Tooloom had seen its best, Mr. Davidson removed to Lawrence, and the Rest had many changes of tenants, and competition from The Flying Horse and the Cross Roads, latter kept by Mrs. Feisilthree hotels within a distance of 3 miles, which, as may be imagined, was more than the road could support; especially as the "New Line" from Grafton via Yates' Flat (Alice Town it was named on the maps) diverted a good deal of the trade, and it had come to be a fight between Grafton and Lawrence, in which the late Hon, E. D. Ogilvie threw all his influence to push on the latter place, where he built a second wharf and hotel. The Kest witnessed some wild scenes in early days, and many a fight, when George Wheatley, Mat Donovan and others whose names have faded from memory, travelled the road. One of these had the tragic ending that the man who insisted on fighting received a blow which killed him. His antagonist was arrested, committed for trial, and released on bail. Before the trail came on the latter died also. Another incident may be related connected with the Rest. A well-known identity was old Tom Monk. He had a favorite old horse, a skewbald, and when on the spree the wish was often expressed that when the old horse died that he might die with him. And so it was. One afternoon just after a heavy thunderstorm, Tom Pringle, son of the landlord, had occasion to go a short distance from the Rest, and on the road, almost within sight of the place, lay Tom Monk and his horse, both killed by a large limb from a tree. Revolving years bring many changes, but there are few who of late made the Travellers' Rest their place of call and realised that it was the fourth licensed inn of the whole of these districts from the Tableland to the const .- "Northern Star."

James Pringle 1810-1859 the first in our Pringle family to arrive in Australia in 1843 died at his **property Blake's Creek on the 3rd August 1859**, he was only 48 years old. (His death notice below says 47)!

We know from the detailed newspaper articles on the previous pages that he also owned another farm on **Kings Creek** just out of Lawrence (see the Lawrence maps a few pages below) that he was fairly deaf. **James died from complications associated with asthma.** He and his family were Presbyterians. He is

James Pringle 1810-1859 and Elizabeth Jacks Family

James Pringle, b. 21 Dec 1810 in Newcastle, Northumberland, England, the son of Thomas Pringle Snr. and Elizabeth Mole), he died 3 Aug 1859 in Blakes Creek Grafton, buried 17 Aug 1859 in Blakes Creek, Clarence River.

James married **Elizabeth Jacks** (Jacques or Jackson), on 20 Nov 1830 in St Johns Parish Newcastle, Northumberland Eng. Elizabeth was born in 1808 and died in 1863. (I have no evidence of this date the NSW BDM has an entry for Elizabeth Pringle with a code NV which is for Church of England Camperdown; Newtown)!

They had three children the first two born in England who endured the voyage initially to New Zealand and then to Sydney in 1842/43 they were about 10 and 6 years old at the time.

I. Thomas Pringle was born in. 1832 in Newcastle. Eng. & he died 3 Jun 1882 in Maclean.

Thomas married Elizabeth Lister, on 29 Nov 1858 in Blakes Ck. NSW, b. 1 Nov 1832 in Sherburn. Eng. (daughter of John Lister and Mary Lister (Tyson)), d. 14 Apr 1879 in Maclean. (Remember Mary was the wife of Nicholas Pringle Thomas's uncle & Elizabeth is Nicholas's step daughter).

II. **Jane Isabella Pringle** was born in 1836 in Newcastle Eng and died on 2 Apr 1876 in Maclean.

Jane married **Moses Essex**, married 18 Aug 1856 in Grafton, Moses was born in 1830 and died. 9 May 1902 in Maclean.

III. **Susannah Goulden Pringle** was born 23 Jun 1844 in Seal (Red) Rock Clarence River and died 6 Jul 1930 in Maclean.

Susannah married **James Bathgate** on 30 Mar 1864 in Laurence NSW. James was born. 1832 and died 1888.

Their son Thomas, my GG Grandfather and his descendants make up most of the following Pringle story but a short history of the daughters Jane and Susannah comes first.

Jane Isabella Pringle the 2nd child of James and Elizabeth was born in Newcastle, England in 1836, she travelled with her family to New Zealand in 1842 and then onto Sydney in 1843. As a 6 and 7 year old she spent most of her life on a sailing ship. When she was 8 the family arrived on The Clarence River and the conditions must have been very basic. No house, no school.....

Jane married *Moses Essex* 18 Aug 1856 and she died 2 Apr 1876 during childbirth with her 8th child Isabella Jane Essex.







The story on the right is interesting reading about the history of The Clarence. It again gives an insight into the place where our ancestors grew up.

In the death notice of Moses Essex in 1902 it mentions that he managed Taloumbi a farm on the road from Maclean to Brooms Head. (In an interesting coincidence I have visited Taloumbi on a few occasions because through my father Jack Maloney, his mother was Mary Waugh, I am related to still current Waugh owners of Taloumbi. NM 2024)

Death of Mr. Moses Essex.

On Friday night Mr. Moses Essex fied at his home, Taloumbi, at the age of 72 years. Deceased was one of the oldest pioneers of the Clarence, having been engaged with the first pastoralists on the Upper Clarence over 50 years ago. He settled on Taloumbi in the early sixties, after the station had been taken up by the late Mr. E. M. Ryan. He selected on the station, and remained there. The deceased had an extensive experience of the early days of the district, and with his death another link with the past has been broken. The funeral on Sunday was largely attended. Mr. Dugald Macdonald conducting the arrangements. Deceased leaves several sons in the district.

The Clarence in 1853.

Tue Hon. T. H. Smith, replying to presentations made to him at Grafton recently, said: "In February, 1853, I had to come up in a sailing schooner. The cook on board could hardly speak without using profane words, and our food consisted of salt pork, potatoes and biscuits. After getting into the river after some delay, a fair wind brought us up to Rocky Mouth, that is Maclean. I saw an opening in the scrub, where I was told a boachuilder lived named Chowne. When the vessel turned the band of the river the wind was contrary, so we got into the boat and towed her till opposite Broadwater, where we stuck on a mudbank. Seeing a hot up the Broadwater, we get into the boat and made for it, and found Hoppy Robinson was in charge of a station of Clark Irving's. The only people called Mr. in those days were new chams. There was no money in the district in those days, and Mr. Barnes told me after-wards that Mr. Robinson was working for his rations, with the right of milking as many cows as he liked, from which he made obeese and kept pigs. With a large and industrious family, he managed to save money, so that he bought land and built about the first brick house near or in Grafton at Deep Gully. I think he has left three generations living in Grafton; two I know as industrious and hard working as himself. To return to the trip, the ship floated off next morning, and we came by the Devil's Elbow, that is Lawrence, getting round the Elbow with some difficulty, and then on without any more towing to The Settlement, that is Graiton. Stayed at Sharpe's hotel, on the site the Crown hotel stands on now, and for tea had salt butter on the table that came from Cork. Having to wait to go up country with the postman, next morning did a little exploring, and walked through the scrub so dense that the sun never shone on the ground, I think, just where Prince-street is now, till I got to the rise where Cakes hetel stands now, and hearing men chopping wood, pushed my way with my hands through blady grass that was over my head, and in about 20 yards came upon two men, who had just fallen a big tree. Being a new cham, and afraid of being lost, I retraced my steps to the hotel, and waited for the departure of the up river and Tenterfield mailman, who only went once a fortnight. I settled my account at the hotel with a few sovereigns I. brought up, and got an I(t). I' for is in change, there being no money. The groum of Dr. Dobie had brought three horses down to be shod. I started the same morning, as the mailman went up with him offered to lead one of his horses, and I think gained his approbation, because he found a new chum could ride and lead another horse. That man, Moses Essex, 1 am glad to hear, is still living on the lower river. I should like to see him again."

Susannah Goulden Pringle the 3rd child of **James Pringle** 1810-1859 and **Elizabeth Jacks** 1808-1863 was born on The Clarence 23 Jun1844 (Her baptism certificate says at Seal Rock, but there is no Seal Rock on The Clarence, I suspect it should be Red Rock).

> The families of Jane the Bathgate's and Susan's the Essex's have a greater story to tell but the telling is too much for this family history.

> We continue below with their brother Thomas Pringle who, for a while, becomes the main character the grandfather of varying degrees of greatness of all who follow in the story.

Thomas Pringle *1832-1882*

Thomas Pringle the 1st child of James Pringle and Elizabeth Jacks was born in Newcastle, England in 1832, he travelled with his family to New Zealand in 1842 and then onto Sydney in 1843. He left England as a 10 year old and arrived in Australian just as he turned 12. The trip must have made an impact on him.

Thomas is 12 when the family arrive in Australia. They arrive in Sydney in March 1843 and fairly quickly decide to travel to The Big River, as The Clarence River was then known (see the notes associated with Thomas's father, James).

They arrive in a wilderness with just a few cedar getters and a few squatters bringing in sheep and cattle.

A sister, Susannah, is born in June 1844 and a few months later the family return to Sydney where Susannah is baptised but they return to The Clarence.


It's not quite right to say they returned to Grafton or Lawrence because they didn't really exist yet. But when they came they came with a rush, streets were laid out, building built and by the time Thomas is 20 in 1852 these towns are thriving.

Thomas though lives at Blakes Creek, a farm, and his dad is just about to buy The Travellers Rest Farm and Hotel. (Read the stories about the Travellers Rest a few pages back) about 30 kilometres north of Grafton and Lawrence near where the current Pringle way joins the Casino-Grafton Road.

Thomas gets married in November 1858, he is 26. He married his Uncle Nicholas's step daughter, Elizabeth Lister. Elizabeth had arrived in Australia in July 1857 with her step father Nicholas Pringle and her mother, who was married before she married Nicholas to John Lister who died in 1833. Nicholas and Mary also bought their three children with them; James, Nicholas and Mary. (This relationship is detailed in earlier pages).

Elizabeth Lister is named on the immigration documents as Elizabeth Pringle in 1857. (See *Research Note* 6).

Just 9 months later in Aug 1859 Thomas's father, James, dies at Blakes Creek. This must have been a bitter sweet time in his life, his first child Mary Anne Elizabeth Pringle is also born on 14 Aug 1859 just 11 days after James died.

I am not sure what happened after James died in 1859. In his Will (see it in the section on James Pringle a few pages back) James left his wife, Elizabeth, and annuity to be paid from the profits from Blakes Creek. However within 4 years Thomas has to sell Blakes Creek and he is bankrupt. Insolvency notices appear in the newspapers and the insolvency is filed in the Supreme Courts in Sydney. The creditors are two of Thomas's cousins James and John Pringle, sons of Nicholas, and W Zuill who is probably William Zuill who bought The Travellers Rest from James in 1856.

Mary Pringle, Thomas's aunty bought land in Lawrence in 1861 just after she and Nicholas arrived in Australia. Considering that it was Mary and Nicholas's sons who Thomas also owned money to, it would suggest that they arrived in Australian with some savings.

Woodbine Cottage (I suspect on Kings Creek Road) Mary Pringle (Lister) died there in 1871 and so does her daughter, Elizabeth (Thomas's wife) in 1879.

After the debts and the insolvency Thomas Pringle recovers, maybe he and his wife are left land, they must have been left Woodbine Cottage when Nicholas and Mary died in 1870 and 1871.

In 1871 the sons of Nicholas Pringle sell their possessions around Lawrence, and one of them, John, places an advertisement saying he selling his goods which are at Woodbine Cottage. They along with their sister, Mary all leave The Clarence and move to Old the brothers to Mossman.

This property may have been land along Kings Creek or further along near King's Island. Old maps of Lawrence show several blocks and farms owned by Pringles. In any event one of




Thomas and his two sisters are the only Pringles left in Lawrence region

He is taking an interest in his community, in 1872 and on a few occasions he is a publicised supporter of T. Baldwin as the local member for the NSW Parliament (Remember this is before there is an Australian Government).

In 1873 Thomas is upset about people using a road through his farm. It is at near Kings Creek. He runs this advertisement a few times in the Clarence and Richmond Examiner, the local paper in Grafton.



By 1874 he on the Public School Board. He does have 8 children and another will be born in 1876. He's thinking about their futures.



Elizabeth Lister 01 Nov 1832-14 Apr 1879

By 1879 Elizabeth Pringle (Lister) is 46. Her mother Mary Tyson had married John (his name may have been Thomas) Lister in 1826 in Durham, England and had two children: Thomas in 1827 and Elisabeth in 1832. John died in 1833 and in 1834 Mary Lister married Nicholas Pringle.

In 1841 Elizabeth was living with her mother, brother step father. Mary and Nicholas also had 3 more children: James (1836), Nicholas jnr (1839) and Elizabeth (this is Elizabeth Pringle the Elizabeth here in Lawrence was known as Elizabeth Lister).

However by the 1851 Census in England Elizabeth Pringle born in 1841 has died, 2 more children have been born, John (1844) and Mary (1846). And Elizabeth is living in a village no longer at home but with another family as their live-in "House Servant". Her brother has



probably already emigrated to NSW.

In 1857 Elizabeth comes to Australia with her mother and step father, Nicholas and their family and she marries Thomas in 1858 at Blake's Creek

Thomas and Elizabeth Pringle in the 18 years after they marry in 1858 have 9 children. The children all grow up around Lawrence, however, how they grow up where and with whom I don't know because Thomas's wife Elizabeth Lister dies on 14 April 1879 she is only 46. Her youngest child Eva is only 2 years old.

Thomas died on 3rd June **1882**. Five of his nine children are under 15 years of age. The youngest Eva is taken by her oldest sister Mary who gets married just a few weeks later in Aug 1882. What happens to the others? I don't know.

Henry is 7, George is 9, Annie is 12, and **Robert is 15**. Mary Annie, the eldest, is 23, James is 21, Thomas Lister is 19 and John is 17.

It must have been a chaotic time. The death certificates that follow detail the facts.

Note the **headstone** of **Thomas** and **Elizabeth** in *Maclean Cemetery* is quite impressive and in the same style as Thomas's brother **Nicholas** and Elizabeth's mother **Mary** Lister (Tyson). **Thomas and Elizabeth's great-great grandson, Bruce Lyons is in the photo** taken in 2024

Note: The date of death of Thomas on the headstone is 1881. It should be 1882.

Information in the notice below confirms details about Thomas and his father James.



Elizabeth dies at their farm just outside Lawrence NSW.


She died of "Consumption", today we call it Tuberculosis, a common cause of death before antibiotics.

Her father is listed as Thomas Lister but I have him as John. The records are not clear. Her mother is Mary Tyson (Tyson was her maiden name before she married the first time, she later married Nicholas Pringle.)

Elizabeth's religion is Church of England and she was born in York, England.

She had been in Australia since 1857 so about 21 years.

This document confirms the place of marriage as Blake's Creek and that she has 9 children – 6 males and 3 females all living.

What caused his death I can't read but he had it for 8 days. Thomas was 49 years old.

Her father is listed as James Pringle and his mother Elizabeth Jacks.

His religion is Church of England and he was born in Newcastle upon Tyne, England.

The place of marriage as Blake's Creek and his wife is Elizabeth Lister.

All of his 9 children are clearly listed along with their age in 1882. The last on that list is (not so clear) Eva and she would have been 6 years old. Some of the text is difficult to read, but the key elements can be interpreted except for the cause of death, which in his death notice in the newspaper reads "after a long and painful illness".

Note the year of his death 1882 is taken from this registration and the newspaper death notice because the date on his headstone is 1881.



The problem with this code is pretty obvious some people should be a combination of colours. I have tended to use it as I have on the next few pages to clarify the links to and emphasise where the Pringles and Ensbys collide and where the other families link in and out.

The children of Thomas Pringle 1832-1882 and Elizabeth Lister 1832-1879

1. Mary Annie Elizabeth Pringle was born 14 August 1859 at Blakes Creek. The family are still living on James Pringle's farm but **James**, her grandfather, has died some 11 days earlier.



This birth certificate is easy to read so no interpretation needed. Note that her mother Elizabeth and her grandmother Mary Lister (Tyson) are listed as witnesses to the birth.


A notice in the Grafton Examiner.... in September 1879 refers to an 1860 Deeds of Grant in the name of Mary Ann Elizabeth Pringle, 2 lots. In 1880 there is a newspaper notice indicating that the fees have been paid and the deeds can be pickup at the Lands Office in Grafton. Mary Annie's mother and/or father must have applied for this land grant a few months after Mary Annie was born.

1860, 10th September, Mary Ann Elizabeth Pringle, Blake's Creek, 2 lots, 2 roods each, county of Clarence, parish of Lawrence.

On the map the 3 blocks highlighted in yellow are owned by Pringles. The block on the left is J. Pringle jnr (there are few J Pringles at the time but the most likely is John the son of Nicholas who sold up all his assets and moved to N Qld in 1871). This farm was sold to The Dobbin family in 1871

The top on the right is Nicholas Pringle and the name below it is Mary Pringle jnr. This seems the most likely block, but it could be Nicholas Pringle's daughter, Mary, just as well.

Mary Annie Elizabeth Pringle I often refer to her by her 4 word name so you can more easily identify her, She is responsible for chaos ahead with family links to the Dobbin, Ensby and Cavanough families.



Mary Annie Elizabeth Pringle and Charles Sydney Henry Dobbin have 8 children and 2 of these children (Sarah and Lawrence) marry into the Ensby line and the Dobbin, Cavanough and Sutherland families. (Yes, Mary Annie has 8 children & she bought up her youngest sister Eva).

- **2. James Pringle** (the 2nd child of **Thomas Pringle** 1832-1882 and **Elizabeth Lister** 1832-1879) was born in 1861 and died in Queensland 2nd July 1931 and that is the extent of what I have on James. With no middle name that I can find it is hard track him.
- **3. Thomas Lister Pringle** was born 4th Oct 1863 and died 10th Jan 1943 he married in 1887 to *Esther Eddleston* who was born in 1869 and died in 1962.

Thomas's middle name of Lister signifies his mother's intent to keep her father's family name within the family. (The Birth Certificate below confirms the details about Thomas Lister Pringle and his older siblings).

4. John Nicholas Pringle (the 4th child of **Thomas Pringle** *1832-1882* and **Elizabeth Lister** *1832-1879*) John was born in 1865 at Blakes Ck, and he died on 26 July 1946 in Brisbane. He married *Mary Margaret Winifred Phillips*, he married on 25 Aug 1898 in Queensland, she was born in. 1876 and died in 1910.

John like his brother seems to be named after some of his mother's family. Her step father was Nicholas Pringle (Thomas's uncle) and her father was John (although it may have been Thomas).

The ceremony took place at the home of Mr. R. D. Bliss, uncle of the bride.



Researching family history often leads to contact with branches of the family that have been "lost" the ones you didn't know about and with so many siblings in the generation of my great grandparents – Robert has 8 brothers and sisters and his wife Harriet Ensby has 13 siblings – the extended family becomes hundreds of people in those 3 or 4 generations. In the case of **George Tyson Pringle** his grandson **Tony Gallwey** has provided me with information and better still a visit. Tony is my 2nd cousin one removed and that provides an opportunity to explain one of these cousin relationships.

George Tyson Pringle was born in 1872 and was 7 years old when his mother died in 1879 and then when his father, Thomas, died in 1882 he was only 10 years old. There is no information about what happened to him or his brothers and sisters the eldest, Mary, married in 1882 and took the youngest, Eva to live with her and maybe she took all 5 (Robert 14, Annie 12, George 10, Henry 8 and Eva 6) of her youngest siblings to live with her and her husband. In any case we know very little about what happened to George. But his grandson Tony says his mum, Ida, said that George worked on the Kuranda Rail Project (Cairns to Kuranda) which was built between 1886 and 1891, so he left The Clarence as a young lad of when was between 14 and 17. It's possible he heard about jobs in north Qld from his relatives, the children of his father's uncle, Nicholas, who moved to Bundaberg in 1870/71 and then to Mossman in the 1880's.

The following information comes from Tony Gallwey


It wasn't until I went through the papers my mother had given me that I found out who George's parents were and where he was born in 1872. I think I have a couple of photos of George and I am not sure why he moved to Qld but my Mother told me that he had worked on the Kuranda rail project sometime as a young man or lad between 1886 and 1891 and then supposedly moved to the Mossman area after that. I am not sure what he did there initially but he eventually owned a cane farm in the Whyanbeel district north of Mossman.

George was 32 when he married Kate Bliss aged 20 in 1905

I don't know of a Nicholas Pringle but there was another Pringle family in the Mossman area and the only one I remembered and met when I was fairly young was a Tom Pringle (and also a brother I believe) who was about the same age as my mother and whose family had a cane farm at Mossman South. Tom at some stage had or worked on a farm in Kenya in Africa but he returned to Mossman at the time when the Mau Mau terrorists were rampant over there.*

I remember one of my sisters (Robin) and I were sent in the December school holidays for a couple of weeks in the early 1950's to Uncle Bill's (wife Eva) farm at Whyanbeel just north of Mossman because Robin and I were about the same ages of our cousins Beryl and Leslie. George was still alive at that stage and used to walk from the old family farm house a short distance from Bill's house every day for breakfast, lunch and dinner. I don't recall very much interaction with Poppa but I do remember him smoking cigarettes of medicinal tobacco.

* Tony's recollection of this having meet Tom and his brother (probably Harry) who are the grandsons of Nicholas Pringle confirms the information about that line of the family. (Nicholas was the older brother of James who came to Australia in 1857 and 1843 respectively. They both originally settled in Lawrence in Northern NSW). NM

Witness's mother died about four years ago and since then his father had never seemed to recover from the shock. He always seemed to be depressed and never had much to say. He worked reason-ably hard and did general work on the

Witness said that when he returned to the house for lunch on May 7 his wife told him that his two sisters had gone to look for their father, as he had not come in to lunch. Witness rode up the paddock in the di-rection of where the girls had gone. He met them about 200 yards from the house, and they told him of see-ing their father's body suspended by a rope from a tree further up the

"WORRIED MORE AND MORE."
"I galloped up and caught hold of his wrist," witness said. "He was then cold and, in my opinion, was quite dead. I tried to release him, but seemed powerless from the shock. I got back on the horse and galloped to Kelly's place, from where I 'phoned the police. I did not go back to where my father was. I feel certain that had I released him when I first tried he would still have had no hope of being brought back to life. We were reing brought back to life. We were to have left the farm at the end of this month. My father seemed to be worried more and more during the last few weeks, but not at any time did he say anything that would indi-cate his intention of taking his

They were not financially embar-rassed, and owed nothing that they culd not pay, witness continued. His father's life was not insured at the time of his death.

It was at a spot used to cut wood. where he Fringle said she last saw her father alive at 11 a.m., when he was on the back verandah of the house, while Doris Pringle said she last saw him alive in the kitchen at 9.30 a.m. when he had a drink of water.

Sergeant Griffith stated that in re spense to a telephone message he proceeded to Eungella. On arrival at Kelly's farm he went up a grass paddock for about half a mile from the residence occupied by the family and there saw the body of decrased hanging from the limbs of a tree by a rope around his neck. The body was at once lowered to the ground and examined. It was cold, and death apparently had taken place about one to two hours prior to witness seeing the body.

Witness added that there were no suspicious circumstances or any cause to suspect foul play. The circum-stances indicated that the deceased had stood upon a stump beside tree whilst he placed the rope around his neck and fastened it to the limbs of the tree. He had then stepped off the stump, leaving himself hangthen stepped ing by the neck. The body was re-moved to the residence occupied by the deceased and his family.

Henry Ernest Pringle committed suicide in 1938 the story on the previous page from the Daily News Murwillumbah explains the circumstances. The obituary below is that of Martha, Henry's wife who died 4 years earlier in 1934.

Henry Ernest Pringle was only 4 when his mother died and only 8 when his father died. This may have contributed to his mental state when his wife died a few years before he committed suicide

The family farmed at South Murwillumbah fer two years and then removed to Eungella, in which district the Pringle home is now situated.

Children of the late Mrs. Pringle are: Mrs. Norman Stone (Brisbaue), liam, Doris, Edna and Mavis Pringle (Eungella). Mrs. T. Jones (Brisbane) and Miss Grace Alvina Goodrich (Murw'llumbah) are sisters, and Ernest Alfred Bland Goodrich (Ky ogle), Arthur Robert Goodrich (Murwillumbah), Harold Seymour Goodrich Harvey Bland (Sydney), Goodriel Cedric (Murwillumbah). Lawrence Goodrich (Brisbane) and Sergeant William Arthur Goodrich (Cunnamulla, Q'ld.) are brothers. Two brothers were ki'led in the Great War, Stanley Pozicres in 1916, and Oswald at Bullecourt in 1917.

The late Mrs. Pringle had been ailing for approximately two years, and she had been an inmate of a Murwillumbah hospital at various periods last Pix months.

The funeral will take place to-day the cortege leaving All Saints' Church of England, Murwillumbah, at 11.45

The marriage was solemnised at All Saints' Church of England, Murwillumbah, Violet Clarinda, third of daughter of Mr. and Mrs. G. Anderson, of Eungella, to William Henry only son of Mr. W. E. Pringle and the late Mrs. Pringle, of Eungella. The Rev. G. E. Ure officiated at the ceremony and Mrs. F. C. Brown, sister of the bride, presided at the o.s.

The bride entered the church on the arm of her father to the strains of "The Voice That Breathed O'er Eden." She chose a frock of white cloque material, featuring a cowl neck and train and wore an embroidered veil with a halo of pleated tulle and orange blossoms. The veil was lent by Mrs. R. Perkins, of Tyalgum. She carried a bouquet of frangipani and delphiniums tied with white ribbon streamers and a lucky horse shoe.

The bride was attended by her sister, Alice, and Miss Mavis Pringle, sister of the bridegroom, who were frocked alike in pale blue flat crepe, with navy trimmings. They wore pale blue tulle shoulder-length veils, and carried bouquets of roses and gerberas.

9. Eva Elizabeth Pringle, (the 9th and last child of **Thomas Pringle** *1832-1882* and **Elizabeth Lister** *1832-1879*) Eva was born in 1876, d. 3 Jul 1947 in Qld – *(Old BDM 1947/C/3755)* .

It seems Eva did not marry. She was the youngest of her generation. The granddaughter of James Pringle, who was the first Pringle in our line of the Pringle family to come to Australia in 1843, the daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth who were both dead before she turned six.

Eva lived with her eldest sister Mary (Mary Annie Elizabeth Pringle), who married *Charles Sydney Henry Dobbin*, after her father died in 1882

She grew up with the 8 children that Mary and Charles later had. And remember that Eva was the 9th child of Thomas and Elizabeth.

Eva had 8 siblings, 10 cousins and later 33 nephews and nieces (that we know of) and there are her first cousins (once removed) and second cousins related from Nicholas Pringle. The Pringle clan by 1900 is probably approaching 100 descendants.

In the next section we concentrate on the family of Robert Arthur Pringle and his wife Harriet Ensby. The Pringle, Ensby/Clark, Dobbin, Sutherland, Cavanough and Bradfield family links will have us crossing back into the siblings of Robert and especially his sister *Mary Annie Elizabeth Pringle*.

Robert Arthur Pringle 1867-1948

Robert Arthur Pringle was born in 1867 - the **5th** child of **Thomas Pringle** 1832-1882 and **Elizabeth Lister** 1832-1879 - he was one of nine children.

Robert who I have been referring to for sometime is about to take centre stage; **the grandson of James Pringle**, who was the first in our line of Pringles to come to Australia in 1843. Robert's life sees massive change from 1867 horse and cart lifestyle, to motor cars and electricity by the time he died in 1948. He is the grandfather of my mother, Ivy Bradfield, so there are firsthand accounts of his life. There are multiple photos of him and they are not just portrait studio and staged photos but everyday life photos. He is both a part of the remote past, a past we barely understand anymore and he is part of the world we live in.

He is also a point in this story where I concentrate the family history into "his" line of the genealogy tree, well almost. **Robert Pringle marries Harriet Ensby** but the Ensby and Pringles have links already and are about to form more via the Dobbin, Essex, Cavanough and Sutherland families. *It makes it interesting and it makes it awfully confusing*

Robert is 12 when his mother dies; he is 15 when his father dies. He is the middle child with 3 older brothers and an older sister, and 2 younger brothers and 2 younger sisters. The youngest, Eva, goes to her sister, Mary Annie Elizabeth, who is married a few weeks after their father died.

Ox Thursday morning last a crane, used for lifting timber at Murray Brothers' saw-mills, on the Chatsworth-Woodburn road, gave way, and a falling batten struck an employee named Robert Pringle on the head, inflicting a severe scalp wound fully two inches in length. By the time Dr. J. Jarvie Hood could arrive there the unfortunate fellow had lost a great deal of blood. He was unconscious for a time after the accident, but gradually came round. It cannot yet be ascertained if his skull is fractured. He has been removed to the L.C. Hospital.

By 1900, Robert is 33 and has 4 children.

In 1905 Harriet buys land at Murrayville and Robert buys a farm in Tullymorgan.

The Murray Brothers Sawmill at Murrayville closed down sometime between 1904 and

Robert seems to have got work during the next few years with the Murray Bros in their sawmilling operations. He works for them at Rappville and when they opened their mill at Murrayville in 1892/93 he became a head "benchman" he also got married in 1892 to Harriet (Minnie) Ensby.

In 1893 Robert has a bad accident at work.

1908. Although it was a massive Mill others opened in Maclean and the railway line into Grafton was a major blow. They probably moved much of their equipment to Rappville. Robert seems to have moved on to a farm at Tullymorgan early in the 1900's. He is well established there by 1910, growing commercial quantities of corn and his house is fully complete and staging birthday parties in 1911 and by then they have 6 children.

Tullymorgan in the early 1900's was a place of seemingly endless potential a butter factory had been built and land grants were opening up more and more land. *Pat Bradfield* and the *Sutherland Brothers* were getting going as well.


TULLYMORGAN looms large in the Pringle family. The other ancestors the; Sutherlands, Ensbys, Bradfields, Cavanoughs and Dobbins all lived in Tullymorgan.

It was called The Tullymorgan Estate, a part of a massive cattle property and before that the land that two squatters: Tully and Morgan claimed. 

When the punt was half way across something frightened ulky horse, and it backed the sulky on to the cart horse. Before the latter could be checked it backed cart through the fastened gate at the rear of the punt and overbalanced into the river. Mr. Pringle's loss pretty severe as he valued the horse alone at £50.

Mr. Robert Pringle, who selected land at Tullymorgan in 1905, is leaving the district and intends settling near Sydney. He has disposed of his property and will live in retirement. During his 29 years residence at Tullymorgan, Mr. Pringle grew some record crops of beans, neas and tomatoes, one year clearing £900 from his bean crop. He also grew sugar cane for the C.S.R. Company and obtained some good crops. One year the 12 months cane, when cut, tested 17 p.o.c s.

Late 1930's and early 1940's.

Robert and Harriet move to Bald Hills and either buy or startup a dairy farm. But a drought causes chaos and investments from the sale of the farm at Tullymorgan don not do well. In 1941/42 Harriet is stricken with rheumatism or arthritis and is in a wheelchair most of the time. Her son Tom & George move to Bald Hills to help out. The son of Harriet's sister, Lena, Claude also comes with them. He is the best mate of George, he Georges nephew but they are the same age, both born in 1915. (See note in George Hamilton Pringle in later pages)

Robert Arthur Pringle is more than an innovative and successful farmer, he is the kid who lost both his parent before he was 16, who survived a serious head accident in 1893 when he was 26. With his wife, Harriet Ensby, they raised and cared for 8 children.

How well did he do? Well in 1914 he gave his daughter Lena house in Lawrence as a wedding present.

In 1933 Robert, Harriet and I assume Edna went to Sydney for Harriet to get medical treatment.







Mrs. R. Pringle, formerly of Tullymorgan and now of Brisbane, is on a visit to her daughter, Mrs. G. Eagleton. of Church street, Maclean.

The Ensby/Clark name issue is back. In the first section of this book I explain in some detail the confusion of the use of the surname Clark by many of the Ensby/Ensbey family.

Harriet and Robert Arthur Pringle are married on February 28th 1892 and it is a **double wedding**, her brother David Ensbey marries Catherine (Kate) McClymont, the ceremony and reception are held at the home of his father, Charles Ensby at Broadwater near Tullymorgan

When Harriet gets married to Robert Arthur Pringle in 1892 her name is **Harriet Ensby**. (See NSW BDM registration listing below). HOWEVER in 1905 when 4 of the children are baptized in Casino she uses the name **Harriet Clark**. (See below for Baptism transcript 1905).

The death occurred at Kyogle on Thursday night of Mrs. Pringle, wife of Mr. Robert Pringle. Mrs. Pringle, who was 71 years of age, was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. Clark, former residents of the Lawrence district and on her marriage lived at Murrayville, where her husband was employed by Messrs. Murray and Co., sawmillers. In 1900 Mr. Pringle selected land at Murrayville and lived there until about 10 years ago when they sold out and went to live in Kyogle. The late Mrs. Pringle had been ailing for some considerable time. The funeral took place at Kyogle on Friday. The deceased is survived by her husband and a grown-up family. Mrs. Geo. Mac Eagleton, of Maclean, is a daughter.

Harriet Ensby's death notice from the Grafton Daily Examiner on Saturday 21st August 1943

She is described by her married name as Harriet Pringle but after that the notice names her parents as Clark and this seems a common family practice at the time of suggesting that Charles and Harriett her parents had the surname Clark but that is not reflected in the notices when they died in 1906 and 1918 they were known then as Ensbey! So the name chaos continues in this example.

The notice is also confusing when it says that Harriet and Robert went to live in Kyogle. That is not mentioned anywhere else and is not in any family history stories. The family tradition says she was visiting her daughter, Lena who was in Kyogle another daughter, Alice, is mentioned in the notice correctly as Mrs. Geo Mac Eagleton as living in Maclean.

In the preface to this book I mention Harriet being buried in Kyogle. The family verbal stories were all consistent that Harriet died in Kyogle as this newspaper notice confirms and I am quite sure that I saw her grave in Kyogle in the 1970's.

HOWEVER there is absolutely no evidence for that recollection. There is no record of Harriet being buried in Kyogle Cemetery.

1948 - Robert Arthur Pringle in February is in hospital in Maclean. The article on the right include a list of people have visited him.

Mr. and Mrs. L. Sutherland, I'm not sure who they are because two of his daughters married a "Sutherland" but both of their first names started with an A.

Mrs H Cavanough is Hannah, his wife's sister, Miss Doris, is Doris Cavanough is Hannah's daughter

Pam is living with Hannah and she is an adopted daughter of Hannah's sister Alice's son, Stan, who died in 1946. Pam would have only been 4 years old at the time.

Mrs. Bradfield is Annie, Robert's daughter and Beryl and Rita are his granddaughters. Beryl was 17 and Rita 11.

The "At Yamba" which is in the same paragraph is confusing but they are all friends and relatives of Robert as well.

Mr. and Mrs. J. M. Johnston and family, who spent the vacation at Taree and Harrington, have returned home.

Miss Dulcie Ensbey spent part of her school holidays with her aunt at Cowper.

Misses Beryl and Dorothy I) adfield have returned home after visiting Mr. and Mrs. Stan Moss and family at Inverell.

Mr. Horace Bradfield gained an A1 pass in his examination for employment at the White Bay Power Station, and has commenced duty there.

30th Sept 1948 Robert Arthur Pringle dies in Tullymorgan. He had been staying with his daughter Annie and her husband Pat Bradfield for some time. I expect Robert and Pat Bradfield had been friends before Pat married his daughter in 1919. They were both farming at Tullymorgan and both Robert and his wife, Harriet, visited and stayed with Pat and Annie after they moved to Brisbane in 1934. Pat and Robert were nearly the same age; Pat (1870) was just 3 years younger than Robert (1867).

In the obituary of Robert, on the right, like all these newspaper notices there is some truth and some misleading points. Generally it is pretty good. In the point about the Sawmill: Robert left working there in 1905 but Murray, one of the owners, didn't die until 1912 when he drowned in a shipping accident on the Tweed Bar.

The large table in the dining room at the home of Pat and Annie's in Tullymorgan was made from wood cut by Robert when he worked at the Murray Sawmill.

OBITUARY

ROBERT A. PRINGLE.

The death occurred suddenly at the home of his son-in-law on Thursday af ernoon of Mr. R. A. Pringle, one of the best known and most respected citizens of Tullymorgan.

Mr. Pringle was born at Lawrence 81 years ago, and as a young man worked in the sawmill at Rappville. Later he was head benchman at Murray's mill, at the then thriving little township of Murrayville.

After the death of Mr. Murray, Mr. Pringle selected at Tullymorgan, and was one of the early pioneers of the area, for which he had, during his lifetime, predicted a great future. Some years ago he disposed of his property at Tullymorgan and went to live in Brisbane, where he conducted a milk vendor's business. About three years ago, after his health began to fail, he returned to Tullymorgan to live with his daughter, Mrs. P. Bradfield.

Mr. Pringle's wife predeceased him about four years ago, and he is survived by a grown up family—Mrs. P. Bradfield, Tullymorgan; Mrs. H. Sutherland, Marrickville; Miss E. Pringle, Newcastle Mrs. M. Eagleton, Maclean; Mrs. A. Sutherland, Brisbane; Mr. R. Pringle, Tweed River; Mr. T. Pringle, Sandgate; Mr. G. Pringle, Coff's Harbour.

The service at the Maclean C. of E. was conducted by Rev. Canon Alexander, who also officiated at the graveside.

Robert Pringle (1867-1948) and **Harriet Ensby** (1871-1943) married on 23 February 1892

Annie Ernestine Pringle 1893-1950

1. Annie Ernestine Pringle the eldest child of Robert Arthur Pringle and Harriet Ensby was born on the 28th September 1893; new siblings kept arriving very 2 or 3 years and by late 1907 she had two sisters and two brothers. The family by then had moved from Murrayville (near present day Harwood) to Tullymorgan and her father was becoming a successful farmer. Annie is tall maybe 5' 9" and she had long dark red hair and she was confident and sociable.



Just a few days before Annie turned 16 in 1909 she gave birth to a daughter, Gladys, on 20th September 1909. The father is not known! Even the record at the Maclean Court House when the birth was registered lists the father as unknown.

In February 1910 Annie gets another brother, Thomas, and she also has her own 5 month old daughter. Her life must have been thrown into chaos but the family seems to have just thrived. Her parents throw dinner parties, and her father continues to add more farms and experiment with new crops. By October 1915 Annie has seven brothers and sisters and her daughter is six.

Pat Bradfield had a farm in Tullymorgan from around the same time as the Pringles. Pat's farm was on the flat land just below the Robert Pringle's farm and Pat attended functions at the Pringle home, he was of a similar age to Robert Pringle, just 3 years younger. Along with Angus Sutherland, who had a farm adjoining Pats', the three of them were enterprising

and innovative farmers who must had had much in common. Pats sometime in 1917/18 he started a romantic relationship with Annie. She was 25 with an eight year old child and Pat was 48.

Annie and Pat marry out of some necessity in early August 1919 and seven months later their first child, Ivy, is born. The marriage by all accounts is a raging success another eight children followed. Pat and Annie have a home that is a social centre at Tullymorgan; church services (Anglican) on a number of occasions, guests come and go, they have a tennis court and completions between Lawrence, Ulmarra, Maclean, Ashby.... are reported in the social columns. Annie caters for these competitions and many attending stay-over and sleep on the veranda. The house has rose and lily gardens.

When Pat and Annie start married life Gladys comes with Annie. The extended Pringle family always seem welcome at the Bradfield home; when Gladys marries her family visit Tullymorgan and Pat even after Annie dies. When Annie's parents move to Brisbane they visit Tullymorgan and stay with Pat and Annie.

The 1920's was a boom time in Tullymorgan; Pat cleared his land, increased his dairy herd, grew corn, and improved his pasture. He donated land for the construction of the Tullymorgan School.

The family increased and by the end of 1929 Pat and Annie had 6 kids. Annie's parents own a car and the phone is connected in 1925 the same year their daughter, Dorothy (Snowy) is born and she one day becomes the switchboard operator who connects the calls at the Tullymorgan Telegraphic Office just a few hundred metres (they were yards in those days) down the road.

From late 1947 Annie is in and out of hospital with gall stones and in 1949 they operate and complications, no doubt infection, from that operation led to her death on the 9th December 1950. She was only 57. This must have been an unexpected circumstance for her husband Patrick Bradfield, he had just turned 80. Rita his youngest child was 13.

Ashby Ferry Has Thrilling Voyage On The Clarence

MACLEAN, Tues .- On a racing tide the Ashby ferry punt sailed from the crossing at Maclean to a point in the South Arm near the McFarlane bridge. Passengers in three cars, a drover and the ferryman were helpless when the wire rope parted and the anchor was lost.

THE ferry was crocsing to Maclean 10.15 this at morning.

Aboard mere cors with 15 recorners from Tullymorean on their way to attend the funeral of Mrs. Bradfield.

Mr. Fred Webber was crossing with a cow.

Mr. H. Paine was in charge of the ferry.

When the wire rone snapped,

the anchor was dropped. The chain broke, however, and the "pirk" was lost. The tide was flowing strongly.

The craft gathered speed and made a rapid passage to the mouth of the South Arm.

Comes To Rest

The current carried her away from the channel, and she came to rest on a shelf of rock about 50 feet from the eastern bank and (100 feet from McFarlane

Fishing launches were hailed,

and the bassengers were taken to the showground wharf.

Mr. Webber remained aboard quite unperturbed, and could be seen reading the "Daily Examiner."

Launch To Rescue

The shire silp staff were at Cowper with the powerful launch Dallas, making some ad-justments to the ferry.

They were immediately sum-moned to Marlean, and made a moned to Marlean, and made a quick trin. Securing a heavy anchor from the slip, they dropped it on rocks at the edge of the channel and took a line by pulling boat to the ferry punt. When a stout rope was secured to the anchor, a team aboard the ferry heaved with success, aided by the rising tide.

Once in the channel the launch took the punt in tow and placed her in position at the Maclean approach to permit the cars to leave.


A new rope was fixed in posi-tion late in the afternoon, and the ferry service resumed.



A Letter from Annie Bradfield (Pringle) 1950

The note below is the last page (written on the back of page 3) of a letter sent by Annie to her daughter **Gladys** in 1950. I have dated the letter by the following references: Ivy had her second child, John, on June 9th 1950 and she mentions that her daughter Snow went to Murwillumbah to help Ivy at the time and has returned. She later mentions that **Pat**, her husband, will be 80 in November. Annie also mentions that it was not a very cold winter and spring has arrived so the letter was written in August or September 1950.

Annie died on December 9th 1950.



The letter ends with some slightly squashed in text at the end of page 3 and the above is the sign-off on the back of that page.

Horace is Annie's son who worked at the White Bay Power Station in Sydney.

John Patrick is the son of her daughter Ivy and Ivy married Jack Maloney John born 9th June 1950 and who died 14th May 2021 and Bruce who is mentioned as 8 years old was born in 1942.

Rob is her son Robert later better known as Robbie

Gladys (her name is pronounced with the s included) **Pringle** married Alf Rowles on 6th January 1932 and they moved, the story says Tully River, but after a short while they moved to Edmonton, just a few kilometres west of Cairns where Alf parents had moved to sometime previously.

The wedding article on the right says the bride was "given away by her father" and that is assumed to be in this instance **Pat Bradfield**. There is no evidence as to who Gladys's father was and it does not seem likely that it was Pat. Gladys was born in 1909 and her mother Annie was still 15 when Gladys was born but it was another 10 years before Pat and Annie married and although Gladys went to live with them Pat did not adopt her nor did she use the Bradfield name.

Edna "who attended the bride" and **Tom** "who carried the duties of best man" were both younger than Gladys but were her aunty and uncle.



2. Harriet Eileen (Lena) May Pringle the 2nd child of Robert Arthur Pringle and Harriet Ensby

was born in 1895 at Murrayville, near the sawmill where her father worked. Lena married *Angus ARTHUR James Sutherland* on 26th August 1914. It was the first wedding to take place at Tullymorgan and it was at the home of Lena's parents Robert & Harriet Pringle – *See the article from the Clarence and Richmond Examiner in* 1914.

Lena and Arthur lived in Maclean where their first five children were born. They were living Kyogle by 1932 – see article below that reports" residing in Kyogle.... underwent an appendix operation. Arthur died in Kyogle in 1941.

Lena's mother, Harriet, was visiting her when she died in Kyogle in 1943.

Lena died in 1970 in Camden near Sydney.

Lena's husband, Angus, was known as Arthur, his father also named Angus and was a best friend and business partner of Patrick Bradfield who married Lena's sister Annie. The Pringle, Ensby/Clarke Bradfield and Sutherland family links are explained in *Research Note 4*.

nd Richmond Examiner (Grafton, NSW: 1889 - 1915) / Thu 3 Sep 1914

The contracting parties were Hiss Harriet (Lena) Pringle, second daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. A. Pringle, of Tullymorgan, and Mr. Angus Arthur Sutherland, second son of Mr. and Mrs. A. Sutherland, also of Tullymorgan, The ceremony was performed by the Rev. A. Martin, of Maclean. The bride was dressed in a pailette silk dress trimmed with shadow lace, beads and orange blossoms, with overdress of shadow lace, shoes to match. wreath and veil, and also wore the usual carried a beautiful bouquet of asparagus ferns, arum tilies, and artificial flowers. Miss Lizzie Pringle, sister of the bride, acted as bridesmaid, and was dressed in white embroidery dress with lace trimmings and floral ribbon sash, lace hat to match. effrried a bouquet of ferns, sweet peas, daffobrother of the bridegroom, acted as best man. The wedding breakfast was partaken at the residence of the bride's parents. The wedresidence of the bride's parents. The wed-ding presents were numerous and costly. The bride's father presented his daughter with a valuable house and land situated at Lawrence. The newly-married couple will make their home at Tullymorgan.



It gets confusing from the start because the nephews and nieces refer to her as Eily Clark



mother, Harriet (Minnie) Ensby. (Harriet & Sarah are two of 14 siblings) See <u>Research Note 1</u> for details about the Ensby descendants. Both Harriet and Sarah are daughters of Charles Ensby and Harriett Garrett.

Remember Harriett with the curious hat back near the beginning of the book? Well Bob and Eily are 1st cousins. Eily is Bob's mother's niece.

Bob Pringle and the Eily Hannah/Clark/Ensby Connection

Bob Pringle marries **Eily Hannah**, in **1928** in Lawrence NSW; she was born in 1903 and she died on 29 June 1961 at Tweed Heads NSW.



Bob and **Eily** marry on 25th August 1928 and have three children. The eldest is Marcia born 18th June 1925. Yes that is three years before they get married. Marcia has the surname Hannah. The next two Beryl Elain (Elaine) and Allan have the surname Pringle but family rumour has it that Bob is the father of Marcia.

Robert (Bob) Richard John Pringle and his wife, *Harriet Eileen Eily Hannah* are in a couple of photos with Bob's parents that seem to have been taken at events in Brisbane in the late 1930's/ to early 1940's. (Larger copies of these photos are in an earlier section of this book)



Bob & Eily moved from Maclean and for some time worked on a farm in Murwillumbah, in 1946 their daughter Marcia was married in Murwillumbah. They obviously had a social life with Bob's parents in Brisbane in the late 1930's as well. In notes* from Bob and Eliy's granddaughter, Sue, she mentions her dad, Allan, looking after Bob and Bob's house on the Gold Coast being very modest. So it seems the wealth generated by Robert Arthur Pringle on the farms at Tullymorgan did not filter down to the next generation.

^{*} The notes are in a few pages under the section on Bob & Eily's son, Allan.

Some personal items that belonged to **Bob Pringle** are kept by his granddaughter Sue Howkins and they include:

1. A nomination form for a greyhound. Yes he raced dogs at tracks around Brisbane. This entry is for a dog named Susan's View in 1970.



2. A receipt for household furniture. The date on the receipt is Aug 17th 1928, just 8 days before Bob & Harriet Eileen Hannah (Eily Clark) were married. EG Powell were furniture manufacturers and had a very large store in Grafton. The sideboard is still in excellent condition today (2024), taken care of by Bob's granddaughter Sue Howkins. It cost £4 12s 6d about one week's wages in 1928.





The reverse of Robert (Bob) Pringle and Harriet Eileen (Eily) Hannah marriage certificate in 1928 includes the details that Bob was born in Murrayville in 1900, where his father was workings at the Murray's Sawmill.

In the bottom right-hand corner Robert (Bob's) mother is indentified as Harriet Ensbey (Ensby) and Harriet Hannah (the bride) her mother is Sarah Ensbey, and they are sisters, as mentioned earlier that Bob and Harriet were 1st cousins.



Remember Eily is an Ensby via her mother, and from an Obituary of Eily's brother, **Tichbourne Thomas Hannah**, (he seems to have reversed his first names) we learn a lot about her family and a history of the Ensby family around Lawrence. He had eight children and nine of his 16 brothers and sisters are mentioned, including Eily, who is named as Mrs R Pringle living in Southport Qld. This is December 1950 and both Bob and Eily's parents have died. Robert, Bob's father died in 1948.

1. Marcia Hannah who was born 18th June 1925 in Maclean and as mentioned earlier Bob and Eily were not married until 1928 so Marcia had the surname Hannah and it was not changed until she married. She married *Douglas Hunter Myers* in Murwillumbah in March 1946 he came from Western Australia and was in the army during WW11. Their first child was born in Murwillumbah in January 1947 but they had moved back to WA by September 1949 when their 2nd child Cheryl was born. (She lived only 17 hours) Their 3rd child Gary*, was born in 1951 also in WA. They appear on the Electoral Roll in 1954 in Pemberton in SW Western Aust' they later moved to Albany WA. Marcia died on 14 August 2003



In November 1958 Marcia wrote a letter "home" to her mum and dad Eily (Harriet Eileen) and Bob Pringle. Marcia and her family had been visiting the family on the Gold Coast and has returned to WA. She mentions her sister Beryl who is still staying with her parents. Beryl also lives in WA. Her mother must not have been very well and that seems to be the issue in the letter. She indicates that they, that is Marcia and her family, may move back to the Gold Coast to live. They never do that.

Marcia also refers to Jill, Joe and Dad, which would seem to suggest that she calls her brother Allan, "Joe"!



2. Beryl Elaine Pringle the second child of Bob and Eily was born on 3rd December 1931. By 1954 she is living in Kojonup about 150kms north of Albury WA and is married to *Raymond Neville Parker*. It is something of a coincidence that these two sisters marry and move to WA. Kojonup is about 200km from Pemberton where her sister, Marcia, is living. Raymond Parker is a farmer and there are a number of Parkers in the area. Beryl dies in Albany on 1st April 2006.

Like her sister I am only aware of one child, but I assume they both had more children. Veronica

Parker is the child I know that Beryl and Ray had.









Beryl Pringle wrote a letter to her father Robert (Bob) Richard John Pringle the son of Robert Arthur Pringle and Harriet (Minnie) Ensby and the brother of Annie Ernestine Bradfield (Pringle).

Beryl refers to her father as Pop, and when she writes this letter in 1970/71 she apologies for not writing for some time. She mentions, in the section below, her daughter, Veronica, who is working at a bank and her daughter, Barbara, who is still at school and boarding in a hostel at Katanning. And she says now there is only herself, her b=husband Ray and their son Neville living at home



In the section below she asks about Bob's greyhounds




Later in the letter Beryl offers to shout her dad a ticket to fly over to Western Australia because she can't get her husband to leave their farm and travel to the Gold Coast.

When the letter was written in 1970/71 neither Beryl nor Marcia had been back to the Gold Coast since the late 1950's. Bob died a couple of years later in 1973.

3. Allan Pringle was born in May 1937 and was married on 17th January 1959 to Lawna Jill Thomson at Coolangatta on the Gold Coast. In 1963 they were living in Palm Beach (see 1963 Census entry below) where he was butcher. Allan's life is detailed on the next page by his daughter, Sue.

The following information about Allan was written by his daughter **Sue** in 2024.

Allan Pringle, my dad, born 8/5/1937, he grew up at 4 Currumbin Creek Rd, Currumbin and attended the old Currumbin school along with my mother, Lawna Jill Thomson, of Elanora. My mother had a twin brother, Jack, whose girlfriend (who he later married) was Rosemary the daughter of David Fleay. So as kids and teenagers they hung out at David Fleay's Fauna Reserve Burleigh Heads.

Mum and Dad married at St Peter's Church Coolangatta 17/1/1959. I was born - Susan Lee Pringle - 7/2/1960 and we lived briefly at Salisbury in Brisbane where dad worked as a butcher. We then moved back to Palm Beach Ave, Palm Beach Gold Coast, dad working at the local butcher shop and nights worked at the Palm Beach Hotel. Later we moved to Boonah where again dad worked in the town butcher shop before changing jobs to be the overseer of a cattle stud "The Overflow" between Boonah and Beaudesert.

In 1970 we moved to Brisbane where they bought a home in Acacia Ridge as well as a butcher shop. From the time we moved to Boonah we had Pop (Bob Pringle) live with us most of the time at Boonah and in Brisbane but not long before he passed away he went back to his Currumbin home. Dad sold Pop's place after he died.

I didn't know Dad had a sister (Beryl) and step sister (Marcia)* until my early 20's as no-one ever spoke of them. As far as I knew it was just me, mum, dad and Pop. I didn't even know what my grandmother looked like as Pop never had any photos at his place and no-one ever spoke about her.

It was only when Beryl passed away that I started asking questions but dad couldn't really fill me in as they had left home and married when he was young and apparently they didn't come back for their mother's funeral or keep in contact.

Dad passed away 7/9/2015 from Metastatic Cancer and I moved in with mum and cared for her until she passed away 27/3/2016 at home.

After their passing I tried through FaceBook to find an Aussie Rules Player, Aaron Shattock, as I remembered mum had told me he was related to Beryl (I think grandson) and he played AFL in Brisbane and lived somewhere on the Gold Coast. He passed my message on to WA that both of my parents had passed away and that's when Robyn Myers (Marcia's daughter-in-law) contacted me.

*(Marcia is mentioned as step sister because Sue knew she was born 2 years before Bob and Eily were married and assumed she was not her Pop's (Bob's) child)






Below is a copy of Allan Pringle's Birth Certificate in 1937 I have included thus document because rumours swirled in the extended family that Allan was adopted. Allan's daughter Sue applied for her dad's birth certificate in 2024 and it seems to have cleared up the issue. Sue spoke to BDM NSW and checked about the possibility of Harriet and Robert (Bob) being listed as parents if Allan was adopted and they said that would not happen.

Although Allan had two older sisters, Marcia and Beryl, they are not listed. The rumour could have had some foundation in the fact that Marcia was born some years before Harriet and Bob got married and she was adopted by Bob; however that is negated by the family firmly believing that Bob was Marcia's father. BUT Marcia lists her maiden name as Hannah on her marriage certificate

The document is still riddled with errors. Grafton is seemingly in the ACT not NSW and Currumbin is listed as NSW not Qld. The detail in the document is very limited with which is unusual.

5. Alice (Biddy) Pringle the 5th child of Robert Pringle and Harriet (Minnie) Ensby was born on 29th August 1907. She would have been born at Tullymorgan, her father had left the sawmill at Murrayville and bought a farm at Tullymorgan in 1905.

Alice married *George Mackay (Mack) Eagleton* in 1927 and they lived in Church St Maclean they moved in 1950. Mack died on 22nd September 1959 in Brisbane. "Mack" as he was known was already within the family "loop" because his mother was Hannah Sutherland. - *See Research Note 4 – The Sutherland Family*



Remember two of Biddy's sisters married Sutherlands. **Lena** married Arthur Sutherland (Mac is his nephew) and **Edna** (she is coming up as the 7th child) marries Alec Sutherland (Mac is his 1st cousin once removed). These Sutherlands all go back to George McKay and Emma Want.

In <u>Research Note 4 – The Sutherland Family</u> there is an Obituary of Emma Sutherland (Want) that goes some way to explain who many of the Sutherland family are and who the daughters marry. NM 2024





A story about Alice (Biddy) is told that when her first child Gloria was born she gave her way to either the Butcher family who ran the general store in Lawrence or the Archer who were the butchers in Lawrence. They gave her away her for a sewing machine! The story is spread enough through the family for it to be true. The "swap" lasted for how long I don't know but Gloria kept her name of Eagleton so it may not have been the "gave her away" like it was forever like it is implied and in Annie's letter from 1950 she mentions Gloria as one of the family.

I have limited information about this line of the family. The most reliable is about Gloria (see the note above about her and the sewing machine).

Daily Examiner (Grafton, NSW: 1915-1954) / Thu 1 Feb 1951

The Daily Examiner in Grafton reported in Feb 1961 that she was marrying Geoffrey Kerihan. That fits with the news in the letter written by her Aunty Annie Bradfield in late 1950 saying that Gloria was in Cairns. It seems she died in Hamilton Vic in 1968.

Thomas Charles Pringle 1910-1960

6. Thomas Charles Pringle was the 6th child of Robert Arthur Pringle and Harriet (Minnie) Ensby. Tom was born on 18th Feb 1910. This must have been an interesting time in the Pringle household because Tom's oldest sister, Annie was only 15 at the time, and had just given birth 5 months earlier in September 1909 to a daughter, Gladys May Pringle. Harriet, their mother must have been well organised with a 3 year old, Alice as well to look after.

Tom worked on the family farm at Tullymorgan and when the family sold up in 1934/35 he moved as well and by 1936 was living near his parents in Bald Hills. His father, Robert, had a dairy farm and Tom a milk run.

Tom sold his milk run and was later working as a storeman at Barry & Roberts Supermarket.

In 1960, I was just 7 years old, and we were staying at the Bradfield family home of Tom's sister Annie, who died in 1950. Tom was my mum's uncle and her father Pat Bradfield died in July 1960 and we were back over at Tullymorgan and but I clearly remember a pone and the stunned reaction of everyone as they talked about an accident. Tom had been killed in a traffic accident. My recollection was that it concerned a truck and some poles sticking out the back of it. NM 2024

Fatal smash at Boond

Interestingly the name of his mother is listed as **Harriet Clarke**. That same name appears on his Marriage Certificate below as well.

When Harriet started using **Clark** (yes Clark without the e) rather than Ensby goes back to 1905 and a baptism document of 4 of her children.

The reason for this is still something of a mystery. Yes, her father was really Charles Clark but he used Ensby/Ensbey most of his life.

And again to confuse us with names on his birth record Robert is recorded Claud Robert Sutherland. He has switched his given names. And added an "e" to Claud.

This recollection of Tom Pringle is written by his daughter **Deslea** who was only 13 when he died in 1960.

Tom went to the Tullymorgan school and was a good runner, winning a green fruit bowl which is now back at the school that has become a museum.

Leaving school he worked around the Tullymorgan area cane cutting, carting it to barges for delivery to the Mill at Harwood. Cane cutting is seasonal work so in the other months he was cutting timber to clear for farming, milking cows and his father **Robert** was always testing out new crops and bringing in bumper bean harvests that had to be picked. With seven siblings he must have helped out around the house and general farming chores.

1943 was a big year, dad got married and Robert, his dad, sold his farm and they moved to Bald Hills. Almost from the start there was a problem with a drought and they had no water. Dad **Uncle George** & **Cousin Claude** dug a water hole. Today a creek flows through the area where the farm was!

Mum and Dad initially lived at Shorncliffe then to 54 Coward St Deagon from 1945.

Dad always kept in touch with his larger family: his brothers and sisters, his many cousins and we often had relatives holidaying with us.

Sometime in the 1950s Dads appendix burst & was unable to work so mum went back to work and dad cared for me! As best he could, he even tried to curl my straight hair tying it with wet rags.

On Saturday we would walk to our grandparent's house 10kms away. On the way home I could always think up an excuse to get a piggyback

Our home at Deagon was like a small farm dad's milk shed, a chook pen with chicken and ducks, vegetable gardens; fruit trees, flower gardens and trees in climb.

There were also different games to play. Cricket was a favourite & yes there were broken windows and Dad was always part of the game. Climbing trees was one of my favourite's but there were times when I had to be rescued. Sunday lunch were always roast day either chicken or duck. However one Sunday I refused to eat my pet duck. Life was little different then.

Dad's dairy shed was for the milk supplies that he delivered to the families in the area. The milk was in metal containers & dad would use a billycan to fill up the customers cans. Dad was exempt from going to war as he had an important job to feed the children of the area. Mum said if they had been paid for all the milk delivered during the war they would have lived a more comfortable life.

Sometime around 1950 the milk board changed to milk bottles so Dad closed up like all the other small milk suppliers and he went to work at *Barry & Roberts grocery store* in Sandgate doing deliveries of groceries. *Barry and Roberts* was a large grocery store chain with dozens of stores throughout Queensland. The dairy shed became a wood shed & the boys, my brothers, Robert and Ian would have fun cutting wood.

Often on weekends we would visit dad's brothers & sisters. Dad really enjoyed these outings to see them & one occasion we travelled by train to Eagleby & then walked into the bush Aunty **Biddy (Alice)** and **Uncle Mac Eagleton** were living in a tent. Mac was working for the railway repairing the line to the Gold Coast..

We also visited **Aunty Edna** and **Uncle Alec Sutherland** at Gordon Park that was a train and a tram journey. Aunty Edna's house was full of nick-knacks: a bit like visiting an antique shop today. We weren't allowed to touch them & I wonder who dusted them. Her son, **Warren** loved music & he would play all the latest rock & roll music for us. **Aunty Biddy** and her brother **Uncle George** later in life lived together at the Grange so we would visit them also. I seem to think a part of the visits was a welfare check on his siblings and Dad slipped them a few shillings to help out.

Dad would often have to go to the Brisbane hospital as **Uncle George** would have been assaulted in the city and lose his wallet or have it stolen. Yes some of the Pringle family were drinkers. Alcohol has played a role in how quite a few finished up; it is a theme through the generations.

Robert Pringle 1944-2020

Robert Charles Pringle 18 Mar 1944 – 28 Apr 2020

Recollections by his son Robert (Bruce) Pringle in December 2024

Dad was born in Brisbane Hospital to my grandparents, Tom and Alma Pringle, on the 18 March 1944.

The eldest of three, with Sister Deslea and Brother Ian.

I don't know, and can't remember many stories from Dad about what he got up to while he was growing up.

From what I've been told, apparently he was quiet, but enjoyed fishing and driving around with friends in the neighbourhood he grew up in, which was the Sandgate, Deagon area on the North side of Brisbane.

He never really talked about Tom, my grandfather, while I was growing up. Maybe because of the car accident Tom died in when Dad was still a young boy of 16. Maybe he repressed those memories of his father, to cope with sadness and loss he experienced when he lost his father. I imagine he would have had to grow almost immediately and become the Man of the house and make sure that his mother and siblings where looked after and provided for; So much so that Dad actually waited until Deslea and Ian where married and left home before he was married and left home.

It wasn't much later towards the beginning of the end of Dads life that I stated to ask a few questions about what his father was like. All he said was that he was firm but fair and a strong silent man who worked hard to provide for his family.

From that moment, I understood why my father, Robert was the way he was. He, like his Father before him was a strong silent type, who I never once heard him complain, never had a gripe or a whinge, he always doing things and being busy at home on the weekends. Always doing work around the yard, making sure the car was serviced, completing odd jobs around the house, and trying to complete projects like building rooms under the house or cementing and laying pavers for the front yard. He was a jack of all trades and willing to give anything a go.

His first job was working where his dad was working at Barry & Roberts grocery store (supermarket)

Around 1969/70 Mum and Dad met while working at Reckitt and Coleman, and started dating and where quickly married on the 3rd of July 1971. He always joked, that they married on that day, because it was the day before American Independence day, The 4th July. A day he could remember.

Not long after Mum and Dad got married, Dad joined the Australia Army reserve, back then, known as The Citizen Military Forces, (CMF). I think, from memory he was slightly to young at the time, and missed out on National Service, which was around at the time.

He wanted to serve his country, and he completed 21 years in the Army Reserve reaching the rank of Staff Sergeant. I can't remember too much of the early years gowning up seeing him in uniform. I do remember some Anzac Days, where he would march in the Parades and also participate in the Catafalque Party at the Zillmere Service. I remember him being away a fair bit in the late 1980's completing Continuous Fulltime Service, (CFS) for over 6 to 8 weeks, on Kangaroo Exercises run by the Australian Defence Force.

Much later, after I left school, I joined the Army Reserve also, and was proud to serve alongside him.

He worked at Rank Xerox, a photocopying company where he was a storeman. After he was made redundant about 1984, he and Mum stared the Pringle Bus Company, which completed the school run for Narangba State School where my siblings and I attended. Unfortunately, the school holidays proved to be difficult time, as the school run was the main source of income, and Dad and Mum couldn't keep up with payments for maintenance etc on the Buses, and the company didn't last long. Dad then went into security. Firstly, patrolling the Brisbane city Train Network and then onto Websters Biscuit factory. After a shift at Websters, he would bring home boxes of biscuits. We as kids loved it, and wanted to know where he got them from. His reply would always be the same.......

"They fell off the back of a truck"

In his early years before he met Mum, he would do some bar work at the Kedron-Wavell RSL, and then much later into the late 80's early 90's the Burpengary Tavern.

He was always managing to find work to be able to provide for his family. No matter how long he was in or out of a job.

Our Easter Holidays would mostly be on the Farm at Tullymorgan, where my siblings and I would ride horses, help out with milking the cows, spending time in the country, learning to shoot and spend time around the fire place on the cold wintery nights.

Back then, in the early 80's, it would be almost a 6-hour trip, where I grew up, at Narangba, on Brisbane's north side to Tullymorgan. Dad would always drive and would have us kids write down the name of the towns we drove through, and gives up 10 or 20 cents for each town we got right and 50 cents for a bonus, which was always Brisbane.

Dad also loved sports. He would often fall asleep in front of the TV with the golf, or the cricket on. If we were to change the channel he would always wake up and respond with, "I was watching that".

He was a Redcliffe Dolphins fan. He and I would head to Dolphin Oval occasionally to watch The Dolphins play in the Brisbane Rugby league comp in the 80's, and I have no doubt that he would have been so happy when the Dolphins were granted a license into the NRL and won their first 6 games in their first year in 2023.

He played Golf and tennis for a bit, a bit of indoor cricket. He was the guy carrying the magic sponge for the footy team I played for and also the coach of the cricket team I played in for 2 years. He also played Touch Football with me in a team made up mostly of Teachers from Narangba State School.

In later life, Dad was an integral part in helping to organise and start up the Narangba Bowls club and became a very good at Lawn Bowls, winning a number of competitions and at one-time being Club President and also the Men's President.

He may not have been one to show emotion or be very open and forth coming with words of wisdom or encouragement, but we knew that he loved us by being involved in our lives and he worked hard to make sure that my siblings and I were provided for.

I believe his proudest moment was when he became a grandfather, to my first son Brock.

I saw a man who doted over Brock and the grandchildren to follow, Morgan, Joshua, Ben, Henry, Emmitt and Isla. I feel that the love, care and attention he showed to his grandchildren, was his way of making up for what he failed to achieve as a father when my sibling and I were growing up.

In May 2020 when Dad passed away, it was expected, because he had been sick for so long, but still hard to deal with. Unfortunately for me I didn't get to witness Dad deteriorate before my eyes the way Mum and my younger sister Joanne did. I had visited a number of times from Townsville in the months before he passed, and I was grateful that I was able to get to Brisbane 2 days before he passed, to be there with Mum and my siblings to say goodbye. In those last couple of hours, I saw my father coming to life, and be alert and aware that all the people that he loved where around him, where he wanted them. Even at one stage chastising Gavin who was playfully mucking around with Joanne throwing an M&M up in the air for Joanne to catch in her mouth. Typical Dad, through gritted teeth and an authoritative voice, he said "Don't you do that. She will choke!" or words to that affect.

The above biography was written by Robert's son Bruce. I asked him would he do the same with a story about himself. If only we had details like these from all the family ancestors. In an interesting coincidence both Bruce and my son, Andrew, live in Townsville (2024)

I was born at Redcliffe hospital to Robert and Joan Pringle.

Even though I was given Robert as my first name, I have always been called Bruce. I was told that Dad and Mum wanted to call me Robert Bruce after the Scottish King, Robert The Bruce who led the Scottish in the war of independence against the English which lasted from 1296 to 1328.

Then, why call me Bruce instead or Robert?

The answer I was given, If Dad and I where down in the yard and Mum yelled out for Robert, both of us would come running.

So Bruce is what I've been called since the day I came home from the hospital!!

I'm the eldest of 4 with 2 sisters, Natalie and Joanne and Brother Gavin.

I had a reasonably happy childhood growing up. I was always wanting to watch cartoons or sports, mainly cricket or football on TV. When I wasn't watching TV, I was out with friends from school riding around the neighbourhood, exploring the forestry or riding the bike tracks at the quarries in our local area. I attended Narangba State School, where I made many friends and attended the usually athletics carnivals representing the school and also playing Rugby League or cricket at lunch times depending on the season. I also played Rugby League for the Pine Rivers Bears under 9 and 10's, with my Dad, Robert Pringle running out to treat injuries with the magic sponge. I played cricket and baseball and touch football. You could say I was pretty sporty, and I would try to imitate my favourite player, Big Mal Meninga, practicing my chip and chase in the back yard, or Allan Border taking catches throwing myself and diving all over the yard taking one handed catches with a tennis ball.

Most of our school holidays would mostly be on the Farm at Tullymorgan, where my siblings and I would ride horses, help out with milking the cows, spending time in the country, learning to shoot and spend time around the fire place on the cold wintery nights.

To keep us kids occupied during an almost a 6-hour trip, Dad would always have us kids write down the name of the towns we drove through, and gives up 10 or 20 cents for each town we got right and 50 cents for a bonus town, which was always Brisbane.

We always attended Church and Sunday School on Sundays. I never really got used to it, as I found it boring, but I grew to understand why Dad and Mum took us to Church. It was to make sure we had the spiritual support and religious upbringing that they had. To this day I still hold close those lessons and values I learnt all those Sundays long ago.

In my high school years, I attended Grace Lutheran College at Rothwell a private school near Redcliffe. Mum and Dad wanted us to have the best education. Initially I was disappointed, as all my friends went to the local high school at Dakabin. But as the years passed at Grace, I made some lifelong friends that I am still in contact with today.

After school, I joined the Army Reserve, and served alongside my father. I had an interesting 3 years completing Drivers courses, performing General Duties, (GD), as a dixie basher (washing dishes), and supporting other Army Reserve units at places like Wondai, Augathella, Tin Can Bay, Rockhampton, and Shoalwater Bay Training area. I had a couple of odd jobs also, mowing yards, picking pineapples. All these jobs instilled in me a solid work ethic and taught me to always do and be the best I can be no matter what the situation.

In 1994 I left home when I transferred to the Australian Regular Army and moved to Townsville's 5th Aviation Regiment, where I was employed as a storeman. I was grateful for the move, because if it never happened I would never have meet my wife Stacey. We married in 2001 in Townsville, and in November of that year we moved to Wagga Wagga where I attended RAAF School of Technical Training and achieved my Certificate 4 in Aerospace engineering (Mechanical) and started a new career as an Aircraft Mechanic. After a year and a half of training, in 2003 we moved to 162 Reconnaissance Squadron, Townsville. While there we welcomed out first Son, Brock, in July of that year. At the end of 2005 another move saw us arrive in Darwin at The 1st Aviation Regiment. While there I was lucky enough to be deployed to East Timor in 2006. Then in November 2007 we welcomed our daughter Morgan. Our Family was complete.

Another move in 2008 saw us arrive back home to Townsville, and back where my fulltime Army career started, at 5th Aviation Regiment.

In 2011 after 20 years' service with the Australian Army I took voluntary discharge and secured a Trade supervisor position on the new Multi-Role Helicopter, MRH90 Taipan with Airbus.

After 12 years with Airbus I was made redundant at the end of 2023, due to the MRH90 being removed from military service.

After an extended Holiday for 4 months, thankfully, I was given a life line by Boeing Defence Australia, and secured a position as a General Repair Technician.

While working with Boeing, I started thinking about different career paths to move away from aviation maintenance.

Thankfully I have been able to achieve my second Certificate 4. This time in Driver Training and have been working part time, casual as a Driver trainer, instructing C Class (Car) licence.

Edna lived at Gordon Park in Brisbane and Valerie the daughter of her eldest sister (her half sister Gladys) remembers visiting her in the late 1970's.

The Sutherland/Pringle/Ensby family links are detailed in the Appendix – *Research Note 4*

Alec was known as "Gowie" the actual spelling could have been anything but the sound was something like I have spelt it.

Edna seems to have maintained the style of her mother and appears well dressed and enjoyed attending events and functions.

When Edna was 17 she had her appendix removed. This was in 1930 just a few years before she married in 1934 and in that year her parents sold up and moved from Tullymorgan to Brisbane. Edna lived in Maclean until they also moved to Brisbane in the early 1940's.

Miss Edna Pringle, of Tullymorgan, was admitted to the Lower Clarence Hospital on Tuesday, suffering from appendicitis, and was operated upon next morning.





8. George Hamilton Pringle was born on 31st October 1915 in Maclean NSW and he died on 13th February 1975 in Brisbane. George did not marry and had no children.

He regularly visited the family in Maclean and Tullymorgan and may have lived around Coffs Harbour for a while in the 1940's he often stayed with his sister Alice, in Brisbane, after her husband died in 1959. He worked at a Tannery in Kedron in the 1960's; in fact he worked there with his nephew Warren Sutherland the son of his sister Edna.

His niece, Deslea Grice, the daughter of his brother Tom remembers visiting George when he lived with his sister Biddy (Alice). Tom used to have to help George out in the late 1950's because he had alcohol problems.

They Failed To Lodge Income Returns

Before Mr. G. L. Berry, P.M., at Coff's Harbour Police Court on Friday, George Hamilton Pringle, James Luke Haydon, Arthur James Hamson and Donald Ross Cook we're each called on to answer proceedings by the Deputy Commissioner for Taxation for failure to furnish income tax returns. A plea of guilty was entered in each case.

Mr. J. Burke appeared for the Taxation Department.

In the case of Pringle, Mr. Burke said that he had failed to lodge a return for 1943. Returns for 1942 and 1944 had been lodged. His 1944 return showed that he was a labourer with an income of £240 for that year.

The tax for 1943 would not be

considerable, and in the ordinary course of events should have been deducted from his wages.

A fine of £5, with 8/ costs and 12/ witness's expenses was imposed.

Yes, Red is the brother of Beryl in the other photo. (Some years later in the 1960's after her husband Cecil Robert Sutherland died in 1964 Iris and Red lived together at Tullymorgan. (Red and Iris are 1st cousins one removed and 2nd cousins)

Iris is a link back into the Ensby family and Snowy links back to the Cavanough family.

In the next section I try to make sense of the main relationships between the Tullymorgan families.

That completes the details of the descendants of Robert Pringle and Harriet (Minnie) Ensby.

The next section is an attempt to explain the relationships between the extended families related to the Pringles and the Ensbys.

Like many in the family, especially the ones like me born after 1950, just how some people were related was a mystery; I hope the next section sorts some of that out.

The confusion is compounded with intergenerational marriages between several families and two sisters marrying two brothers or two cousins from another family. It is made no easier when **Charles Clarke-Ensbey** and **Harriett Garrett** have 14 children and their daughter **Sarah Clarke Ensbey** marries **John Hannah** and has 17 children. I have not researched the "Hannah" line of the family except of course when Harriet Eileen (Eily) Hannah (Eily Clark) marries Bob Pringle that brings her back into the Ensby line...... But the Hannah line has been made into one of the extensive lists in **Research Note 1** from an Ensbey Family History book.

The Pringles - Ensbys - Dobbins - Cavanoughs - Sutherlands - Essexs - Bradfields

The Cavanough and the Dobbin families are related to the Pringle and Ensby families through generations in a confusing set of relationships. Some of the extended family is related to all of the 4 families. The following is an attempt to unpick those relationships with an added complication of the Sutherlands, Essexs and the Bradfields.

Before you start a few reference points;

In this book **Harriet Ensby** and **Robert Arthur Pringle** (my great grandparents NM) form a link to relate to our common ancestors and the more remote past and my current fairly close relations: aunties, uncles, great aunts and uncles and 1st and 2nd cousins.

This 4 family relationship chaos brings in the brothers and sisters of Harriet and Robert, and keeping that in mind will make what follows a bit easier to follow.

Hannah Ensby is a major player here; she is the sister of Harriet.

Hannah married Charles Alfred Albert Cavanough in 1903 – An Ensby – Cavanough connection.

Charles Cavanough had previously married Hannah's sister Alice May Ensby in 1898 and they had one child Charles Stanley (Stan) Cavanough. – Alice May Ensby was only 20 when she died from bronchitis in 1901.

Hannah Ensby and Charles Cavanough have 5 children the eldest Alice May Cavanough - who is named after her mother's sister who was also Charles first wife – marries Lawrence (Laurie) Dobbin. And the 3rd child George Richard (Dick) Cavanough marries Dorothy (Snowy) May Bradfield, Snowy is the granddaughter of Hannah's sister Harriet.

The Pringles get involved.

Remember Harriet Ensby and Robert Arthur Pringle? Well Laurie Dobbin is Robert's nephew.

Laurie is the 4th child of Mary Annie Elizabeth Pringle (Roberts's sister) and Charles Sydney Henry Dobbin.

Lawrence (Laurie) Dobbin marries Alice May Cavanough and they have 5 children

Albert CHARLES Dobbin their 3rd child marries Edith Wilben. Edith is well known to many in the extended family she has an OA medal and in 2024 at 92 is well known to the extended family. Edith has had a long involvement with the Maclean Historical Society. Edith and Charles's son, **Ian Dobbin** has been a collector of family photos and information for decades.

(Ian and Edith provided a lot of information & clarification in this book).

Collette Elizabeth Dobbin is the 5th child of Mary Annie Elizabeth Pringle and Charles Sydney Henry Dobbin and she marries Ray Paddock. Collette is known to many in the family because she often spent time with her 2nd cousin Snowy Cavanough in Tullymorgan.


The diagram on the page after the next page details the links between the Pringle, Ensby, Sutherland, Dobbin, Essex and Bradfield families, it covers a selected list of the descendants of two of James Pringle and Elizabeth Jacks (Jacques) children; Thomas and Jane.

James was the first of our line of Pringles to come to Australia in 1843. It shows in a diagrammatic way the complex links with the Ensby family introducing Charles Clarke-Ensbey who immigrated to Australia in 1855 with his mother Ruth Clark and his step father William Ensbey.

If you find someone you in this chart you know you should be able to work out how you are related to the characters that populate these pages.

I have mentioned **Robert Arthur Pringle** 1867-1948 and his wife **Harriet (Minnie) Ensby** 1871-1943 as my reference couple, my great grandparents, and they are the Ensby-Pringle connection when they marry in 1892. In the last few pages as I completed the details about the children of Robert and Harriet the links with my mother's generation, her sisters, started being included in the photos. There were also Ensbys and Dobbins and the Cavanoughs and Sutherlands as well.

Before you dive in and try to understand the **Family Chart** a few pages ahead have a look at the two families of Robert and Harriet, below are lists of their siblings (their brothers and sisters) Robert has 8 and Harriet has 13..





The Cavanough Family

The Cavanough family are related to the Ensby, Pringle, Dobbin and Sutherland families since 1898 when Charles Cavanough started it all by marring Alice May Ensby and then when she died he married her older sister, Hannah, and that union the ties became ever stronger.

The Cavanough house at Tullymorgan has become something of the spiritual home for many of the extended family. All of my cousins 1st, 2nd and some even more remote all have tales to tell of visiting the homestead. I refer to it as "Snowy's" house. Snowy being my aunty who married Dick Cavanough, Hannah lived with them and so did others in the extend family, along with their own children: Joy, Dianne, Gail and Ricky.

The house contains portraits of the family back to Harriett Garrett 1833-1918 and it is situated on land once owned by Robert Pringle and Harriet Ensby and is surrounded by farmed owned by Ensbys, Sutherlands and Pat Bradfield.

Tullymorgan is the central place of this story.

Charles Cavanough bought the house that is on the hill that I am referring to as Snowy's house.

Today Charles's grandson Ricky Cavanough owns the farm and lives in the family home. As a kid I stayed there, although we usually stayed with my mother's father Pat Bradfield and later my uncles in a house down on the flat, both houses in view of each other. My kids and the kids

and grandkids of a lot of my cousins have stayed at the Cavanough's (Snowy's) house. I met Iris Sutherland (Ensby) there, she would have been just visiting because she lived just down the hill, and Collette Paddock (Dobbin) because she used to enjoying staying with Snowy. Pam Cavanough lived there. Pam is the daughter of Charles Cavanough's son, Stan, from his first marriage to Alice May Ensby. Both Stan and his wife died when Pam was still a baby in 1946 (maybe just 2 years old). Pam had been adopted by Stan and his wife and when they died she was taken in by Hannah and, Charles had already died in 1936. Hannah was deemed too old to adopt Pam so her son Dick formally adopted Pam.

The original Cavanough farmhouse was a few kilometres further north along the Tullymorgan-JackyBulbin Rd from the current Cavanaugh Rd (the road is spelt differently to the family name spelling)!turnoff. That house was accessed by an older different road that ran further to the west. Nothing remains of that house bar a few bricks, pieces of metal, some flowers from the old flower beds and a few domestic trees. The photo below is the house in the 1960's.

Charles and Hannah lived here and raised 5 kids. I don't think Hannah moved from here until the late 1940's.



In 1943 Robert Arthur Pringle and his wife Harriet Ensby sold their farm in Tullymorgan to George Ray, who was the manager of the Harwood Sugar Mill. He built the house that is the Cavanough home (Snowy's House) on the hill at Tullymorgan. Later the Cavanough's bought the house and farm to add to their existing holdings. The original Pringle house was a few hundred metres down the hill north of the existing house close to the existing road that goes on to further properties.

Below is the Cavanough house (Snowy's place) at Tullymorgan. This is the back of the house and photo does it little justice. The road in the foreground used to be the main road from Murrayville to Tulllymorgan.

Dorothy May Cavanough, Snowy, Aunty Snowy, Dotty, Dotty May, the Old Cheese, mother, Mum, Sister dearest, Nana C, Nan, we all knew and loved her by these names.

How on earth do you put into words the life of someone who was larger than life itself?

My Nan was a ripple on a pond; she touched the lives of so many and then many more.

Born on the 17¹¹ of September 1925, she was the 4th child of Patrick and Annie Bradfield, there ended up being 9 children in the family. Having known most of them, through-out my life I imagine a house full of laughter of love and very-very loud disagreements. Nan often said she could remember being chased out of the house-with the broom. She also fondly remembered the card nights, sharing a bed with her sisters and the dances, I think she was once quite light footed on the dance floor, I can remember her now, twirling around on the veranda showing me. I know she was a rogue by some of the stories she told. Once she told me that she and her siblings used to pinch potatoes out of a neighbour's field and go bush and roast them on a fire. Only recently Aunty Beryl told me that she and Nan used to pinch persimmons and hide them in the long blady grass until they were ripe to eat.

Nan married George Richard (Dick) Cavanaugh and had 4 children: Joy, Dianne, Gail and Ricky and they raised Pam (Dick's uncle's child). She lost George (Dick) when she was 42 in 1968 and raised the kids and looked after the farm on her own, but with the help of family and friends.

As a child growing up spending my holidays at the farm were magical, sliding down that hill on just a piece of cardboard and landing in the thistles at the bottom and Nan waiting for us to climb back up the hill and going down again, or sitting out by the clothes line on the hill plucking feathers from chooks or us chasing the sheets as the wind caught them out of Nan's hands while she was trying to take them off the line. Those hills are steep, I can hear her now yelling at us to hurry so the sheets didn't get away or get too dirty, never mind the fact that we were running bare foot through thistles, down a slippery hill to get them.

If there was someone in need she helped, whether it was taking them to town every week, playing cards to well past midnight, cooking a sponge cake for any occasion, lending an ear to someone that was hurting, spinning a good yarn with old friends, but I still don't have the sponge cake recipe. We knew her as dial a recipe, though we soon-found out when it didn't work, she would say, I was wondering how that would turn out? She would never give us her own recipe.

The above abridged eulogy is from Snowy Cavanough's funeral in **2009** it was written by her granddaughter **Tracey Lloyd**, the daughter of **Joy** and delivered by Snowy's nephew **Bruce Lyons** the son of her sister Beryl.

In this book I have referred to the Cavanough home as "Snowy's place", the extended family called it that and still do, much of the farm once belonged to the Pringles and surrounding farms were owned and in many cases still are owned by Ensbys, Sutherlands and Bradfields. The extended family visit the farm and the house has portraits of the Cavanoughs and even Snowy's great grandmother Harriett Garrett. Today, 2025, Snowy's son Richard (Ricky) owns and manages the farm.

End Note

This book was intended as a small addition to **The Bradfield Book** I completed in 2023.

I had written a couple of pages in that book about **Annie Pringle**, the wife, of **Patrick Bradfield**, my grandparents, and I thought I would clean up the folder of notes I had on the Pringle family and pass on a tidier format of family information to my kids. The book format forces me to organise the photos and notes (written on scraps of paper in semi-illegible hand), and make some explanations and finally write down some of the stories I had been told and do a little to research tie up a few loose ends.

The loose ends have proved very extensive.

The Ensby Family

The Ensby family descendants run into thousands and who is who is a name changing puzzle between the Ensby/Ensbey name and the often used Clark name. It seems that everyone in the family is aware of this name shifting/changing thing but no one was really sure why. I think that has now been answered. I did hear a wonderful reason when someone said they overheard a conversion when they were a kid when Neville (Ned) Bradfield explained it related to stealing cattle and it was better to be known as Clark than an Ensby, or was it the other way around!

The Ensby story has been told a few times and I have copied a version from 2014 as <u>Research</u> <u>Note 1</u> but like others it is woefully riddled with errors. I could not initially find a way to included some of it within this book but I have edited and tried to scrub it clean but I know the lists are still less than accurate but they serve a purpose to point future genealogists in the right direction. Charles Clark-Ensbey or whatever name I call him remains something of an enigma. But through his mother, Ruth Clark, we track our ancestors to the 1600's.

The Pringle Family

The story of the brothers coming to Australia; first, **James**, via New Zealand and the realisation that they came to a frontier land, The Big River, with two children and another on the way. I assumed they arrived rented a place to stay or stayed at an inn/pub for a while until they got organised. There was no town, no Grafton and a just a camp that was Lawrence; a very big loose end to research. James older brother, **Nicholas**, arrived in 1857 and within a generation that line of the family had moved to North Queensland (The Mossman Pringles) and Nicholas's step daughter marries James son, Thomas. And I now have a story, a longer story to tell.

The Pringle's seemingly made a fortune twice and lost it twice. **James** owned the Travellers Rest Run (farm) and Inn and Blakes Creek Run, his son Thomas seems to have, maybe drunk it away. **Robert** his son, a boy of 16 when his parents died, made well very well with farms in Tullymorgan but he lost it through a drought when he bought a dairy farm at Bald Hills and bad investments. There is also the story that: "Robert knew how to work and Harriet knew how to spend".

Find the page that has the diagram of the Ensby, Pringle, Dobbin, Sutherland, Cavanough and Bradfield family links and work out where you fit into the extended family.

I expect if you visit Maclean and Grafton there is more than a good chance that you will pass a relative in the street.

Over the years, from when I was a kid on visits to the Bradfield house at Tullymorgan people and names have echoed through my life, they come and go we usually meet at funerals. The uncles and aunties have all gone, Beryl was the last in 2023, the cousins, I only see a few every now and then. The more distant Deslea, Ian and Robert Pringle and Warren Sutherland I know them but others were just names; The Rowles: Gladys and some of the children, Val and Nola. And everyone seemed to actually know Iris and Edith and some of the Clarks. They point and say Robbie Sutherland lives down there. I could never quite figure out where. I know all of them

now. Iris has passed and so has Robert but in the last few months I have made contact with not only the ones I was vaguely aware of many that I had idea about. Sue Howkins comes to mind the daughter of Allan Pringle the son of Bob Pringle..... Beryl and Marcia Pringle's families in Western Australia...... the story is in fact far from told

Two photos, my mother had of her mother, Annie Pringle, have had much to do with my interest in family history she died before I was born but I would look at those photos and wonder just who she was. Annie was an Ensby and a Pringle. These are the two photos.



If you travel on the road from Lawrence north to the Grafton-Casino Road you will the driving on the **Pringle Way**, named after James Pringle, the first Pringle in our line who immigrated to Australia. Just a kilometre or two further to the west from the junction of those roads are the remnants of his Traveller Rest Inn.

Research Notes

Like appendix notes these notes are referenced in the main section of the book and are additional information about; extended family, historical events, and detailed information and lists.

Research Note 1 is a comprehensive list of the descendants of Charles Clark-Ensbey and Harriett Garrett. These notes were originally the main body of a book **The Ensbey Story** – **Moving to Greener Pastures** – by **Garry Ensbey** published in 2014. It includes 1200 plus names and was a hastily document put together of a reunion of the Ensbey family primarily the family descended from the two sons of William Ensbey and Ruth Clarke. The list reproduced here is only the section of the descendants of another child the son of Ruth, Charles, who she dad prior to her marriage to William Ensbey.

So Charles is NOT an Ensbey.

Charles used the name or rather documents refer to him with a variety of name and spelling variations; Ensbey, Ensby, Ainsly, Clark, Clerk and Clarke.

Charles descendants did the same thing and used the names **Ensbey**, **Ensby** and **Clark** and used the names changing them throughout their lives.

<u>Research Note 1</u> I have edited, added and removed sections and made corrections but still many errors remain. In some sections I have replaced the descendants with updated versions from other family members so the lists are no longer the same in format or numbering style, they are however more accurate. The original material because it was produced with a reunion date looming is very suspect do not assume it is correct rather use it as a guide. I have found consistent errors with dates and family members incorrectly listed as well as generations mixed, skipped and whole families in the wrong place.

DEATH BY DROWNING — An inquest was held yesterday, before Mr. A. Lardner, J.P., coroner, and a jury of six, touching the cause of the death of Charles William Ensbey, a child of tender years, who had met its death by drowning on Saturday evening last. It appeared that the parents reside on a farm at Woodford Island, fronting the Clarence River, and that the deceased, who was playing in the birn with the other children, unobserved by its mother, strayed on to the wharf, and tell into the river at a spot where there was not less than twenty feet of water. Search was instituted immediately the child was missed, and the body found on Sunday morning by James Piper, a neighbour, floating on the water. The jury returned a verdict of socidentally drowned.



Obviously this was a hard time for Benjamin as he headed into some financial difficulties as the *Australian Town and Country Journal* on Sat. 11 Apr 1885 on page 14 and the *Evening News* of Wed. 8 Apr 1885 on page 6 reported:

Insolvency Court Tuesday April 7 – Benjamin Ensbey of Lawrence, labourer. Liabilities shown: £45 11s 3d. Assets £3 10s 6d Mr LT Lloyd official assignee] decided that he had a case to answer and had to front the main court as detailed in the *Clarence and Richmond and New England Advertiser* on Sat. 23 May 1885 on page 3:

Insolvency Court Wed. May 20 – Before Mr AL McDougall, District Commissioner. In the estate of Benjamin Ensbey, of Lawrence, labourer, a single meeting. Insolvent did not desire to amend his schedule, and accounted for his insolvency through illness of himself and his wife, extending for a period of 18 months in his own case. Cameron, a selector, obtained a judgement against him in the Lawrence Small Debts Court for £8 10s, for work done, which he was unable to pay. He was also pressed by several other creditors for payment of debts. No debts were proved, and the meeting terminated.



On Thursday of last week at the residence of the bride's parents, the marriage of Mr Albert Ensby with Miss Lorna Larkin, daughter of Mr and Mrs James Larkin, both of Tullymorgan, was celebrated by the Rev L Gray.

Mr and Mrs Ensby leave in a few days to take up their residence on the Richmond.

TAKE NOTICE that I, Albert John Ensbey, of Tullymorgan, in the State of New South Wales, farmer, called and known by the names and surname Albert John Clark, on the twenty-seventh day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, formally and absolutely renounced, relinquished and abandoned the use of the names and surname Albert John Ensbey, and then assumed and adopted and determined thenceforth on all occasions whatsoever to use, adopt and subscribe the name and surname Albert John Clark instead of the names Albert John Ensbey; and take further notice that by deed poll dated the twenty-seventh day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, duly executed

Note that the family seems to use the name Clark even though they were born as Ensby.

When Albert died, Lorna lived many years as **Mrs L. Clark** in a brick home on the corner of Taloumbi & River Sts, Maclean, up until her death in 1983.

Patti Gilbert writes an Eulogy on Earl Lloyd Clarke: '

Earl born in 1919 was the eldest of four boys. He went to school and grew up at Tullymorgan. After leaving school at the age of 14 Earl worked cutting timber around this and the Dorrigo districts.

World War II saw Lloyd join up to fight for his country, serving mostly in the New Guinea War Zone. The recent eruption of the volcanoes in Rabaul was of particular interest to Lloyd as the area was familiar to him. He watched the progress on TV with great interest.

On discharge from the Army he came home and married Esme Watson. I remember the wedding quite well as I was flower girl, sunburnt lips, shoulders and all. He never let me forget it either.

Their first home was in Stanley Street, Maclean at the home of Aunt Lucy Till where they resided until they purchased the farm on Woodford Island from Ivan Page in 1952. During this time Earl worked as a linesman for NRE or NRCC as it was known then and later at the Harwood Sugar Mill driving one of the locomotives.

The farm then became Earl's life - growing cane, running a few head of cattle and some milking cows. I think he had as much patience with them as my dad did and that wasn't much. He worked the farm until about 12 months ago with the help of his family, although the LOVE part had gone.

One of the pastimes Lloyd enjoyed was wild pig and duck hunting and he often travelled great distances to enjoy this sport. He took great pride in his rifles and always kept them in meticulous condition.

Another love of his life, apart from Esme and the farm, were his children, Phillip, Graeme and Rosemary and his grandchildren, Anthony, Catherine, Angela, David and Paul, Matthew and Jason, Lucas and Alice. Of course they all had nicknames. He was proud of these kids and often when I'd call he would produce the latest photos of them or tell me of their latest exploits.

Talking of nicknames, I don't think Charlie Brown – my name for him – ever spoke about anybody by their real name which to the uninitiated could be quite confusing. He even caught me recently.

I remember when Kevin first met Lloyd and Esme. After we left Kevin was really confused as to how many children they really had. "Who are Ned, Charles and Bub?" I then had to explain that they were Phillip, Graeme and Rosemary. When he spoke of the grandchildren I had to scratch my head at times to know who he was talking about. I didn't escape the nickname either. There was no offence meant in this habit – it was just one of those things he did. Recently he caught me out. He was talking about Dudley this and Dudley that and he'd been to see Dudley. It took me a while to realise that he was talking about his brother, Rex.

The past 2 years and 3 months have been very difficult for Charlie Brown since he lost his mate, even with the wonderful support of his family. He became depressed and started having nightmares about the war. I'd never heard him speak of his experiences in New Guinea which I realise now were horrific at times. In recent months he began sharing some of them with myself and others, and it seemed to lift a load off his shoulders and he became more at peace with himself about this period of his life.

Charlie Brown also loved his home-made jam and pickles. Even picked the wild gooseberries growing in the sheds so I could make him some jam just like Esme used to make.

God Bless you Charlie Brown – I'll miss my visits with you and the debates we had. Who will I cook jam for now. Go to your mate in peace. 'Bruiser.'

Puna built a fine home on his portion of the land. Puna did well at fishing and after retiring, he set crab pots in Lake Wooloweyah for many years. He had a large vegetable garden at the back of his home and his greatest joy was to give relatives and friends, fresh vegies from his garden. As he grew older, his garden made way for over 60 fruit trees. Friends always enjoyed a walk around the garden with Ivy explaining the different fruits. CLAIM AGAINST EX-FIANCEE FAILS

GRAFTON, Wednesday - A Clarence River district farmer today failed in a district court action for the recovery of £200, which he claimed he loaned a Sydney girl who broke off her engagement with him.

The farmer, Arthur Roy Ensbey, of Lawrence, sued Canterbury embroidery machinist, Elaine Robinson, 21, and her mother, Mrs Pearl Robinson. He told the court he became engaged to the girl early in 1950, when she and her mother were on holidays at Lawrence. He said Mrs Robinson asked him for a loan and arranged all the details. The girl, he said, broke off the engagements after incidents had occurred in a Sydney picture theatre and at a Clarence River seaside resort. The money was not returned to him.

Elaine Robinson, in evidence, claimed Ensbey gave her the engagement ring against her will and also sent £200 as a gift to her to buy an embroidery machine and materials to start a business.

"When I broke off the engagement, I handed Ensbey back the ring and offered to return presents and the machine, but he would not take them," she said.

The jury gave a verdict for the girl and her mother.

Research Note 2 – The Pringle Name

THE RECORDS OF THE PRINGLES OR HOPPRINGILLS OF THE SCOTTISH BORDER

BY

ALEX. PRINGLE, M.A., B.Sc.

THE SURNAME

The surname Hoppringill or Pringle, dating, as it does, from the reign of Alexander III., is one of the oldest on the Scottish Border. It is a place-name, that is, is derived from the name of a place. This place is situated in the Parish of Stow, on the left side of Gala water, about ten miles above Galashiels. It lies about half a mile up from the bank of the river, on the southern slope of a ridge that separates the valleys of the Armet and Todhole burns. This ridge with its level crest—at present well wooded—abuts at its western extremity on the Gala in a remarkably rounded knob some 300 feet above the level of the river, which winds round its base in the form of a semi-circle. It is this round or ring-like boss, no doubt, that gave the place its name of Hoppringhill, as we occasionally find it written in the older records.

The first syllable in the name, hope, hopp, op, or up, derived from the same root as the Old Norse hop, a haven, denoting a small enclosed valley branching off a larger, is found abundantly in place-names in the south-east of Scotland and the north-east of England, and as far south as Hereford. It occurs as a prefix in Hopprew, Hopkailzie, and Hopcarton in Peeblesshire, Hopkirk in Roxburghshire, Hoprig, Hopefoot in Haddingtonshire: but it is best known as a suffix; some three dozen place names, it is said, ending in hope in Selkirkshire, and some six dozen in Northumberland, as Kirkhope, Stanhope, Rattlinghope, etc. As to the other two syllables in Hoppringill we find ring, or rink, which is the same word, as the name of a hill in Wrinklaw in the Lammermoors, and Rink Hill in Selkirkshire. It will be noted that these names are always descriptive. Thus Hoppringill means simply the hope of the ring or round hill. The rotundity of this hill is well seen from the carriage windows of the trains that pass below, and is well

brought out by the contour lines on sheet 25 of the 6-inch maps of the Ordnance Survey.

As a surname Hoppringill, like Hopkailzie (now Kailzie), could readily afford, as a trisyllable with its accent on the second syllable, to drop its scarcely audible prefix, but it continued to be by far the dominant form for three hundred years. Indeed the chiefs of the clan never gave up its use, and the last of them in his Will, dated 1737, speaks of himself as "John Hoppringle of that Ilk." About 1590, however, Pringill (a "p" being retained through its affinity for "r"), which had appeared only occasionally before, begins in the records to take its place, and becomes the dominant form till about 1650: when it in turn begins to give way to Pringle, following in this the example set by such words as tempill, singill, which became temple, single. Throughout these changes, however, the pronunciation remained the same: it always was, and is still, in Scottish Hopp-ring-ill, Pring-ill: there never was any gill sound in the name; that only appears when we speak in the modern or book fashion.

As regards the spelling of Hoppringill and Pringill in the old records, we soon find that that depended "upon the fancy of the speller." What with the dropping of this "p" or that "l," with or without the favourite substitute of a "y," and occasionally of an "e" or an "a," for this or that "i," the forms resulting are numerous enough; but they need not be here recapitulated, as they will duly appear in the narrative.

The first of the name to be found in the records is ROBERT DE HOPPRYNGIL. He appears in a charter contained in the Chartulary of Soltre, published by the Bannatyne Club in 1861: in which charter Edward de Alba Fonte (Quhytwell) grants to the House of Soltre and its brethren certain lands in Quhytwell, Swaynistoun, Temple and Bothclyd, for the services of a brother to pray three times a week for his soul and for the souls of his predecessors and successors; some such purpose being usually given for such grants in those times. The witnesses to the sealing of the charter are "Adam de Gulyne, archdeacon of the Lothians, Sir William de St Clair, Sheriff of Edynburgh, Sir Alan de Ormystoun, William and Adam, Chaplains, Robert de Hertished, Robert de Hoppryngil,

Research Note 3 – New Zealand & James Pringle

A turning point

Until 1839 there were only about 2,000 immigrants in New Zealand; by 1852 there were about 28,000. The decisive moment for this remarkable change was 1840. In that year the Treaty of Waitangi was signed. This established British authority in European eyes, and gave British immigrants legal rights as citizens. The treaty helped ensure that for the next century and beyond, most immigrants to New Zealand would come from the United Kingdom. It was also in 1840 that the first immigrants assisted by the New Zealand Company arrived. The company introduced long-term settlers directly from Britain, as opposed to those who travelled across the Tasman simply to harvest resources or souls.

The push to emigrate

In early 19th-century Britain conditions were such that millions set off for the New World in search of a better life. After the industrial and agricultural revolutions the population had increased from 16 million in 1801 to 26 million in 1841. However, in formerly rural areas, the enclosure of common lands deprived people of their livelihood, and the introduction of machinery reduced the demand for workers. Factory production of textiles replaced the old rural cottage industries.

There was distress in rural areas. In 1831 southern England saw riots as labourers took their axes to threshing machines. In the Scottish Highlands crofters were driven off their lands, and in Ireland the potato famine of the late 1840s brought a million to their deaths. Some fled to the city, but suffered overcrowding, disease and pollution. Others set off for new lands.

Initially New Zealand attracted few of these people. Almost none came from the Irish famine, and few arrived directly from the Highlands. The disincentives were still great — the long and expensive journey, competing attractions of closer, more settled areas such as the United States and Canada, New Zealand's continuing reputation as a home of bloodthirsty cannibals, and its association with the convict settlements of Australia.

The New Zealand Company

The New Zealand Company overcame these barriers. Founded as a commercial operation designed for investors, it was also based on the widespread view that population growth – regarded as desirable – was related to food production, and that the solution to mass starvation was to export surplus population. Added to this belief were the ideas of the Englishman Edward Gibbon Wakefield, who developed theories about solving social distress. He argued that to make emigration to a colony 'pay', and to promote a 'civilised' society rather than a dispersed, barbaric settlement, land should be charged at 'a sufficient price'. This would ensure that only some would be able to afford to buy land, and that landowners would have labourers to work for them.

Promoting New Zealand

Investors in the company were promised 100 acres (40.5 hectares) of farmland and one town acre; the initial 1,000 orders were snapped up in a month. But how to attract the labourers? To combat negative notions about New Zealand, the company used books, pamphlets and broadsheets to promote the country as 'a Britain of the South', a fertile land with a benign climate, free of starvation, class war and teeming cities.

Agents spread the good news around the rural areas of southern England and Scotland. As added inducement the company offered free passages to 'mechanics, gardeners and agricultural labourers'. Some responded and the first ships arrived in Wellington from January 1840, Whanganui from September 1840, New Plymouth from November 1841, and Nelson from February 1842. Two offshoots of the company, the Otago Association and the Canterbury Association, brought people to Dunedin in 1848 and Christchurch in 1850.

New Zealand Company practices

The company's promises were flights of fancy, only partially made good by dubious land purchases from Māori, one of which eventually led to violence on the Wairau in Marlborough. Wakefield's neat plans did not work out — land titles were uncertain, there was a lack of useable land and no obvious way to generate income through exports, and there were too many absentee landowners (about three-quarters of those in the Nelson settlement).

By 1843 the new settlers were short of food and the company was virtually bankrupt. Two interventions by the British government saved it from total disaster. Yet the company began to organise large-scale migration to New Zealand. Advertising and propaganda attracted thousands of people over the next 10 years, and the main drawcard, the free or assisted passage, became hugely important. Company immigrants sent letters back home which encouraged others to come out over the years.

The influence of the company

Considering its dubious practices it is easy to disparage the New Zealand Company, but it had a remarkable impact on immigration to New Zealand. Of the 18,000 settlers who came directly from Britain between 1840 and 1852, about 14,000 were brought in by the company or its successors. As a result of the company's policy, by 1852 the European population in New Zealand had reached some 28,000. The New Zealand Company established the outlines of immigration from Britain to New Zealand, setting in place the mechanisms and promotional pitch that were used by the provinces and the government in later years.

Research Note 4 – The Sutherland Family

Some families link in with the Pringles and the Ensby/Clarks though generations one of these is the Sutherland family.

MR. ANGUS SUTHERLAND.

Following a long and trying illness, the death occurred at his residence, High street, Maclean, on Sunday afternoon, of Mr. Angus Sutherland, aged 68 years. Deceased suffered a stroke some six months ago, as a result of which he was for some time an inmate of Lower Chrence Hospital and after leaving the institution, he disposed of his farming interest and took up residence in Maclean. His health, however, was considerably impaired and for the past few weeks he had been confined to his hed.

One of the most highly respected and esteemed identities of the Lower Clarence, deceased was the third son of the late Mr. and Mrs. George McKay Sutherland, his father being a native of Scotland and his mother migrating to Australia from London at an early age. She teft Plymouth (England) in the salling vessel Percia on the same day as the Ironsides. With the exception of the first night at sea, the vessels did not sight one another until they arrived in Sydney on the same day, the Ironsides in the morning and the Percis in the afternoon. The late George McKay Sutherland arrived in Australia at the age of 16 and died at the early age of 15. For a number of years he followed the gold diggings throughout Australia and New Zealand, eventually arriving at the Clarence 75. Years ago, where he selected land at Palmer's Channel, now held by Ascoll brothers.

Channel, now held by Ascoli brothers.

Mr. Angus Sutherland was born at Palmer's Channel and in his 'teens was apprenticed to Mr. Tom Castle, black-smith, at Woodford Leigh. After serving his apprenticeship, deceased, with his brother James engaged in blacksmithing on their own account in Murwillumbah, Woodburn and Brushgrove. After conducting their business in Murwillumbah successfully for some time, they invested their capital in a huge shipment of iron, but the ship conveying it was wrecked before reaching its destination. Deceased and his brother then opened business in Woodburn, later coming to Brushgrove.

When the Tullymorgan scrublands were thrown open for selection in 1906, deceased and another brother, Robert, selected adjoining properties which deceased held until a few months ago when, owing to the state of his health, he disposed of them to his nephew. The late Mr. Sutherland was also well-known throughout the three rivers, having engaged in cane harvesting for some time on the Tweed, Richmond and Clarence.

After selecting land at Tullymorgan, he interested himself in horse breeding and arranged with Mr. P. Bratfield, then of the Hunter and now a resident of Tullymorgan, to bring to the river the well-known Suffolk Punch stallion, Young Cavalier, which strain of blood is still among many draughts on the Clarence. Several other draught horses were brought to the Clarence by these two gentlemen, who were largely responsible for building up the Suffolk Punch breed in the district. Deceased was also a firm believer in Milking Shorthorn dairy cattle, and on several occasions paid high prices for pedigreed bulls.

The late Mr. Sutherland was an exceptionally hard-working man and an industrious farmer, but found time to engage in public life and for many years tought for better roads and road development for Tullymorgan, and at one time contested the shire elections for this purpose.

Following the cessation of sawmilling operations at Murrayville by Murray and Co., deceased, with his brothers. Robert and James and Mr. "Bob" Forrester, of Ashby, built a sawmill and engaged in sawmilling most successfully for a number of years.

Of wonderful temperament and exceptionally fine nature, deceased exceptionally fine nature, deceased exceptionally fine nature, deceased except in a contact, and was ever ready to render assistance to anyone in necd. The popularity and esteem in which he was held was evidenced by the large and representative attendance at the funeral, which took place on Monday ofternoon in the Presbyterian portion of the Maclean cemetery, the Rev. Deceased married Miss Ada Blanch, second daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Blanch, of Brushgrove. He is survived by his widow and two daughters, Mrs. R. Hannah (South Arm, Msclean), and Mrs. L. H. Butcher (Lawrence) and four sons, George (Murwillumbah), Arthur (Kyogle), Harvey (Tullymorgan) and Victor (Maclean). George Sutherland

She was a good mather and on the death of her husband, 42 years ago, continued to manage the farm at Palmer's Channel for some 12 years and reared her family. She was also a woman of great Christian fortitude, who took a very keen interest in her church.

There are surviving four daughters, viz.; Miss Mary Sutherland and Mesdames Harold Archer (Maclean), D. E. Archer (Lawrence) and Les Watson (Sydney), and four sons, Messes, Angus (Tullymorgan), Robert (Mountain View), Moderick (Tullymorgan) and Kenneth Sutherland (Maclean); also 45 grandchildren and 47 great grandchildren, Mesdames Art Blanch (Brushgrove) and Goo, Engleton (Tullymorgan), two daughters, and James Sutherland (son) predeceased her some years ago.

The fineral left Lawrence for the Marlean cemetery and prior to the removal of the remains from her late residence, the Rev. J. Marshall conducted a service at the home and he also performed the last rites at the graveside. occasions. In the pages above I have listed just some of the Sutherland family. Mr. McKay says that by discovering the "Big River," which led to the settlement of the Clarence, which in turn led to the development of the North Coast in general, an ex-convict, Richard Craig, could be truly termed "the North Coast." hero of

Craig, a stonemason, came from England as a free man, but after a period was apprehended on a charge of cattle stealing. He was tried in Sydney in September, 1828, and was convicted and sentenced death. Being only 16 years to old, the sentence was commuted, and he was ordered to serve seven years' hard labour in chains at Moreton

Craig was sent to Moreton Bay on January 19, 1829, in a vessel named the City of Edinburgh. After two and a half years at Moreton Bay, however, he escaped and found his way down the coast cotil he ar-rived at the Clarence, which he al-ways called "The Big River," during the second half of 1831.

As he stood on the bank of the river Craig made an observation so important that it became the key for the future development of the North Coast. As he gazed on the trees in luxurious plenty he became conscious that there were innumerable cedar trees among the others.

The red cedar is one of the very few native trees which sheds its leaves in winter. He could not have failed to notice this at Moreton Bay, so when he looked round at the trees on the banks of the Big River he saw the deciduous trees and knew they were red cedars.

In helping move sheep and cattle to the newly taken up stations, Craig increased his reputation when Mr. Grose requested him to drive flock of sheep from the Macleay district to the Clarence at Copman-hurst. In addition, he had to pick up some cattle at Falconer, on the Guyra River.

The description of the difficulties of the journey from Guyra are incredible. In some places the drays had to be hauled by block and tackle from tree to tree. For years after the wonderful feat of droving was talked about; it deserves to be recorded and never to be forgotten.

Craig later on was appointed superintendent of Eatonsville station. If ever a pioneer on the North Coast deserved a memorial, man is Richard Craig.

First Cattle

From the settlement of the Clarence it was but a short step to the opening up and development of the Richmond.

A Trump Card

This discovery became Craig's trump card, for as we shall see, he always urged this as a reason for sending him to find the mouth of the Big River so the new land of promise might be opened up. He also saw everywhere luxurious grass feed—another great help for him, At Port Macquarie Craig gave

himself up. The Commandant lis-tened to his story and formed the opinion that he was an exceptional

bushman.

Some cattle brought from Well-ington Valley, a couple of nundred miles away, had strayed and Craig was dispatched with a party to try to find them. He was successful and his reward was that he was not sent back to Moreton Bay. He was assigned to private service at Port

Macquarie.

After some years of private ser-vice he determined to clear out. He found his way to one of the coasting vessels that frequently called at Port Macquarie and so was able to reach Sydney. Here he stayed at the Three Crowns Hotel, Courch Hill. There came to the Three Crowns to stay a Mr. Payne. The hotelkeeper, Mr. Bullivant, told him that Craig had absconded from Port Macquarie and that he had found a great river and he wanted to be taken to the authorities to tell his

Mr. Payne, who at one time had been engaged on a revenue cutter, undertook to see Mr. Thomas Ryan, Chief Clerk of the Convict Department. He then took Craig to tell his story. Ryan gave Craig a pass to prevent him being apprehended. The authorities then decided to dis-patch the revenue cutter Prince George to Shoal Bay, with Craig on board. The trip was made, but no attempt was made to enter the bay as the weather was not favourable The conclusion arrived at was that! a river probably did enter the bav.

Craig received a free pardon. It is said he received £100 as a reward, but the monetary part is not

certain.

Craig then obtained employment with Mr. Thomas Small, of Kissing Point, Parramatta River, as a sawyer.

He told his employer about the

About 1836, the first cattle were brought to the Clarence by vessel. They were not cows, however, but bullocks to "snag" the cedar logs to the sawpit, on what was called Woodford Island.

The first cedar was dispatched early in 1837 and soon the cedar from this district was much talked

about in Sydney.

A general drought in 1839 helped to make the river district well known. The drought made squatters eager to find country with good grass. An expedition was organis-ed by a Mr. Grose, who sent the steamer King William IV., which had been running to Port Macquarie, so that those who wished could see what the country about the Pig Riv-

er was like.


The expedition was a great success. The Deputy Surveyor-General went, and soon after this the river was named the Clarence.

The first squatter to secure land was Mr. Girard, and then Mr. Grose. Very soon afterwards all the grasslands in the Clarence River were occupied as sheep or cattle runs,

It didn't seem to sell in 1870 because it was listed again in 1878 as the deceased estate of T.E Lance.

Interestingly in one of the 1878 listings The Travellers Rest Run is included in the sale. The description says it includes the famous Traveller's Rest Inn.

The Traveller's Rest was owned in the 1850's by James Pringle.

-----range opposite Maclean we soon came upon the level country that surrounds the northern side of Broadwater, and as this part of the country is well known for its agricultural and grazing qualities, I need not make detail reference thereto. Between this and the station known as Tullymorgan the land is all rich brush, well watered with numerous streams, and the appearance of the land in general would impress one with the idea that it would, in many places, grow maize, oats, barley, lucerne, &c., while the ridges, with their brownish soil would produce all kinds of payable fruits. A few miles further on (after passing through similar country) we came across a large area that is composed of the most beautiful soil, and would produce anything that can be raised in the northern districts. After passing through this we were brought on to a place called "Jackabulban Flat," which extends for miles, and is, at the present time covered with long grass. This place is well-known for its splendid feed, and for dairying purposes could not be beaten. In order to get a proper knowledge of the plain we were taken right through it, and every member of the party was surprised at its extent. On each side of this flat small ridges rise, composed of splendid soil also, suitable for agricultural purposes. Towards the end of the flat there is one patch of country that might be termed of little use, although it is superior to that part known as New Italy, Below: Tullymorgan described as a station listed for sale in 1869.


Below: The Butter Factory at Tullymorgan is in production in 1899.

In the article above it mentions the decision to open up Tullymorgan to smaller probably about 200 acres lots for more settlers. This was the opportunity that Robert Arthur Pringle took in 1905 when he left his sawmilling job and bought a farm at Tullymorgan. He later applied for crown land purchase applications in 1909 and 1911.

By 1929 from the list of names of those competing at events when the school was opened the Pringle, Bradfield, Sutherland and Ensbey families are well represented in the activities.


In this patch of the world the Pringle and Ensby families came together during the late 1800's and through the 20th Century it was the cradle that made the extended family. Today it is the spiritual home of that family. The names include the Cavanoughs, the Dobbins, the Sutherlands, the Bradfields, and from, Lawrence and Maclean, the Essex family, the Beels, the Eagletons and the Wants.



The red line on the map below shows the old road into Tullymorgan from Murrayville. The main road in the late 1800's and early 1900's, it went close by the home built by Robert Arthur Pringle in 1905/06 and just behind the Cavanough House. The Cavanough hose has been the home of Hannah Ensby, Charles Cavanough, their son Dick and his wife Dorothy (Snowy) Bradfield and their children, In 2024 Rick Cavanough lives in the home and owns and runs the farm.

The pink line is an alternate route for the road used by local farmers.

The map on the right from the early 1900's has names of some property owners



A final Note

Tullymorgan and Lawrence is the setting for most of this history. The cemetery at Lawrence is the resting pace for many of the Ensby family. Jane Isabella Pringle and her husband Moses Charles Essex is also there.

In Maclean Cemetery the Pringle sandstone headstones standout, and on the other side, the right side as you drive towards the school is Annie Pringle and Patrick Bradfield. Unmarked is Robert Arthur Pringle right next to the school. There are Garrett headstones but I can't find a link between them and our ancestor Harriett Garrett, nor do I know where she is buried. There are Essex, Dobbin and Cavanough graves there as well.







Widow of the late Joseph Morgan, of Eatonswill, died at the Grafton Hospital on 14th February, 1999, at the advanced age of 79 years. Leaving 8 sons, 5 daughters, 43 grande-ihidren, and 14 great grand-children to moura their loss.

Martin Maloney came to Australia in 1860 and his brother (probably James) went to America, the families kept in contact up until the 1940's. The photos of Michael and Ellen are speculated to be them because they are on Tintype mental plates and were in the possession of Martin's son Charles. Martin is buried in Grafton Cemetery and his son John in Ballina Cemetery.

Morgan Family

Harriet was Martin's 2nd wife the 1st dying in child birth. Harriet had 10 children, John was the 4th.

Joseph Morgan was transported to Australia in 1837 his crime was buying stolen goods. He was a shoemaker he married Mary Meskell in 1844. Mary's mother was Mary Caesar and with that information the list of the 4 names; *Maloney Morgan Meskell & Caesar* from Charlie Maloney in the 1960's was proven to be true and a more complete picture created.

Both John Meskell and Mary Caesar came from Tipperary in Ireland, as did Martin Maloney, and all died in or near Grafton NSW.



Mary Waugh, my grandmother, was spoken of as a wonderful person especially by my mother because it was Mary who took her in when she was pregnant and Jack her future husband was away in World war II. She must have been a practical and capable person bring up 8 children after her husband died in 1922.

The Waugh family starts in Australia with William when he arrived in Sydney in 1834. In absence of a photo of him a description by his son, Thomas, reads: "he was a remarkably well built man, nearly six feet tall and he was well known and respected by many in the community. He smoked a pipe...." William was murdered by one of his farm workers in 1854.

Frances Oxley-Thorpe is the daughter of Charlotte Jane Thorpe, a convict, and John Joseph William Molesworth Oxley, who was the Surveyor General of NSW 1812-1828. He explored and named among others the Tweed & Brisbane Rivers

Joseph Dargue and his wife Sarah Shaw arrived in Australia in 1857 when their daughter Eliza was just one year old.
