As happened last year, I occupied the "chair" and Merron kept the minutes...

For a couple of years now I have been wondering about the organisation of our Society...should it be "regularised"?, "corporatised"?, "registered"?, have a proper constitution?? etc etc...so the first matter I brought up at the meeting was that of a Constitution...I put to the meeting a very important and fundamental question as follows..

"Would those members, who believe we need a Constitution, please put their hand up ??" A hush fell over the meeting, and not a soul raised their hand!

The decision was unanimous. We don't need a Constitution !...

Thinking about it afterwards, I realised more than ever, that this Society is a Family...an Extended Family, as I mentioned in NL9, after last year's meeting...and Families don't need a Constitution...

Actually this decision took quite a weight off my shoulders...Constitutions with all their Rules and By-Laws and definitions etc are complex to put to-gether and adhere to..With the FAMILY approach to things, decisions are made as democratically as needbe, and the various members of the family contribute as and what they can. One of our members said to me after the meeting "Ron if we get a couple of thousand members, we'll have to have a Constitution" and I daresay that's true..What amazed me was that this member could see the possibility of so much growth of our Society! This may also prove to be true, but time will tell..

The next question put to the meeting was also very important and fundamental to the future activities of our Society and was as follows.

"Would those members who would like to see these meetings at Armidale held ANNUALLY please put their hands up."

About half (or a bit less ) put up their hands. The next question was...

"Would those members who would like to see these meetings at Armidale held every second year, please put their hand up.."

About half (or a bit less) put up their hands...

At this stage Ian WAUGH (F29. Line 10) spoke, and suggested that Regional Meetings be held in the South East Queensland area and the Sydney area every second year, with the overall Society meeting being held at Armidale, also every second year.

Considerable discussion took place after Ian spoke...all of it in favour of his proposal..Alison TOWNSEND (F931..Line 3), then addressed the meeting and said that another Family Society she was associated with held "picnic" style meetings which they called "Cousins Days"...A daytime meeting was held with a BYO style meal, at a venue which allowed for inclement weather and where an informal type of meeting could be held, to settle any questions about the meeting arrangements in future years etc..Alison said that a meeting such as this, located so that most members could get there and back home, on the same day, would attract younger members, especially those with young children...Being a BYO style meeting also means that the catering is simplified, and the expenses for a family are kept down...This arrangement for our functions in future years, received the unanimous support of the meeting, and so will be adopted..To summarise, the meeting adopted the following program..

From the year 2001, the functions to be organised by our Society will be as follows...

#### Year 2001

Regional Meeting in South East Queensland..(Date & Venue to be determined)

Regional Meeting in SYDNEY (See 2 below and Appendix 1.)

Both meetings..BYO picnic style daytime gatherings.

#### Year 2002

Bi-Annual General Meeting at Armidale Bowling Club similar to the one just held there.

#### Year 2003

Regional Meetings again...etc..

The actual town and/or venue as well as the dates will be for the Regional Organisers to determine. I will give every assistance, through the Newsletters, to facilitate the Regional Organiser's task.

I think the meeting's decision to move forward along these lines, is a very good one. We need a couple of **Regional Organisers** but that problem is half solved, as I rang **Jill WRATHALL** (G113..Line 10) this morning and she has agreed to take on the job of **Regional Organiser** for the Sydney region..**John GILLESPIE** (F35..Line 10) our **Jack WAUGH Line** Co-Ordinater has agreed to assist **Jill**.

In discussions after the meeting **TOOWOOMBA** was the centre which received most support for the S.E.Queensland venue. It does seem to me, to be a very suitable venue. We have members there and also at **ROMA** who may find **TOOWOOMBA** an easier venue to get to than Armidale.. Our **Brisbane** members and **Gold** and **Sunshine Coast** members are also not too far away..

Regarding the SYDNEY meeting, JiII organised a somewhat similar function at the CLONTARF RESERVE on Sunday 1st November 1998, for descendants of Keena GILLESPIE (nee WAUGH)(1888-1977)(E99)..(See JiII's letter in NL7) and all the feedback that I had about that gathering was that it was very successful. JiII and I agreed that the Clontarf Reserve should again be selected as the venue..Other details were sorted out on the phone, and are shown in 2. below...

In support of the new style meetings program, I remember in 1996 when we had a Reunion at TENTERFIELD, Nancy FOX (E563..Line 3) organised a very enjoyable picnic style BYO gathering at "Sunnyside"...a picnic spot near Tenterfield...There was the Sunnyside Hall there with outdoor wood fired barbeques (Nancy had to organise the fuel)..toilets etc..The weather was fine and everyone who went there thoroughly enjoyed themselves..

Other matters discussed at the meeting were as follows...

### Society Calendar ....

Rosemary WAUGH-ALLCOCK (F7 Line 7) passed around a draft calendar which she had made up...It had coloured photos on plain paper. The cost would be about \$10 each..To include such a calendar with a Newsletter, would cost the Society about \$1000, and the meeting agreed not to proceed along these lines...I think if Rosemary hangs in there with this project, and does another "draft" using actual historical photos of general Society interest, then the way to proceed would be for members to see the draft at our next AGM, in October 2002, and then those who wanted one would pay for it..This would put no strain at all on the Society's funds.

#### Archival Centre for Society...

Geoff HARVEY(G253..Line6) said that any decision in this matter should be deferred until after the Walcha Historical Society has built it's new premises which is scheduled for early in 2001 This means that no such decision can be made, at least until our meeting in October 2002 at Armidale...

John REES (F1469..Lines 2&6) also addressed the meeting on this subject..His late mother Lu REES O.A.M. M.B.E. (1891-1983) (E499..Line 6) had deposited a lot of her historical material

with the National Archives in Canberra (??I'm not sure if that's the correct name, but that's the impression I got!) and was very dissatisfied with the result...People wishing to view the material (including herself) had an extremely difficult task getting permission to view it...In the latter years of her life she deposited no more material there!

John has had a lot of experience in archival matters, having been **President** of the **Kiama Historical Society** for many years..He said that there were conflicting requirements with historical documents and photos...They need to be readily viewable, by almost anyone interested, but they also need to be stored in such a way that they will not be lost to future generations..Copies only should generally be on public display and great care is needed in the storage of originals.

On the Sunday morning I visited Walcha's Pioneer Cottage with **John** and **Pam** and they were both rather dismayed at the state of preservation of some of the historical photos on display there. It is to be hoped that what we saw were copies only....**John** brought up with him from Sydney, many of his old photos and gave them to **Geoff HARVEY...Geoff** will get them copied and make these copies available to members...eventually when a decision is made on a suitable place to keep WAUGH family memorabilia the originals will be stored there...

# Annual Family Subscription Rate..

This was confirmed at \$10 per family per year.

#### Position of Editor...

Frances WAUGH (F25 Line 10) asked if I was prepared to carry on as Editor, and my reply was that I was more than happy to carry on, as long as my health continues to be good... After the meeting, I asked Merron if she would like to take on this job when I'm unable to continue.. Merron said I was being far too premature, looking for a successor, so early in my life!! (I really enjoyed that!) She also said that she would prefer to see someone younger than herself, take over from me when the time comes..say someone from the "G" Generation...I daresay she's right, but I know that Merron has the communication and personal skills, to very capably fill my shoes as Editor...I guess the identity of the next Editor will depend to a large extent on how long I am able to hang in there.!

# Keeper of the Photos...

### Brass Plague for Headstone of Frances WAUGH (B52)(??-21/11/1891)

Reeve WAUGH (F3 Line 7) reminded the meeting that nothing has been done as yet on this project..Frances was the daughter of John OXLEY who was Surveyor-General of NSW in 1812 and one of Australia's most highly regarded explorers and Pioneers.. On 30/10/1837 she married "Aussie" WILLIAM (B51) and subsequently had 4 children, each of whom became one of our Society's "Heads of Lines"...Lines 1,2,3 and 4..Frances and her husband "Aussie" William WAUGH now have 1475 descendants that we know of !

Frances is buried in Tenterfield Cemetary and there is nothing on her headstone to indicate that she was John Oxley's daughter. Nancy FOX (E563 Line 3) agreed to investigate the cost of putting something suitable on her headstone...as the mother of 4 of our "Heads of Line" she is a very important ancestor, of many of our Society members. If the cost is not too excessive I think it would be a good project for our Society to sponsor. especially now that our financial position is strong.

The meeting finished at 3.40 p.m....

# d. Saturday Night ...

This started with drinks and savories at 6.30pm then the caterer set up a very good smorgasbord type meal at about 7pm..There were 42 at the dinner..(I thought it was 41 but we paid for 42!) It was hoped that this style of meal would result in people moving about more, and this is indeed what happened..**Tony BERGMANS** (G76..Line 10) had rung me previously and offered to bring over some CD's and a player which he did..With his wife **Elisabeth's** (G75..Line 10) help he did play some of the CD's but the provision of music, through no fault of Tony's, was a bit of a fizzer...If it was turned up high enough for the deafer members there (including myself!) then it annoyed those with AA hearing, and if it was turned down low enough for the AA hearing types, then the ZZ hearing types couln't hear it!! The room was full of talking, laughing, mixing people, and the music was best when it was turned off!!...Nevertheless..thank you Tony...Nice try!!

There were no speeches this time but the evening flew quickly enough without them. All the members mentioned above as being at the afternoon meeting were there with the addition of the following. Once again the caterers did a fine job..this year the club charged \$50 for the hire of the room but as we had possesion from 9.30am till about midnight I don't think that was unreasonable..The actual cost per person worked out at \$28.70 per head which was \$3.50 above the \$25 levied...Over 42 people this amounted to \$147 extra but as the Society now has a credit balance of \$1888.19 this was no big deal!! It was a wonderfully successful evening.

# e. Sunday Morning...

There was no planned activity on the Sunday..some members had to leave early for home, others did touristy things at Armidale..( **Merron** had collected pamphlets etc from the Tourist Centre on Saturday and had them available for members at the Saturday meeting...Thanks **Merron**!) others went to Walcha's Pioneer Cottage for the morning and a picnic lunch in their grounds which was a very enjoyable way to end a very enjoyable week-end..

# 4. Geoffrey WAUGH...University of NSW.

When I got home from the Armidale Reunion I found in my box, an article in "The Australian" Newspaper dated December 8th 1999, about an award won by the above...I don't know who put it there but it is well worth reproducing in this Newsletter...Quote....

"A talent for explaining economics and a heart in the right place have won a University of NSW lecturer \$75,000 as Australia's best University teacher.

A pair of twinkling eyes probably didn't go astray either...students interviewed for the Federal Government's University Teaching Awards listed a ready smile and approachability up there with energy, passion and inspiration as prerequisites for a good lecturer.

Geoffrey Waugh took out the Prime Minister's Award as university teacher of the year last week when Education Minister David Kemp announced \$380,000 in prizes for top lecturers and university programs.

Associate professor Waugh, who teaches environmental, natural resource, tourism and macro economics to 500 students said after 35 years in universities he was "astounded" at the win. "My students have taught me so much "he said.

"It doesn't matter what educational philosophy you follow, if your heart's in it, it will work.

The judging panel, led by University of Queensland vice-chancellor John Hay, said professor Waugh won for his passion for teaching economics, and his "noted capacity to present and explain complex concepts."

"His courses continually attract large numbers of students."

Professor Waugh was an industrial chemist who switched to teaching maths at TAFE, then to environmental economics..

The awards, sponsored by The Australian, and in their third year, are the world's biggest for university teaching, according to Dr. Kemp, who said the winners were pushing the boundaries of teaching and would have a lifelong impact on their students.

Professor Waugh gets \$40,000 as best teacher in economics, business and related studies, and \$35,000 for the Prime Minister's Award.

His prize gives economics and business at UNSW a double tick: accounting lecturer Michael Briers was a joint winner of the same category last year. endquote..
