Keeping in touch. (A note from Neville Maloney)

The reunions provided a base for a much expand family network. Since then my daughters, Amber and Reeanna have been to Sydney a stayed with Harry and Lorraine Stanley. My brother, Bruce was in Tasmania with his wife Julie and they visited Alison Shoobridge. I have received numerous letters and phone calls relating to the History of the Waughs book, all in all we are keeping the family links.

Family History on computer.

For those of you considering this option there are a number of software programs. It does not matter which one you use, just make sure it can import and export GEDCOM format files. Family Reunion is probably the best of them (and I think the most expensive, \$199). I use a DOS based package called FTETC simply because I always have and recently I started using Personal Roots (\$20). It will enable me to scan in photos. The GEDCOM format allows you to import other peoples family trees into your program. It automatically sorts out relationships and duplicate records. I intend to clean up a GEDCOM list and have it available if anyone wants it. The problem is that all family trees are personal lists so mine contains many lines NOT related to the Waughs. I will edit it to contain only Waugh related lines and anyone interested can then add to it themselves. Those who are interested let me know.

Tasmanian Trip...or "The Ron and Reeve" Show.. (Ron Main)

At the Port Macquarie reunion in May 96 those who were there may recall an apology from ZARITA MATTAY of Hobart, being read out by Chairman Reeve. Zarita's health was not good and at the age of 90 Zarita said she couldn't make it but to please give her "universal love" to all her relations there... After the reunion Reeve suggested to me that we go to Tasmania and see Zarita..He had met her when she came over to the mainland to attend ROSEMARY WAUGH'S son Alexander's wedding some years before. I had been to Tasmania twice but both trips were hurried and at the time I had no knowledge of any relatives on the island. After the Port Macquarie reunion I knew that we had quite a lot of relatives there besides Zarita. There was her son ANDREW MATTAY at Hobart..ALISON SHOOBRIDGE (who was at the Port Macquarie reunion with her husband Peter and sister KATE SAINSBURY). Also Alison and Kate's other 2 sisters CHRISTINE and FELICITY at Nubeena, and JIM TALBOT and family at Launceston. Reeve's suggestion appealed to me as it appeared we could look these people up as well as seeing

Reeve wanted to go to his grandson SCOTT'S Wedding in Sydney in late October so I drove to Canberra a few days beforehand and stayed with son Peter and family for a few days while I waited for Reeve to join me. We then drove to Melbourne via the Snowy Mountains Highway staying overnight at Corryong with some friends of Reeve's..The trip over the top and down into the headwaters of the Murray River was new to me and quite spectacular with the high country covered in snow. This valley at the head of the Murray must be one of Australia's most favoured districts..When I asked our host how they had fared during the recent 4 year drought he said "What drought?"..The country is on the western side of the range and appears to get whatever rain is available from the weather systems moving from West to East.. On the Eastern side of the ranges we had driven through Cooma and the Monaro where the country looked very droughty and was a complete contrast to the Corryong side..I think I understand the term "rain shadow" better now.!!

Then on to Melbourne and drove the car onto the trans Tasman ferry about 3pm on Wednesday 30th Oct.(There was a promotion for tourists on at the time, it was only \$50 return for the car, a result of the drop-off in tourism after the Port Arthur disaster.) We arrived at Devonport about 8am next morning. Rang nephew JIM TALBOT (G119..he was at Port Macquarie with his brother BILL) at Launceston to tell him we'd arrived and that we expected to get to his place at Newnham that evening.. In the meantime we had planned a trip to see Cradle Mountain and about ½ a dozen other places as well..We got to Cradle Mountain OK and were extremely lucky with the weather which was perfect..It's usually cloudy and wet there and Jim's wife SUZANNE told us later that they had friends who had gone there 10 times and still hadn't seen the top of the mountain.. We had lunch there then did one of the smaller walks..a wonderful place and well worth a visit..Then off to these other 6 places of interest we had planned to see but of course found it impossible to fit in..Drove to Launceston and found Jim's place OK where we stayed for a couple of nights enjoying their Tasmanian hospitality..Jim managed to get the next day off work and he and Suzanne and their youngest daughter ANNA (5) guided us on a tour of places of interest in the North East of Tassie..The Piper's Brook vineyard was one, where we got some of their world class Chardonnay, then to the Pilot Station museum at Low Head for lunch..a truly delightful place. Then back to Launceston to pick up MELANIE (11) and the barbecue gear for a barbeque tea at The Gorge..a truly spectacular place almost in the heart of Launceston.

We left next morning for Bicheno on the East coast where we planned to spend a couple of nights..Booked in at the Youth Hostel (that's a bit of a joke..Reeve's over 70 and I'm not far behind!!) We struck it lucky as we had an 8 bed room between us..Clean kitchen with all facilities so I baked some more bread and we loafed about for a couple of days..Rang ALISON SHOOBRIDGE to say that we weren't far from Nubeena and she said she had our beds made up and she was expecting us that PM...Weather was still perfect as we drove down the east coast via Coles Bay and the Freycinet National Park.. We wished we'd allocated more time to see this area but pushed on to Nubeena via Swansea, Orford, Copping, and Eagle Hawk Neck getting to Nubeena about 4pm. Our hosts ALISON and PETER looked after us very well..Peter taking us on a 4WD tour of "Lottah" which is about 1000 acres of hilly country with timber and wonderful views of the waterways in that area. The homestead also looks out on these wonderful views. On our 2nd night there Alison had invited her 3 sisters..KATE, CHRISTINE and FELICITY over for a dinner party..It was a very happy occasion so I've included a photo of the group with this story..Both Reeve and I marvelled at the likeness between FELICITY (nee WAUGH) (F639) and NANCY LANGDALE (F65) of Nambucca Heads..Their relationship is not that close their first common WAUGH ancestor being ALEXANDER WAUGH DD (A5) who died in 1827..some 5 generations earlier.!! Nevertheless there is a strong family likeness there. It can also be seen in photos of ISABELLA (C171)..a daughter of "AUSSIE WILLIAM" and a grand-niece of the above Alexander.

Next morning we rang ANDREW MATTAY in Hobart(about 100km away) to find out where we could see Zarita, as Alison told us Zarita hadn't been well and was in hospital. We intended to stay at a hotel in Hobart and had actually booked in but Andrew insisted we stay with him and his wife MELGUITA at their place at Sandy Bay..which we did. We went to see Zarita next day in Hobart Hospital with Melguita, and even though Zarita was very weak she recognised Reeve straight away and gave him a big smile which I was lucky enough to catch on the camera. I have included the photo of Zarita in this Newsletter..While talking to Zarita I said how pleased I was to meet her for the first time and she said (slowly) "Oh RRRon, you should have known me when I was younger..I was a wonderful person!!" ..and I believe her!! We saw her again the following day and she did appear to be improving..she was looking forward to getting back home to familiar surroundings..Unfortunately this was not to be and Zarita passed away about 2 weeks after Reeve and I visited her. She was one of the AUSTRALIAN WAUGH FAMILY'S remarkable pioneers.. A book of her life and times would make wonderful reading..Anyone out there care to take it on ??.

Altogether we had 3 nights with ANDREW and MELGUITA which was marvellous. Andrew is a recently retired Army Colnel..he was in charge of Australia's Army presence in Tasmania and had only just returned from a trip overseas where he joined a group which hired a Russian helicopter and went to Russia's highest mountain..He brought

back some extraordinary photos taken on that expedition.

When we left Hobart that was the end of seeing relatives and the free accomodation !! From here on we were on our own. We went to Bronte Park more or less in the middle of Tasmania and hoped to catch a trout there but got snowed in instead..Then to Strachan on the West Coast via Queenstown (what a mess mankind has made of that area!!) for a couple of very worthwhile days. We did the Gordon River trip in the big aluminium catamaran based there and experienced the typical wet grey climate. Saw the 2000 year old Huon Pine and the cold rain-forests typical of the area as well as the ruins of the penal colony on Sarah Island in Macquarie harbour. One story we were told about Sarah Island stuck in my mind. Apparently the first thing the penal colony officials did when setting up Sarah Island was to cut down all the trees so the prisoners would be easy to supervise. Subsequently the strong cold and wet Sou'Westerly winds endemic to the area, nearly swept everyone off the island so they set the prisoners to work cutting down all the Huon Pine trees in the vicinity then sawed them up into planks and built big windbreaks!!.. End of story and end of some precious trees!!

Then to Devonport and onto the ferry once again..arrived Melbourne about 8am then drove west along the Great Southern Ocean Road to Mt.Gambier for the night. Next day we drove to Mylor on the outskirts of Adelaide where we were booked in for a Dinner/Bed/Bfst/Evening Walk/Dawn Walk at the Warrawong Sanctuary established by Dr.John Wamsley (he of the catskin hat!!)..It was wonderful to see all these little Australian native marsupials running about Potoroos, Bettongs and Bandicoots, with nary a cat or a fox to worry them. The fence around Warrawong has kept the Sanctuary feral animal free for 14 years. After Warrawong Reeve and I split up for a couple of days as Reeve wanted to go into Adelaide and I wanted to see Wamsley's other sanctuary in the mallee country. Yookamurra is about 120km from Adelaide and totally different in character to Warrawong..rainfall average of about 8" a year..

We had arranged to meet up again at the Barrossa Valley town of Nooriootpa, spent a couple of days there then drove Eastwards again towards home along the Murray valley highway..in Canberra a couple of days then North to Tamworth and Dorrigo..A very good trip, but 22 different beds in 32 days made us both appreciate getting home to a bit of routine again!!

Vale Irene Margaret WAUGH ALAA M Lit Stud..5/6/1927...16/4/1997

My double cousin Margaret Waugh of Bardon Brisbane passed away on 16th April last..Margaret had been troubled with diabetes for some time then had a heart attack early this year which put her in hospital. She was discharged and appeared to be recovering but then developed appendicitis. A decision was made to operate on the appendix which was life threatening. The operation was successful but some days later she suffered another heart attack and died quite suddenly.. Margaret had a lively and outgoing personality and will be sadly missed by all who knew her, particularly her immediate family..sister Francis and brother Dr Ian, his wife Dr. Shirley and their family. On behalf of the Society the deepest sympathy is extended to them. A very moving funeral for Margaret was held at St. Paul's Presbyterian Church Brisbane. It was conducted by the Rev.G.Kettniss who was an associate with Margaret on the Council of the Presbyterian and Methodist Schools Association for many years.

Vale Zarita MATTAY 1907..16/12/1997

Zarita was born in Hungary, the daughter of Percival Bentley WAUGH, a mining engineer, and his wife Alruna de KOCZ who was Hungarian. Zarita spent her early years living in the land of her birth, where she married twice. There were no children from her first marriage but her 2nd marriage to Uli MATTAY resulted in 4 children being born to them..Marileen, Andrew, Barbara and Julian..Towards the end of World War 2 the family decided to emigrate to Australia and after many adventures finally settled in Hobart. Zarita and Eric Cadogan WAUGH (E203 1900-1965) were the two pioneers who established the Tasmanian branch of the Waugh family. She is survived by her son ANDREW (who still lives in Hobart) her daughter BARBARA of Denistone, her 2nd son JULIAN of Mt. Gambier SA. and their families. To them on behalf of our Society I extend our deepest sympathy. Zarita's funeral was held at the Church of St. Francis Xavier South Hobart on Thursday 19 December 1996 and presided over by Monsignor Philip Green who had this to say and I quote "Her life was a remarkable one. The tragedies she experienced could easily have broken a lesser woman. But through all she stood tall and was ennobled by them. I hope that one day the family might record their memories of their earlier childhood and their flight from home, and the role their mother played through terror, uncertainty, loss of possessions and security, poverty, to a new life.."

There were a total of 15 "lines" of the Waugh family represented at the 2 reunions in May 1996..Zarita was the sole surviving "head of line" so with her passing the Waugh family in Australia enters a new era..I hope and trust that the new generations of this ancient family, continue to bring credit to their courageous Australian Pioneers and their antecedents in Britain..

Two of the Waugh family descendants have recently lost their husbands.. They are Colleen HOPE (nee PANTON) and her cousin Sadie HAYES (nee PANTON) both of Gunnedah.

Tom and Colleen were both at the Port Macquarie Reunion. Since then Tom became seriously ill with leukemia and died on 7th April 1997.

Sadie also was at Port Macquarie when I met her for the first time.

Alexander WAUGH and Elizabeth GALLON.

Has anyone ever found the marriage of Alexander WAUGH and Elizabeth GALLONE, in the St Catherine's House Indexes? 1 have searched and searched for all different combinations of their names and dates. All 1 have is a hand written "Family Register" with the following information in it;

"The above Alexander and Elizabeth Gallone (DOB; Nov4 1824, Wooler, Northumberland, baptized by Rev W Haigh) married Nov 1 1 1847. "

No other information, about this marriage, was available from any source 1 had from my family. That was until 1 read an interesting article in "The Family History Monthly, volume 13". The article, "Till Death Us Do Part, part 2", p 52 - 58 by Sarah Stephens, was about marriages at Gretna Green. As usual when a list of names appeared at the end of the article, 1 looked through them, not expecting to find any of "my names". However, on the top of the third column on page 58 appeared the following:
